ALBERTA CULTURE DAYS GRANT APPLICATIONS OPEN

Alberta's government is accepting grant applications for Alberta Culture Days 2023 events.

Grants of up to \$10,000 are available to help eligible community organizations offset the cost of planning and hosting events, showcasing local talent and highlighting cultural programs in their communities during Alberta Culture Days, which will take place Sept. 1-30. Applications close March 17.

"It's a great pleasure to announce that grant applications for Alberta Culture Days are officially open. Each September, Alberta celebrates talent, community spirit and our diverse cultures. I encourage all community organizations to apply for a grant to help host their event during this monthlong celebration." Jason Luan, Minister of Culture Funding for celebration sites

Funding for Celebration Sites

During Alberta Culture Days, all community organizations are encouraged to host free public events celebrating culture, and support for these events is available from the government. Organizations could qualify for three different grant categories:

- Feature celebration sites, which offer at least three days of programming in September and are eligible for grants of up to \$10,000.
- Host celebration sites, which offer at least two days of programming in September and are eligible for grants of up to \$5,000.
- Pop-up celebration sites, which offer at least one day of programming in September and are eligible for grants of up to \$1,000.

Quick facts

- Alberta Culture Days occur each year from Sept. 1-30.
- Culture Days 2022 attracted more than 3.8 million attendees and featured more than 3,000 free events in more than 500 communities across the country.
- Grant criteria, reporting information and all forms needed to apply are available online at www.alberta.ca/alberta-culture-daysgrant.aspx
- The deadline to apply for an Alberta Culture Days celebration site grant is March 17.
- Selected applicants will be notified in June.

Seniors and families with children under 18 can apply for their payments online starting January 18, but can get ready now by signing up for a Verified Account www.alberta.ca/affordability-paymentsaspx#apply

Anyone receiving monthly benefits through AISH, Income Support, Alberta Seniors Benefit or services through Persons with Developmental Disabilities (PDD) will get their payments automatically, but will need to apply for additional payments if they have kids under 18.

Breton FCSS can assist with helping you navigate through this process if you need to apply.

Community Volunteer Income Tax Program

FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION - For Low Income Persons, Families, seniors and students. Although this is something that most of us would like to avoid thinking about and doing, I am afraid that this is unavoidable. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. If you did not file a tax return in 2021 you may not be receiving benefits from the government that you are eligible for. The focus of the Community Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. This includes seniors, families, and students. If your income was approximately in one of the following categories, you may qualify for assistance. *1 person - \$35,000 / Couple -\$45,000 / Family -\$52,500

We are not able to complete returns with income from the following sources: Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding \$1,000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information, and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between 8:30 - 4:00. Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run from March 1-April 30, 2023. We require the following information to complete your return:

- Personal Information (Social Insurance Number, Birth date, Marital Status, Address)
- Dependent's information spouse/ children's names, birth dates.
- All "T" Slips (T4's, T4A, OAS ect.)
- All Forms, Schedules, and Labels you have received from Revenue Canada.
- Receipts for any expenses such as medical, moving, tuition, sporting activities. Printouts from your pharmacist are available for those with numerous prescriptions.

Garden Fresh Tomato Soup

- 4 cups chopped fresh tomatoes
- 1 slice onion
- · 4 whole cloves
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 2 tablespoons butter
- · 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- · 2 teaspoons white sugar, or to taste

In a stockpot, over medium heat, combine the tomatoes, onion, cloves and chicken broth. Bring to a boil, and gently boil for about 20 minutes to blend all of the flavors. Remove from heat and run the mixture through a food mill into a large bowl, or pan. Discard any stuff left over in the food mill.

In the now empty stockpot, melt the butter over medium heat. Stir in the flour to make a roux, cooking until the roux is a medium brown. Gradually whisk in a bit of the tomato mixture, so that no lumps form, then stir in the rest. Season with sugar and salt, and adjust to taste.

Ham and Cheese Breakfast Tortillas

- 12 eggs
- 1/3 cup milk
- · 3 slices cooked ham, diced
- · 2 green onions, minced
- · salt and pepper to taste
- 4 ounces Cheddar cheese, shredded
- 4 (10 inch) flour tortillas
- 1/2 cup salsa

Beat together eggs and milk. Heat a lightly oiled skillet (or non-stick pan) over medium high heat and cook egg mixture, stirring occasionally, until firm. When almost done, stir in ham, green onions, salt and pepper.

Spoon 1/4 of the egg mixture on top of each tortilla. Sprinkle the eggs with cheese, fold over the tortilla to make a roll and top with salsa if desired.





JUSTICE LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

Alberta's government is introducing a series of legislative amendments to strengthen the justice system.

The proposed Red Tape Reduction Statutes Amendment Act, 2023 includes the following changes:

Stopping benefits to prolific violent offenders

The Alberta Crown Prosecution Service estimates that about 4,200 people qualify as prolific violent offenders on the run from police. Offences committed by the accused include murder, kidnapping, human trafficking and sexual offences against children.

Currently, prolific violent offenders who are on the run from the police may be entitled to receive income support. If the *Red Tape Reduction Statutes Amendment Act, 2023* is passed, the Income and *Employment Supports Act* would be amended to close this loophole.

Strengthening Alberta's trespass laws

The Petty Trespass Act and the Trespass to Premises Act would be amended to make it an offence for the federal government to enter onto private land, building or structures without authorization.

Elevating Alberta's court

Alberta's government has introduced legislation to change the title of judge to justice in the Provincial Court of Alberta. This proposed title change is part of a series of reforms initiated by Alberta's government to strengthen and elevate the Provincial Court of Alberta, to be renamed Alberta Court of Justice, effective April 1.

