DID YOU KNOW?

The world's largest Easter egg is found in Vegreville, Alberta.

This Pysanka (Ukrainian Easter egg) is 31ft tall & 18ft wide and 27ft long and is recognized around the world as not only a unique artistic masterpiece but also an achievement of nine mathematical, architectural and engineering firsts. It is a complicated jigsaw puzzle containing 524-star patterns, 2,208 equilateral triangles, 3,512 visible facets, 6,978 nuts and bolts, and 177 internal struts.

This enormous egg was built because in 1973, the Government of Alberta established the Alberta Century Celebrations Committee to coordinate the centennial celebrations of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP). The committee distributed funds to several Alberta municipalities including Vegreville. With these funds, the Vegreville & District Chamber of Commerce decided to build to Pysanka to symbolize Vegreville's rich Ukrainian culture and the peace and security that the RCMP offered the area's pioneers and their descendants.

It is so cool that Queen Elizabeth, Prince Edward, and Prince Andrew came to Vegreville in 1978 to see it for themselves.

NOTICE ROADSIDE VEGETATION CONTROL PROGRAM

Brazeau County Agricultural Services Division will be carrying out roadside spraying of prohibited noxious, noxious weeds and woody vegetation (brush) throughout the County from May to October. For public safety, a buffer zone will be maintained between these roadside spray areas and county residences/yard sites.

As per our Vegetation Management policy, spraying on roadsides is done under the authority of Alberta's Weed Control Act. Brazeau County is required to control the weeds in the roadside just like any other landowner is on privately owned land. As well, in the public interest of safety, brush control is performed to increase the sightlines on roadways and intersections. As a result, costs of maintaining these open roadways are reduced where brush and trees are managed properly as it makes snow removal easier and allows roads to dry out quicker after precipitation falls.

The following programs related to herbicide use are available to residents:

- Hawkweed Program (County staff will treat up to 5 acres infested with Hawkweed on private land at no cost)
- Herbicide Rebate Program (the County will reimburse landowners 50% of the cost of herbicide used on the landowner's property)
- No Spray Agreement (the County will not use herbicides in the ditch adjacent to a landowner's property; responsibility for weed control is assumed by the landowner)

2022 NO SPRAY PROGRAM

Brazeau County property owners who do not wish to have roadside spraying performed adjacent to their property must enter into a No Spray agreement. In the agreement, the landowner consents to maintain the adjacent municipal right of way themselves, for the purpose of weed and brush control without herbicides, in compliance with the Alberta Weed Control Act. For highway right of ways, the landowners must contact Alberta Transportation if they do not want herbicides applied to the area adjacent to their property.

To enter into a No Spray agreement with the County, please fill out an application form by visiting the Brazeau County office or visiting www.brazeau.ab.ca. Agreements must be renewed annually.

Deadline to apply for the program is May 1st, 2022.

No late agreements will be accepted.

No matter what is going on in your life, God loves you. He loves you so much, He sent His Son to die for you.

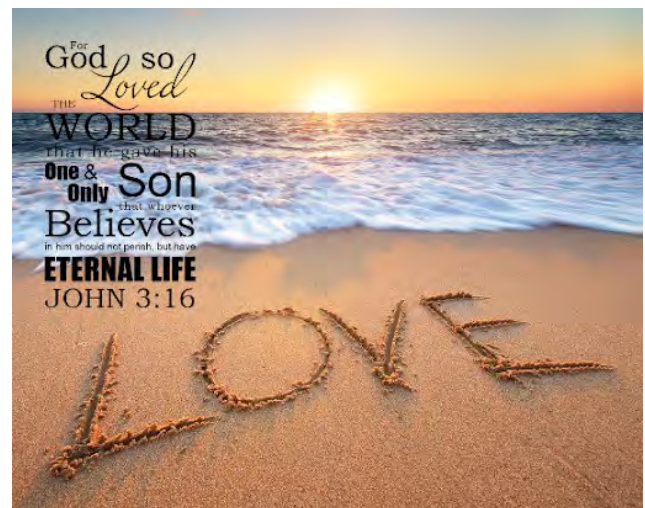
We invite you to join us this week as we make our Way to the Cross together.

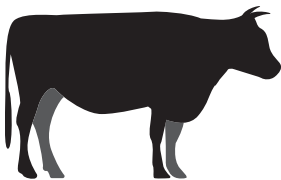

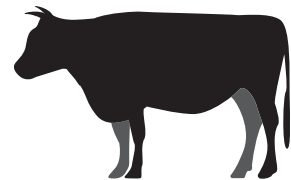

RCMP WARN RESIDENTS OF GASOLINE THEFTS

Since March 31, 2022, Red Deer RCMP have had seven reports of gas tanks drilled in to, or gas lines cut, for the purpose of stealing gasoline. Vehicles which have been targeted thus far generally have a higher ground clearance, which gives access to the gas tank.

"We are watching this new trend closely. Given the current price of gasoline, and the potential for prices to continue to rise throughout the spring and summer, we anticipate these thefts may continue," said Corporal Evans. "We need residents to report suspicious activity to police; if something doesn't feel right, let us know so we can look into it."

Police recommend the public take the following steps to deter criminals:

- Park in well lit areas.
- When possible, park in a garage or secure area.
- Ensure any home security cameras are operational and register your camera with Red Deer RCMP's CAPTURE registry. The registry helps police to identify suspects if a crime occurs, and registrants are given decals to ensure unwanted visitors are made aware of surveillance cameras in the area.

