LOCAL DINNER THEATRE'S 28th PERFORMANCE STARTING THIS WEEKEND

Liberty Hall Dinner Theater will be putting on seven performances of "Par for the Corps" by Craig Sodaro, beginning with a matinee performance on Sunday February 5. This mystery/comedy features 13 cast members and takes place at an exclusive golf resort. When Joy Draper of dating service "Harmonisty" takes a crew of singles to the resort, one of her clients turns up dead and a mystery unfolds.

The Springdale Ladies Club will be preparing a home cooked meal for those attending. There will also be various draws, one for a unique table & stool as well as a 50/50. This type of event can take up to 40 volunteers per night including the cast.

*Beginning with its very first production in 1995, The Romancers, their annual dinner theatre has been a huge success. Thanks to the generosity of both the Springdale Players Theatre Society and Springdale Ladies' Club, and the dedication of volunteer cooks, casts and crews over the years, this hall has been able to entertain hundreds of people and raise thousands of dollars toward the construction of a new building.**

*The Liberty Hall Board has been around since June of 1922 when a local group decided the hall would be built on the A. Granberg farm. The first dance, under the stars, as there were no shingles on the roof, was a success until all were soaked with rain. Admission was seventy-five cents with lunch included.***

After many years of successful events, community support and renovations, they began construction on their new hall in 2012 and moved in June of

2019. This will be the 3rd dinner theatre in the new facility.

Liberty hall is located halfway between Rimbey and Winfield, about 8 km (~ 5 miles) east of Hoadley, or about 53 km straight west from Highway 2 along Highway 611. The hall is on the north side of the highway, between Range Roads 23 and 24.

Don't miss out in February. The Matinee Performance is on February 5, the doors open at 11:30am. Evening performances will be on February 10, February 11 (sold out) and February 17, 18, 24 & 25. 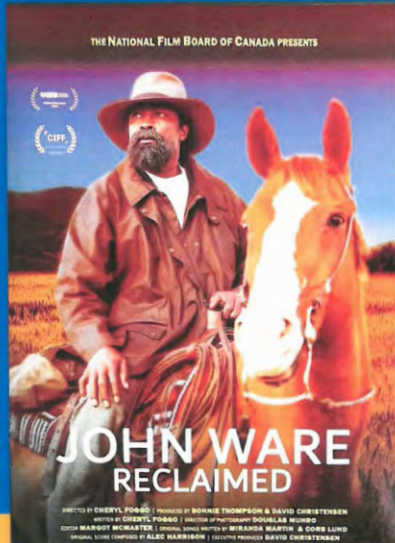

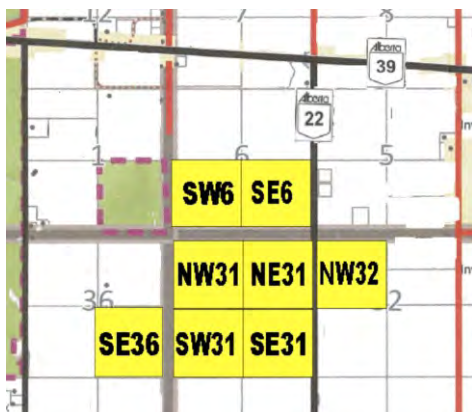

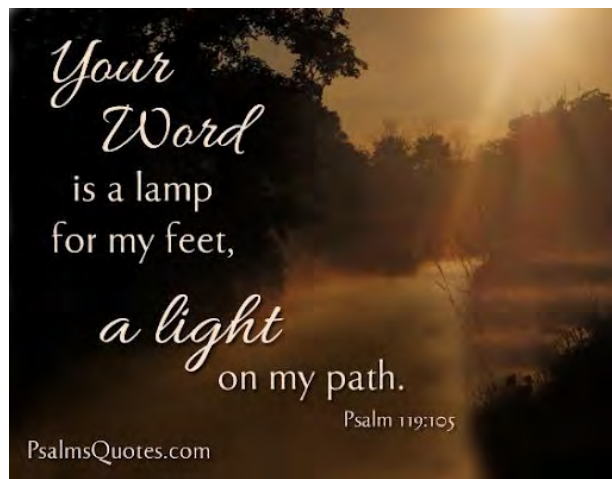

To the Editor:

Just a few comments on the goings on of Brazeau County Council (meeting January 17 / 23).

The first item of interest concerns the turning down of a ditching proposal for Buck Creek. No values of cost were given. It should be noted that Cynthia had about \$10 million spent on their roads and curbs; and Lodgepole had about \$7 million spent on their situation. Lodgepole has 150 residents; Cynthia, 70; Buck Creek, 120.

Is Buck Creek second class (or the poor cousin)? What about the Moose Hill Bridge? Is the \$4+ million TWP Road 474 (for one person) more important?

A second item concerns the approval of a subdivision. One councillor voted against and when asked why, it was stated that there may be too many pipelines to warrant approval as there may not be enough room for a building site. Did the other councillors that voted in favour do their homework before the meeting? (Remember we pay them over \$1500 per month to do so.)

A third item concerns the Code of Conduct issues. It seems strange to this observer that the Reeve reminds ratepayers (every meeting) that they should show "respect." In fact, two ratepayers were "suspended" from Council for presumed lack of respect. However, apparently, councillors and board members can say what they want about ratepayers without penalty. (See minutes addendum at end of minutes package.) A rigged system?

The code of conduct issues have cost the county \$118,000 to date, with more to come. Furthermore, it's my understanding that a current Code of Conduct has yet to be approved — an action that should have occurred within the first couple of months of installing the new council.

One should also note the number of people going to ASB conference and perhaps connect the value of such expenditure to the county. One person providing a comprehensive report would suffice. The same in regard to the FCM conference in Ottawa. Does Council evaluate the agenda of such conferences before they send people, or is it just a paid holiday? What do the citizens of the county get

from councillor attendance at these conferences?

Mr. Ekstrom requested a "compressed" report from Councillor Westerlund relating to a meeting with MLA Brian Jean. Why a compressed report? However, even the mention of a report is a step in the right direction—the first in many years!