"The amendments introduced take action to strengthen Alberta's justice system by stopping benefits from going to prolific violent offenders, strengthening trespass laws and elevating Alberta's court. These changes are part of a series of efforts that we have made over the course of our term in office to strengthen and reform the justice system." Tyler Shandro, Minister of Justice and Attorney General

Quick facts

- As of Feb. 8, the Alberta Crown Prosecution Service estimates that there are about 4,200 prolific violent offenders in Alberta with an outstanding warrant for arrest.
- British Columbia and Manitoba have existing legislation enabling them to suspend provincial benefits to individuals with outstanding warrants, while Saskatchewan has introduced legislation.
- Benefits that would be suspended include income support that is intended for basic needs such as food, clothing and shelter.
- If the amendments pass, regulations would spell out exactly which offences would trigger benefit suspension.
- Each year the provincial court handles more than 100,000 criminal cases, 17,000 family and child protection cases, and about 10,000 civil cases. With locations in 72 communities, the provincial court is the most accessible and affordable court system in Alberta.
- Changing the title of judge to justice would make the provincial judicial title consistent with justices of Alberta's Court of King's Bench and the Court of Appeal of Alberta.

The County will apply for a provincial grant to cover 75% of the cost of additional repairs and maintenance.

Cryptocurrency Mining Operations White Paper

Council finalized and approved a white paper (a report that addresses complex subjects) on cryptocurrency mining and the issues and impacts of operations to be presented to provincial ministers. The paper includes background information on cryptocurrency, information about the jurisdiction of provincial regulators, the issues and impacts that Brazeau County had identified, details about the concerns, and information related to future direction, and potential solutions.

RCMP 3rd Quarter Update

Council received an update from Staff Sergeant Dwayne Moore of the Breton RCMP detachment, and Corporal Bryan Northeisz of the Drayton Valley detachment.

For the Breton detachment, crimes against persons were up 6% in the third quarter of 2022, compared to the same period in 2021, and down 21% since 2018. Property crimes were down 54% from 2021, and 36% from 2018.


For the Drayton Valley detachment, comparing January 2022 and January 2023, total persons crime in the County decreased 30% (three fewer offences), total property crime decreased 45.8% (11 fewer offences), and total Criminal Code offences decreased 44.4% (20 fewer offences).

Soul Care

II cannot believe that we are less than a month away from celebrating Easter! In our family we prepare for Easter by observing the season of Lent. The purpose of the Lenten season is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ and to consider his suffering and his sacrifice, his life, death, burial. Sometimes we remove something from our daily routine to help us focus more intentionally on our relationship with Jesus, other times we add things such as collecting items for a local shelter or raising funds for a ministry need. Our Denomination puts together a wonderful resource of daily Lenten readings and I was invited to contribute my thoughts on Psalm 89.

Psalm 89

I love this Psalm as it reminds not only Israel of what God has done for them, but it also reminds us of who God is. The previous Psalm is what one would consider a bit miserable as we sit in a pit, but soon after, we shift into a Psalm that is all about God's glory and faithfulness. One might think that Psalm 89 questions the faithfulness of God, but I do not believe that. What I see here is this incredible reminder that God is who He says He is. Faithfulness is God's very character. We have a God that is merciful, faithful and keeps His promises. He is a powerful God who deserves to be revered and feared. He is a God who is in control of all the earth and all those who are privileged to walk in it. God is a protector and a King of His people. He is both kind and just. He does not leave us or forsake us, but He does require us to be obedient and will be angry at the thought of sin, no matter who delivers it. And He is a blessing to those who walk in the way He commands. We are reminded today that we can trust God because faithfulness is God's very character. We are reminded today that even when we may feel like we are in a miserable pit, we are asked to keep trusting and believing in God's promises. We are reminded today that there is always a way back to God.

If you find yourself struggling today, questioning where God is in your story, I invite you to pause and read over Psalm 89 and see if you can see God's faithfulness woven throughout the verses. As God reveals Himself to you through Scripture, I sense the same thing will happen to you as it does to me as I start to believe who God is, which is a God who is faithful and true, no matter what my circumstances are. My response can only be to spend my day singing about the tender kindness of the Lord, as I begin to see God's faithfulness in my story.

This will lead us into a life of sharing God's goodness and love to all who cross our path. A reminder that this is too wonderful to keep to ourselves. Our broken world needs to know that God's love and compassion is for everyone.

My friends, God is good, may we be reminded that no matter what...we can cling to the truth of God's faithfulness in our story.

And with all confidence in who God is, we can say.

"And yet... blessed be the Lord forever! Amen and Amen!"

- Scams targeting businesses and/or businesses targeting consumers;
- Businesses targeted by phishing scams and/or phone scams;
- · Business emails being compromised;
- · Mortgage fraud;
- Money laundering in real estate;
- · Door to door scams;
- · Contractor and home repair schemes;
- · Duct cleaning services; and,
- · Unlicensed businesses.

To better protect yourself from business fraud and scams, consider the following:

- Keep personal information private;
- Always remember that businesses don't ask for banking information via phone; and,
- Check the website URL by:
 - o Typing the URL into a search engine;
 - Looking for the "secure" icon on your search bar;
 - Look for any spelling errors and awkward phrasing; and,
 - Check the contact page which should have multiple options for a legitimate business (email, phone number, live chat, and address).

"Whether you are a member of the public looking for a business or a business owner, you must always be diligent about keeping your personal information private and familiarizing yourself with the warning signs." Cpl. Sean Milne, Alberta RCMP Provincial Economic Crime Team

If you are unsure of whether or not you are being

targeted by a scam, visit the Government of Canada's website to learn about common scamtypes.
