

INFLATION RELIEF PORTAL AND PAYMENTS COMING SOON

Monthly \$100 affordability payments for families, seniors, and vulnerable Albertans will be released soon, and Albertans can act now to get ready.

Starting January 18, seniors 65 or older who are not receiving the Alberta Seniors Benefit and eligible parents with children under 18 can apply online through the government portal or in person at locations across the province for \$600 in monthly affordability payments.

In order to use the portal, eligible parents and seniors will be required to have a Verified Account. To ensure that the application process is as smooth as possible, Albertans should sign-up for their Verified Account or confirm they have an existing Verified Account with accurate information as soon as possible.

Many Albertans receiving these targeted relief payments are automatically enrolled for the program and do not need to apply to receive the benefit.

Along with Foster and Kinship Caregivers, anyone currently receiving regular monthly benefits through Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped (AISH), Income Support or Alberta Seniors Benefit, or receiving services through the Persons with Developmental Disabilities (PDD) program will automatically receive their first payment starting January 31.

Affordability payments for AISH, Income Support and PDD clients

All clients accessing AISH, Income Support or PDD are automatically enrolled in the program and do not need to sign up to receive their benefits. They will receive their first \$100 payments starting January 31.

- Payments will be delivered the same way as a client's regular monthly benefits, whether by automatic deposit or a physical cheque.
- Payments will be delivered by physical cheque for existing PDD clients who are not receiving AISH or Income Support benefits.
- Beneficiaries will also be notified directly about their enrollment in the payment program and related information.

- These payments will be treated as exempt income by the AISH and Income Support programs and will not impact eligibility or financial benefits.
- Parents in these programs with children under 18 can also receive \$600 in additional payments per child. They will need to apply online or in person for these payments starting January 18.

Affordability payments for seniors

All Albertans 65 or older with household incomes below \$180,000 will soon be eligible for \$600 over six months in monthly affordability payments.

Albertans receiving the Alberta Seniors Benefit are automatically enrolled in the program and do not need to sign up to receive their benefits. The distribution of additional monthly payments will begin January 31.

Eligible seniors who are not receiving the Alberta Seniors Benefit will need to apply for affordability payments by creating or confirming their Verified Account and applying for benefits via the online portal or in person at a registry office or through Alberta Supports when the portal opens on January 18.

Affordability payments for parents or guardians caring for children under 18

Families with household incomes below \$180,000 per year will soon receive a total of \$600 for each dependent child under 18 over six months. Eligible parents can apply for affordability payments by creating or confirming their Verified Account and applying for benefits via the online portal or in person at a registry office or through Alberta Supports when the portal opens on January 18.

NOTICE OF INCREASE TO THE FRANCHISE FEE ON NATURAL GAS BILLINGS

The Town of Thorsby is proposing to increase the natural gas distribution franchise fee which it charges ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. for the exclusive right to deliver natural gas to the residents of Thorsby and for use of municipal lands for its natural gas lines, effective March 1st, 2023. The franchise fee applies to all customers that receive gas services in Thorsby and is required to be billed as a separate charge on gas billings.

The current franchise fee is set at 20% of ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. delivery revenues and will increase to 35% effective March 1, 2023. For an average residential customer using 115 GJs per year, this will result in an annual increase of approximately \$99.10 from the average that would otherwise be paid in 2023. The franchise fee is anticipated to account for approximately \$231.23 of the average annual residential bill in 2023.



Affordability payments for foster and kinship caregivers caring for children under 18

Eligible kinship or foster caregivers caring for a child under the age of 18 are automatically enrolled in the program and do not need to sign up to receive their affordability payments. They will receive their first payments at the end of January.

- Payments will be delivered the same way as regular monthly benefits, whether by automatic deposit or physical cheque.
- Monthly payments will be rolled out starting January 31.

Alberta's government is delivering immediate cost of living and inflation relief while also working to support long-term affordability. Albertans can learn more about all the broad-based and targeted affordability relief programs online.

