

LEDUC RCMP AND THORSBY BRETON RCMP INVESTIGATE RASH OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY IN LEDUC COUNTY

Leduc County, Alta. – Leduc RCMP and Thorsby Breton RCMP are investigating a rash of theft from motor vehicles and theft of motor vehicles in Leduc County and seek public assistance to identify suspects involved.

Between the evening hours on Jan. 2, 2023 and the morning of Jan. 3, 2023, RCMP responded to multiple reports of suspicious activity in Leduc County south and south west of Calmar.

Police received information that unknown suspects were driving onto private property where they looked for unsecure properties, stole items from vehicles and stole at least two vehicles. It is believed that at least one of the stolen vehicles was left unlocked with keys inside. The two known stolen vehicles have since been recovered along with a third vehicle stolen out of Edmonton, Alta.

The investigation is ongoing. Leduc and Thorsby RCMP are requesting residents report any criminal or suspicious activity to police as soon as it occurs, as these reports tell us where to look, who to look for and where to patrol.

Leduc and Thorsby Breton RCMP would like to remind residents of some tips to keep their vehicles safe:

- If possible, look into command start options as a means to warm your vehicle
- Steering wheel locking devices are effective options that can help mitigate theft
- When starting your car, or allowing the engine

- to warm up prior to driving, ensure that you are in the vehicle
- Never leave valuable items like purses, wallets, keys or change in an unoccupied vehicle
- Always place keys to vehicles in a safe place, out of plain sight and in a secure location
- Lock vehicle doors all the time, even if you are parked in your driveway or garage at home
- Never leave your vehicle unattended if it is running or the keys are in it



Rural wedding and agricultural event facilities

Leduc County is currently reviewing the Land Use Bylaw and is considering making amendments with respect to **rural wedding and agricultural event facilities**.

This land use is defined within Part 11 of the Land Use Bylaw as follows:

an indoor facility, accessory and incidental to the primary use that provides for an alternative of venue for events within a traditional rural setting, and is not intended to locate development that would be better located within defined business and commercial areas.

Any use and/or development considered under this definition shall be designed to be agriculturally harmonious by way of design, appearance, scale and form and shall not detract from the rural and agricultural context of the site or its surroundings.

Uses may include, but are not limited to: weddings, meetings, seminars, farmers markets and trade fairs.

This is listed as a discretionary use within the AG – Agricultural and AG/CR TR – Agricultural/Country Residential Transitional land use districts.

Within these two districts, the County is considering how these facilities are regulated, what amendments may be necessary to address concerns related to land-use compatibility with surrounding agricultural areas, and the future of such facilities in Leduc County.

But first, we want feedback from County residents and landowners on rural wedding and agricultural event facilities.

Happy New Year and I hope you had a wonderful Christmas. As we move into the New Year it is often important to take stock of where we are as people and I believe as a province.