GOOD DEEDS

Nobody can earn their way to Heaven. Nobody can do enough good deeds (or works) to cover their sin. **Yet we know that a man is NOT justified by the works of the law, but through faith in Jesus Christ. Even we have believed in Christ Jesus, so that we might be justified by faith in Christ, rather than by the works of the law. For by the works of the law no flesh shall be justified** (*Modern English Version* Gal. 2:16). Works of the law are any works or deeds you do to earn salvation. Works of the law can be any moral standard that we live by, with the hope of that standard being enough to qualify us as good people. It does not matter how good we are in our own eyes or the eyes of other people. The only way we can be made righteous or good is by faith in Jesus Christ. **But now, apart from the law, the righteousness of God is revealed, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets. This righteousness of God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all and upon all who believe, for there is no distinction. For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God, being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus** (Rom. 3:21-24). Notice in the above verse that by the grace of God we are “justified freely”. That means we don’t have to earn it. It is not possible to earn it. **For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord** (Rom. 6:23). Everyone has sinned. The punishment for sin is death. There is only ONE way to get around it. Without faith in Jesus, we would have to suffer the punishment for our sin, which is an eternal death sentence. The good news is that Jesus has already taken the punishment that we deserve by giving His life for us. Jesus said, **“Truly, truly I say to you, whoever hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me has eternal life and shall not come into condemnation, but has passed from death into life”** (John 5:24). It is up to us to believe in Him. If we believe in Him we have life, and are made righteous by Him as a free gift.

Jesus did many good deeds, but it was not to be good enough. He did good deeds because it was His Father’s will, and because He and His Father love people; they wanted to set them free from the oppression of the devil. Jesus did good works because he was good; He was not trying to become good by doing good deeds. Here are some examples of the works that Jesus did. Jesus healed “All”. **When the evening came, they brought to Him many who were possessed with demons. And He cast out the spirits with His word, and healed all who were sick, to fulfill what was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, “He Himself took our infirmities and bore our sicknesses”** (Matt. 8:16-17). Jesus multiplied food and fed five thousand men plus women and children with just five loaves of bread and two fish (Mark 6:35-44). He did all these good works because He loved the people and *because* it was His Father’s will. Jesus said: **“For I came down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me”** (John 6:38). The works Jesus did can be summarized with this verse: **God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, who went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him** (Acts 10:38). Jesus did do many good works, and He also wants His followers to do good works. **Truly, truly I say to you, he who believes in Me will do the works that I do also. And he will do greater works than these, because I am going to My Father. I will do whatever you ask in My name, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask anything in My name, I will do it. “If you love Me, keep My commandments”** (John 14:12-15). Faith in Jesus is keeping His commandments and doing the same works that He did. We do good deeds or works *because* we love God and to show the love of God to other people (to see God’s definition of love, read 1 Cor. chapter 13). As believers we are not *THE* Son of God, but we are A son or daughter of God. If we abide in Him, He lives in us and will do whatever we ask the Father in His name. We are to do the same works that Jesus did, *through* faith in Him. Jesus said: **“Not everyone who says to Me, ‘Lord, Lord,’ shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father who is in heaven”** (Matt. 7:21).

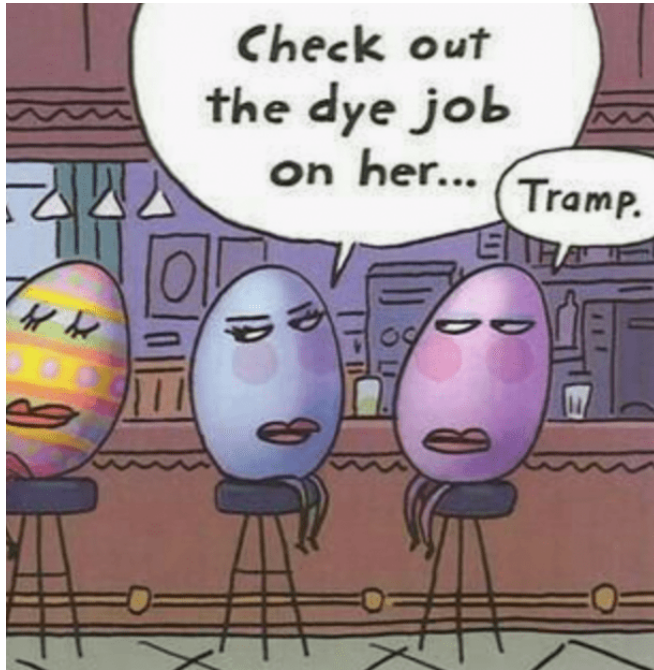

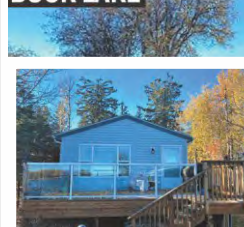

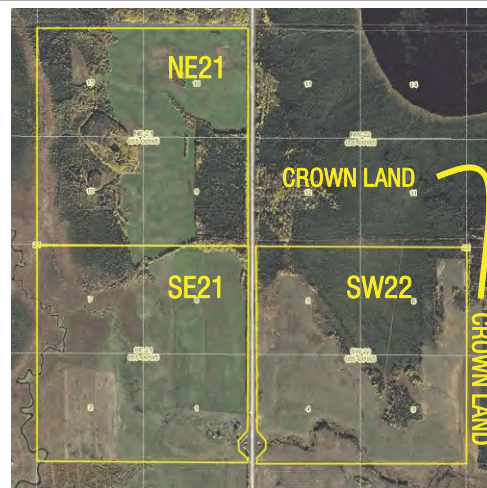