Quick facts:

- Alberta's government will use CRA 2021 tax data to verify eligibility based on income.
- Applications can be submitted until June 30, with payments being retroactive to include previous months when a person was eligible.
- Once the application process is successfully completed, most Albertans will receive payments at the end of that month. Exact timing will vary for each individual.
- Alberta has had verified accounts since 2015 as a way for Albertans to safely and securely access a growing number of government services.
- As with all online accounts, Albertans should use strong passwords and not share their password with anyone else. Tips on how to create a strong password are available on the Government of Alberta site.
- The Alberta government will not send texts or emails asking Albertans to submit personal or banking information to receive payments.



Thorsby Council Notes COW - January 10, 2023

WATER MAIN BREAKS

On New Years Eve on 47 ave., in front of the Mayor's residence there was a water main break. CB Max and Spartan Hydro-vac were on station quickly. The issue was a bead break. The CAO was also there and assisted in delivering water to the affected residents, chatting with them and the crews, and making sure they had hot food. Mayor Hostyn offered his garage for warming and for the crews to come in and eat. Thanks to our Mayor, our CAO and Public Works for their hard work in the cold. Two other breaks were by the trailer park and 53 Ave. Broken valves, cracked sewer lines were the cause. Each time there is a call about a water break, first to call it in, then to locate the break, dig around the area, fix the break, it takes approximately 12 hours each time. The cold weather was a huge factor but our capable crew managed to fix the problems. Thanks again to our trained workers!

40 YEARS OF NEGLECTED MECHANICAL CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE AT THE RECREATION CENTRE

During the month of December, the lobby side of the building struggled to maintain suitable temperatures. A number of issues contributed to the problem. The main boiler was leaking, a city water line was disconnected, and the expansion tank was waterlogged causing the heating issues. There was no record of the reheat coils and the ducting ever being cleaned. This was a 6 day project that was tackled over the Christmas break resulting in the lobby side of the building being closed from December 24 to January 3. All reheat coils and ducting were extremely dirty and covered with silt. The library reheat coil, the front entrance and offices were completely plugged. The fire rated spring and clamp for the offices were not in place plus the damper was closed so no air would flow through. The arena furnaces were completely blocked so no heat was getting through to the upstairs dance studio and meeting room. Fortunately, most areas have been addressed and a schedule for maintenance and cleaning will be determined so the system will be fully operational.

FIRE QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

Administration assisted Leduc County Fire Inspector with our fire Quality Management Plan to figure out all builds in Thorsby and their fire inspection history. Buildings now have been located and subject to regular inspections. This process will be set up with a policy and rectified.

NEW MUNICIPAL CLERK

Cheryl Filipic has joined the team as a Municipal Clerk. It is a financial position that was introduced in the New

Year after the last clerk gave her notice. The CAO, CFO, and Jesse have shared the extra duties to ensure that residents were not impacted by the absence of a clerk.

ADDRESSING CATALYTIC CONVERTER THEFT IN ALBERTA

Catalytic converter theft is an ongoing concern across Alberta and a problem the RCMP are proactively looking for ways to combat. New crime prevention initiatives like You Etch It. We Catch It, a program created by Leduc RCMP in collaboration with the City of Leduc, are being developed to educate not only vehicle owners, but also vehicle dealerships and service shops on the benefit of ID etching.

The program gives customers the ability to have the last digits of their VIN etched into their catalytic converter by their dealership or auto repair shop, at no additional charge.

This identifying mark allows for any stolen converter to be traced back to the victim, and also acts as a deterrent as metal scrap recycling shops are aware of the program and look to identify these marked converters, which are then reported to police.

What makes a catalytic converter so desirable is that within its design are valuable metal components made out of platinum, rhodium and palladium. These metals have a high value and the converters are relatively easy to locate and remove from vehicles.

By September 2022 Alberta RCMP reported the theft of 1,302 converters, a concerning trend considering that 2021 alone had a total of 1,452 thefts. These thefts span all the areas currently under RCMP jurisdiction, and exclude most of the major metropolitan centers.

