ALBERT RCMP MAJOR CRIMES UNIT INVESTIGATE HOMICIDE NEAR BRETON

Brazeau County, Alta. - On Oct. 17, 2022, Breton RCMP received a report requesting a welfare check on a male at a rural property in Brazeau County. Upon arrival, officers spoke to and arrested a male on outstanding warrants. After conducting a search of the property, RCMP located a deceased male. The Alberta RCMP Major Crimes Unit was called to investigate. The deceased has been identified as 67-year-old Robert Charles Marshall, a resident of Brazeau County.

On Oct. 19, 2022, an autopsy was conducted by the medical examiner who determined the manner of death is a homicide.

As a result of the investigation, RCMP have charged Shane Allen Marshall (37), a resident of Rimbey, with second degree murder.

Shane Marshall was taken before a Justice of the Peace where he was remanded in custody with his next appearance set for Nov. 9, 2022, at Breton Provincial Court.

As this matter is now before the courts, RCMP are not able to comment further.

If there was one word that I have heard repeatedly this past year... **'trauma'** is the word.

By definition, "Trauma is a term used to describe the challenging emotional consequences that living through a distressing event can have for an individual." (Center for Addiction and Mental Health, CAMH)

These traumatic events can be difficult to recognize because the same event may be more distressing for some people than for others. Traumatic experiences suffered early in life, such as abuse, neglect, and unsettled attachment, can often be devastating and a lifelong struggle. We also need to realize that life experiences that are out of our control, such as being the victim of violence, an accident or living through an unexpected loss, all result in some

form of trauma. A person who has experienced a traumatic event can potentially develop *simple or complex Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)*. What this means is that simple PTSD can happen when you experience a single distressing event but complex PTSD tends to rise from long-term chronic trauma. This can affect a person's capacity to form and stay in a healthy trusting relationship. Complex trauma in children is often referred to as developmental trauma. We also know that trauma can have a lasting emotional response and can harm a person's sense of safety, sense of self awareness, and ability to regulate emotions and navigate relationships. Long after the traumatic event occurs, people with trauma can often feel shame, helplessness, powerlessness and intense fear (CAMH).

In the last few years, we have all been exposed to some form of unexpected loss. Here are a few questions to ask yourself if you are concerned about trauma.

How have you been feeling? Do you get angry more quickly and stay angry? Do you know why you are angry? Sad? Frustrated? Maybe you have experienced a sense of loss that you cannot explain? Do you feel you need to control things around you more than you have in the past? Do you feel irritable, hyper-aware, or jumpy? Have you withdrawn from friends, family, or other loved ones? Do you use substances to cope with your symptoms? Is it difficult for you to function in daily life? Have your symptoms lasted for a month or longer?

In my Trauma and Attachment Practitioner course I have found that many are dealing with some form of the definition of trauma. Many are struggling with some form of loss and are being challenged emotionally as they find themselves living in the consequences of remembering the painful experience.

One example is my own response to a word in particular, the word is cohort – now I am not debating what was right or wrong, but I am sharing my response to the word and what it triggered...my body shut down and my stomach began to hurt, and my chest felt heavy...I realized I was dealing with some unresolved trauma. Trauma has triggers and "current trauma opens up all your past trauma" John Eldredge.

We can heal, God has designed us to live a life of abundance and peace and not in trauma or anxiety. Reach out if you are in need of care. One step at a time. Once you name it and address it, healing can begin.

Northern Thunder Ranch

Council approved Development Permit 22D-026 to allow the operation of an event centre with racing school and accessory structures (five storage containers with connecting roofs) and a sign at the former Rapid Fire site with additional conditions:

- Expiry date for the permit is October 1, 2025
- Hours of operation for the school are May 1 to October 1, weekdays from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m., and weekends/ holidays 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- Public events (as defined in Bylaw 936-17 over 200 attendees) four times a year from 9 a.m. to 11 p.m., the dates provided to the County no later than March 31st each year.
- Other events with less than 200 attendees, including motorized, from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m.
- If extended hours of operation are required for special event purposes, the applicant/landowner shall submit a written request to Brazeau County to be reviewed and decided upon pursuant to the Special Events Bylaw.
- The applicant will provide public notification through local newspaper, radio, and Northern Thunder Motorsports Racing Association (NTMRA) website and County website.
- Noise measurements shall be taken while races are actively occurring and on a biweekly basis during the race activities.

Other conditions include a prohibition on drag racing, a fire inspection, and a road use agreement with the County.
