Gardening Tips for Beginners

- **SUN** sun is key so before choosing a spot, pay attention to how long it is in your yard. Most edible plants need at least 6 hours of sun to thrive.
- **LOCATION** make sure you plant your garden in an area where you see it and don't forget about it, this way it's more likely you will spend time in it.
- **WATER** plant near a water source. The best way to tell if your plants need watering is to push a finger an inch down into the soil (one knuckle deep) if its dry, its time to water. Adequate drainage is also very important.
- **SOIL** use great soil that is nutrient-rich and well drained.
- **CONTAINERS** containers can be used for many vegetables, herbs, flowers, fruit trees, berries and shrubs. Make sure the plot is large enough for the plant its hosting. For indoor plants if you don't have drainage holes in your pot, use a layer of pebbles to allow excess water to flow into the space with the pebbles.
- **CHOOSING** choose plants that match your growing conditions. Sun loving plants in sunny spots, vines a place to climb and shady plants not in direct sunlight.
- **FROST** learn frost dates so you don't accidently kill your plants by putting them out prematurely.
- **MULCH** adding a layer of mulch about 2 to 3 inches deep around each plant helps reduce weeds by blocking the sun and reducing moisture loss through evaporation so you have to water less.
- **FEED** feed plants regularly with plant food according to the directions on the product you buy.

ALBERTA RCMP WARN OF SCAM TARGETING GRANDPARENTS

There continues to be more reports from Alberta RCMP warning the public about "Grandparent" scams specifically targeting the elderly.

In this scam, the victim will receive a call from an apparent grandson who advises that they are in prison and require a large amount of money for bail. A second individual of authority will then go on the phone and attempt to arrange collection of the money. These individuals may know specific information about the grandson. The suspects will often pretend to be police or a judge and caution the victims not to tell anyone about the transaction and a courier will be sent to the house to pick up the cash in person or have it sent in the mail.

Alberta RCMP have received many complaints of this type of scam with a total loss of over \$100,000 to the victims. Not only is there a concern for the amount of money being lost, but a great concern for these couriers showing up in person to collect the cash.

Alberta RCMP want to remind residents of Alberta to:

- Never withdraw or send money to anyone you don't know;
- If the person is saying a family member is in trouble, confirm with that family member first prior to taking any action;
- Police would never pressure someone to pay bail money for a prisoner
- If the person claims to be police or a judge, call that police service or court house directly to confirm that situation – police and courts will never demand cash be picked up in person or mailed; and
- Never give out personal information over the phone or online to someone you don't know—the police or courts will not ask for personal information over the phone.
- Bail money in Canada is traditionally not large sums

Should you have fallen victim to this or any other scam, please call your local RCMP or police of jurisdiction.





At a recent county Council meeting (April 8), two "issues" presented themselves during "ratepayers' hour

The Bible Truth Page The Parable of the Gift

Physical healing is a gift that has already been given to mankind. Jesus bought and paid for it by the whipping that He received before He was crucified. Here is a parable to illustrate how that gift applies to us today:

Grandpa wanted to bless his homeless grandson Jimmy, so he gave the young man a house. Grandpa bought the house and put Jimmy's name on the land title. "Here you go Jimmy," said Grandpa, "here is the Certificate of Title to the house I bought for you. It is all yours. Go ahead and move in, make yourself at home. This is your house." "Thank you, Grandpa! That is very generous of you to give me a house of my own," said Jimmy. After a big hug, the young man took the land title for the house and went to check it out. Finally, Jimmy arrived at the address on the title. He found it to be a beautiful house with a large, fenced yard, but to Jimmy's surprise there was someone living in the house already!! He knocked on the door, but they would not let him in. With great disappointment Jimmy went to talk to Grandpa. "Grandpa," said Jimmy, "I thought you were going to give me a house. You said you would, and I believed you." Grandpa replied, "I did give you a house and The Certificate of Title with your name on it is in your hand. It is yours; you own it." "But Grandpa, there is someone else living in the house and they would not let me in. When are you going to give me a house? When is this transaction going to take effect? When will it actually be mine? I know you will give it to me. I know you are true to your word. I know you don't lie. You said you will give it to me, so I know you will. Thank you for the house, I sure do appreciate it. But when will you give it? I need it now. I am homeless." Grandpa patiently explained to Jimmy again, "I have already given you the house; your name is on the Certificate of Title. It is your house now. You own it. Anyone who is living there is an imposter. They have no right to be there. Kick them out!! Tell them to leave your house!! You have the authority!!"

As believers in Jesus Christ, healing has already been given to us. It is ours. Jesus bought and paid for it and the proof is written in the Word of God. He Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness. "By His wounds you were healed" (Modern English Version 1 Peter 2:24). Notice that it says, "By His wounds you were healed." "Were" is past tense. In the Old Testament, Isaiah prophesied that Jesus would take our punishment and that we are healed. "But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement of our peace was upon him, and by his stripes we are healed" (Isaiah 53:5). The stripes referred to in these verses are the lashes of the whip that ripped His body to shreds at the whipping post, when Pilate commanded Him to be scourged. Then Pilate therefore took Jesus, and scourged him (King James Version John 19:1). The scourging that Jesus took for us at the whipping post was enough to pay for our healing. God has already done all he is going to do regarding our healing. He has given it to us. It belongs to us. If you believe in Jesus as your Lord, Saviour, and Healer, then pain, sickness, weakness, and disease have no right to be in your body. Those things are imposters!! They have no right to be there. Believers in Christ have the authority to command them to leave in Jesus' name. Tell them to leave in Jesus' name!! You are healed by the stripes of Jesus!