With the success of this program in Leduc there is hope that other businesses across the province will adopt a similar service for customers to further aid in the fight against catalytic converter theft. In Calgary, two local businesses have begun to provide their own solutions to the problem.

Big House Converters, a converter, battery and nonferrous materials recycler, currently offers laser etching to customers. While Minute Muffler, in northeast Calgary, is offering a slightly different approach.

The business currently books appointments to wrap converters in wire cabling to inhibit the ability for thieves to steal converters easily and guickly.

Both businesses do charge for the service and an estimate can be provided by contacting the companies directly.

The Alberta government is also working toward finding a solution to this ever growing concern. In 2020 Alberta passed the Protecting Alberta Industry from Theft Act.

This legislation was created to ensure that scrap metal dealers work with local law enforcement to report transactions and ensure that transactions are done using traceable currency such as cheques and electronic transfers, rather than cash. The act also outlines that sellers must provide government issued ID and that this information along with the transaction details needs to be kept by the dealer.

The hope is that with new police created initiatives, government legislation and consumer and business support, theft of catalytic converters will begin to decline and this continuing problem will begin to see improvement.

RCMP would like to remind the public, that if they see suspicious activity, or hear sawing/grinding noises at night, or witness a crime in progress, call 911 immediately.

Rural wedding and agricultural event facilities

Leduc County is currently reviewing the Land Use Bylaw and is considering making amendments with respect to rural wedding and agricultural event facilities.

This land use is defined within Part 11 of the Land Use Bylaw as follows:

an indoor facility, accessory and incidental to the primary use that provides for an alternative of venue for events within a traditional rural setting, and is not intended to locate development that would be better located within defined business and commercial areas.

Any use and/or development considered under this definition shall be designed to be agriculturally harmonious by way of design, appearance, scale and form and shall not detract from the rural and agricultural context of the site or its surroundings.

Uses may include, but are not limited to: weddings, meetings, seminars, farmers markets and trade fairs.

This is listed as a discretionary use within the AG – Agricultural and AG/CR TR – Agricultural/Country Residential Transitional land use districts.

Within these two districts, the County is considering how these facilities are regulated, what amendments may be necessary to address concerns related to land-use compatibility with surrounding agricultural areas, and the future of such facilities in Leduc County.

But first, we want feedback from County residents and landowners on rural wedding and agricultural event facilities.



Alberta's job numbers are soaring.

According to Statistics Canada's latest labour force survey, our province created 41,200 full-time jobs in December, capping off a year of strong provincial job growth.

From Ends of the Earth Ministries

Dana and Liz began full time ministry in 1984, when they accepted a four-year missionary assignment to Nepal and moved to a remote Himalayan region previously unreached by the Gospel. They ended up in a village area that was two days walk from the nearest road. During their time in Nepal, the Lord supernaturally directed them to a Nepali baby and Lydia Subhadra was added to the family.

In 1989, Dana Liz and Lydia moved back to Montana and pastored a church in their home town of Forsyth. In 1991, the family grew to four as the Lord brought them a Korean baby boy, whom they named Jonathan Lee Nile.

1993 brought a move to Tulsa, Oklahoma for two years of intense study at Rhema Bible Training Center and the beginning of ministry to the former Soviet Union. Also, while at Rhema the family grew to six, with the addition of another adopted son, Josiah, and the miracle of a biological daughter, Lura after eighteen years of marriage. After graduation in 1995, Ends of the Earth Ministries was born, sending the family to Omsk, Russia and a Siberian winter of pastoral ministry. Their time there was cut short when their son Josiah was found with a rare heart tumor, and after an epic fight for his life, went home to heaven from Helsinki, Finland. They then returned to America and to itinerant ministry that took them around the states and frequently back to Russia.

Dana and Liz then answered a call to pastor at Today's Harvest Church in N. Myrtle Beach, South Carolina. 1998 to 2013 brought fifteen years of rewarding pastoral ministry. Hundreds of people were impacted by the Word and the Spirit of God. People were born again and helped to become fully functioning followers of Jesus. Close to fifty people graduated from the AFCM Bible School, most of whom went with either Dana or Liz on short term mission trips.
