

FIRST DEGREE MURDER CHARGES LAID, IN RELATION TO DEATH OF WETASKIWIN MISSING PERSON

On Oct. 20, 2022, Wetaskiwin RCMP received a report that Brian Michael Dupe, 63, was missing and had not been seen since Oct. 14, 2022. An investigation was launched and the Alberta RCMP Major Crimes Unit was brought in to assist.

Through the course of the investigation and with information received from the public, human remains believed to be Brian Dupe were located in a rural area west of Alder Flats, late in the evening of Oct. 22, 2022. An autopsy was completed by the Chief Medical Examiners Office on Oct. 24, 2022 which confirmed the identity of the remains was that of Mr. Dupe.

Investigators had obtained a warrant for 27-yearold Cashtin Lee Joseph, for First Degree Murder and asked for the public's assistance to locate him.

At approximately 4:15 pm Oct. 26, 2022 Cashtin Lee Joseph was located and arrested in Millet, Alberta, by the Wetaskiwin RCMP Crime Reduction Unit with the assistance of Wetaskiwin Detachment, Maskwacis Detachment, and Major Crimes. He was taken into custody without incident and will have a bail hearing in the morning of Oct. 27, 2022.

In addition to the arrest warrant, RCMP have arrested a second male suspect in this investigation.49-year-old Stanley Victor Howse has been remanded into custody on a charge of First Degree Murder and is scheduled to appear in Wetaskiwin Provincial Court on Nov. 1, 2022 at 9:30 am.

The investigation is ongoing and Alberta RCMP are grateful for the public's help in identifying and locating the accused.



we flew to China to bring home our daughter. It was such a difficult and complicated year. Maybe that made me sad, knowing he will never meet them here on earth.

Maybe I just need to hear his voice, hear his laugh. Or maybe I am needing some advice from Dad? I don't know what it is, but the emotions are there.

Today if you are feeling sad or grieving someone in your life, I want you to know that it is ok and take as much time as you need. We need to acknowledge our losses in our own lives, we need to validate them, grieve them, and then put them into perspective. God is faithful, He remains faithful.

In the book of Job and in Psalm 38, Scripture encourages an open and honest expression of emotion. We can go to God and ask the hard questions – why God? Why did you take my dad? He would have loved to live a life with his grandbabies. God can handle whatever question you have for Him. We can also invite our community to join us when we are grieving whether they be family or friends. We need each other, so reach out to someone and talk about who you are missing. I love to talk about my dad. I don't talk about him enough.

God loves us and does not want us to stay in our sorrow. God is faithful and we rejoice that God walks with us in our moments when we are happy and when we are sad. God is always near, and we can trust in that promise from God that He will never leave us or forsake us. Hebrews 13:5 is our promise and foundation of the love God has for us. "I will never leave you nor forsake you."

He is walking alongside us each day.

ALERT's Internet Child Exploitation (ICE) unit has noticed an increase in the prevalence of sexual extortions taking place, primarily over the social media applications Snapchat and Instagram. The suspects are demanding banking or credit card information, gift cards or other means of online payment from the youth or their parents. The predominate age group targeted are boys aged 12-17.

Sextortion typically starts as a new friend request via social media, usually with the suspect masquerading as young woman. The suspect will create the appearance of a promising online relationship and obtain sexually explicit pictures from the victim.

Once obtained, the youth are blackmailed and threatened that this material will be released to friends, family, or shared on the internet, unless a payment is made. Since the offenders often show the victims' friends list from their social media profiles, the demands are repeated and unrelenting.

ICE offers the following tips if you're being extorted online:

- Immediately stop all communication;
- Do not comply with the threat;
- Speak to a trusted adult and report it to police; and
- Keep the correspondence.

Victims are encouraged to contact local police and seek out help if they are struggling.

Council passed a motion to allow a "go cart" race track near Rocky Rapids. This was in spite of the 30 submitted letters of objections and concerns.

In this observer's opinion, most of the proponent's ideas were inconclusive as to the merits of placing this track in a relatively populated area.

Who knows what was considered by Council before approval, but if it was as shallow as a recent gravel extraction request, very few of "County" concerns were considered. (I attended this meeting when this request was considered.)

For example:

Who/how will any conditions imposed be enforced (e.g., noise, liquor consumption, traffic issues, liabilities of any kind, and probable extra road maintenance costs)?

Additionally, one has to wonder how an "economic" boost applies as Brazeau County has few or no business left as they were given away in the last land transfer (26 quarters).

Remember, this decision was made by Councillors who are supposed to be concerned with county progress. How does this project (in this location) benefit the other 7000 residents?

Perhaps it would be better to place it somewhere else where fewer people reside.

Would it not be more cost/environmentally effective to use existing tracks in Warburg and elsewhere?
