Backyard Chicken Survey

Council approved that the Backyard Chicken Survey, as amended, be sent to residents with the September utility bill.

Bylaw #181/22 Given Final Reading

Bylaw #181/22 known as the Water, Wastewater, Solid Waste and Recycling Bylaw amendment was given its final reading. Some of the amendments include the rate changes for water, sewer and garbage service. Residents will see an increase of approximately \$1.25/month plus \$0.05/m3 of water used starting November 1, 2022. Paving Update:

The actual paving of 48th Street between 50th Avenue and 52nd Avenue with an apron onto 51st Avenue part way between 48th Street and 49th Street has begun. 48th Street has been dug out and is currently being built up with gravel. After the gravel is complete, concrete work will begin. They have begun the process of digging out 51st Avenue and 46th Street.

Any residents willing to contract the paving company for private paving of approaches, driveways etc. can call Tyler Spence at 780-818-8299. Any updates will be posted on the Village website when available.

Residents on 48th Street between 50th Avenue and 52nd Avenue are asked to roll their garbage bins and place any recycling in the alley during this time. Garbage for residents on south side of 51st Avenue please make sure your bins are labelled, put out your bin in front of residence as normal and Deford Paving company will collect and take to the street for pickup and return at end of day. Residents on north side of 51st Avenue are to put their recycling and garbage bins in the back alley for pick up until paving is complete.



NOTICE OF CONSTRUCTION

Warburg - Road Improvements

We would like to inform the residents in the area that the street in front of your property is scheduled to have Road Reconstruction starting at some point the week of August 2**d. Please refer to the Coloured area in the figure below for the streets being reconstructed. In order reconstruct the roads, we will need to close the road being reconstructed. Rear alley access will be maintained for at least one entrance for the duration of construction, if your property has a laneway at the back of the property. Construction will begin on 48 Street and 51 Avenue. Once 48 Street and 51 Avenue is excavated and being graveled, then 46 Street and 51 Avenue accavation will start (in mid- August). Once the gravel is in on 46 Street and 51 Avenue, the concrete for both areas will be scheduled. It is expected that paving will happen in mid to late September.



Residents will be expected to park in the rear alleys during construction in order to allow for the road reconstruction work to proceed. We will look for street parking opportunities for those of you who do not have a laneway at the back of your property. Residents will be expected to cooperate with the parking restrictions in order to allow for the street improvements in front of their property to progress. During construction there will be traffic flow interruptions and we ask for patience and cooperation during these inconvenient times. We also ask that residents keep their distance from the equipment and watch their children for all of the obvious safety reasons. We apologize in advance for any inconveniences due to construction and we thank you for your cooperation during these inconvenient times.

Once any concrete is poured, we ask that it is not driven on for at least 7 days to allow for the concrete to cure properly and obtain the strength required to support a vehicle weight. We ask that residents water the seeded areas behind any concrete replacement regularly in order to ensure proper growth.

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


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REDUCING RED TAPE FOR OIL SERVICE RIGS

September 14, 2022

The governments of Alberta and Saskatchewan, along with industry stakeholders, have secured a regulation exemption from Ottawa that will allow oil service rigs to move freely between the two provinces.

On June 5, 2019, the premiers of Alberta and Saskatchewan signed a memorandum of understanding to help remove provincial barriers to the movement of service rigs.

Since then, they have been urging the federal government to exempt service rigs from regulations under the Motor Vehicle Transport Act that prevent vehicles and equipment from moving efficiently between job sites in the two provinces.

"Striking down service rig regulations is part of the Alberta government's plan to reduce red tape, improve labour mobility and grow our economy. In 2019 we fulfilled a platform commitment to end provincial barriers to the movement of service rigs and to scrap pointless regulation for these rigs that spend 90 per cent of their time drilling for oil and gas, not moving like typical heavy vehicles. Because the federal government regulates traffic between provinces, we have been pressing Ottawa for over two years to align their rules with our progrowth approach. This federal exemption is another win for Alberta, allowing service rigs to move more freely and efficiently. Thanks to Premier Scott Moe of Saskatchewan and the Canadian Association of Energy Contractors for all their work to secure this victory for our shared energy economy." Under the new *Motor Vehicle Transport Act* exemption, service rig convoys will not be required to complete daily logs or have a certified electronic logging device.

Service rigs will continue to have robust safety checks in place, such as the need to have valid permits, regular inspections and to comply with all occupational health and safety requirements.

Quick facts

- Service rigs are large, heavy vehicles with mounted derricks that are used to service and maintain oil wells.
- The two provinces brought forward a joint application to Transport Canada for a class exemption for interprovincial service rig carriers from provisions of the federal Motor Vehicle Transport Act in order to recognize the harmonized approach between Alberta and Saskatchewan.
- The exemption will apply in Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba and British Columbia.

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
