



Regular Meeting of Council - March 28, 2023

Rural Mental Health Grant – presented by Carol Rempel (Thorsby Animator)

Our submission to the Rural Mental Health Project Community Grant Program from April 2023 to January 2024 has been approved for \$20,000. The project is called "Home Run to Health", a Wellness Fair that will be organized at the Arctic Spa Recreation Centre in the fall. Date is yet to be determined. A RMH Task Force Team has been set up to organize, develop, implement, and evaluate the project. This volunteer group will work closely with FCSS the backbone organization and the Town of Thorsby for its success. Included in our project is the Enoch Cree Nation which will recognize culture and reconciliation. Our goal is to encourage Health and Wellness Strategies and collaboration by having fun in doing so.

The library's grant budget has increased by 10%. This is good news for all libraries. Check with our library for all the new programs and apps available.





The Municipal Government Act (MGA) requires municipalities that share a common boundary to prepare and adopt matching Intermunicipal Development Plans (IDPs) and to establish Intermunicipal Collaboration Frameworks (ICFs).

In 2019, the Village of Warburg and Leduc County worked collaboratively with input form the community to prepare an IDP and ICF. Policies in the IDP and ICF require that these documents be reviewed every 4 years to ensure the principles, policies, and intermunicipal service delivery remain current. In keeping with this requirement, Councils for the Village of Warburg and Leduc County have reviewed the IDP and ICF. Minor revisions, primarily housekeeping in nature, are proposed to both the IDP and the ICF. As the MGA now allows municipalities party to an ICF to each approve the ICF by resolution, the Village of Warburg and Leduc County are proposing to repeal the ICF and approved the updated ICF by resolution to streamline the processes.



The new Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership will support the continued growth and prosperity of Alberta's agriculture sector.

In Alberta, the partnership represents \$508 million in funding over five years that will provide grants to programs that support the needs of Alberta's agriculture and agri-food sector.

Alberta's programs will aim to create new jobs and spur growth in the agriculture sector by supporting value?added processing competitiveness, attracting new investment and expanding irrigation capacity that will boost crop production.

The programs will also continue protecting plant and animal health and animal welfare, managing risks to Alberta's natural resources and investing in producer-led agriculture research.

Producers also have access to an enhanced suite of business risk management programs to help them manage significant risks that threaten the viability of their farms and are beyond their capacity to manage.

In total, the Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership (Sustainable CAP) is a five-year, \$3.5-billion investment by Canada's federal, provincial and territorial governments that supports Canada's agri-food and agri-products sectors. This includes \$1 billion in federal programs and activities and a \$2.5-billion commitment that is cost-shared 60 per cent federally and 40 per cent provincially/territorially for programs that are designed and delivered by provinces and territories.


Compared with the current partnership, which expires at the end of the month, there is a \$500-million increase in cost-shared funding. Half of this additional funding will help develop and implement the Resilient Agricultural Landscape Program, which will support carbon sequestration, and protect grasslands and wetlands on agricultural lands.

The Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership comes into effect April 1 and replaces the Canadian Agricultural Partnership (CAP).

Quick facts

 Sustainable CAP represents the fifth pan-Canadian agreement on agriculture, agri-food and agri-based products policy. It replaces CAP (2018-2023), Growing Forward 2 (2013-2018), Growing Forward (2008-2013) and the Agriculture Policy Framework (2003-2008).

- On March 6, the federal government announced that applications are being accepted for federal programs under Sustainable CAP that will take effect on April 1.
- The Sustainable CAP framework provides flexibility for Alberta to develop and deliver programs that are aligned with the needs of Alberta's agriculture and agri-food sector and Government of Alberta priorities. Programs will align with five priority areas:
- building sector capacity, growth and competitiveness
- ° climate change and environmental protection
- ° science, research and innovation
- ° market development and trade
- ° resiliency and public trust

Volunteer Income Tax ProgramNow completing 2022 income taxes

The **Community Volunteer Income Tax Program** (**CVITP**) is now completing 2022 income taxes free-of-charge for people with low to modest income and a simple tax situation. This can include seniors, students, social assistance recipients and newcomers to Canada. The volunteer program does not complete returns for people who are deceased, bankrupt, or have business, farming or rental income. Assistance to complete past year tax returns is also available.

In order to be eligible to receive the **Guaranteed Income Supplement, GST Tax Credit, Canada Child Benefit, Canada Workers Benefit or the Climate Action Incentive,** your 2022 tax return must be filed.
Income taxes are due by April 30.

Join us to learn more about our proposed project to add carbon capture technology to our Genesee Generating Station to reduce emissions when Genesee Units 1 and 2 are repowered to natural gas. The carbon capture equipment will be located on a brownfield site (previously developed land) on the south-side of Capital Power's existing Genesee Generating Station. Our project team will share information about the proposed technology, location and schedule. We'll also be there to answer questions and listen to feedback.

The proposed project is expected to capture up to approximately 3 million tonnes of CO₂ annually using Mitsubishi Heavy Industry's proven Advanced Kansai Mitsubishi Carbon Dioxide Recovery Process™.

Capital Power anticipates submitting regulatory applications for the proposed project in the first half of 2023. Separate applications will be filed to amend the existing approvals for Genesee 1 and 2 to Alberta Environment and Protected Areas (formerly Alberta Environment and Parks) and the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC).

Pending regulatory approval and a final investment decision, construction is expected to begin in Q2 2024, with an anticipated in-service date in late Q4 2027.

HAM AND CHEESE BREAKFAST TORTILLAS

- 12 eggs
- 1/3 cup milk
- 3 slices cooked ham, diced
- 2 green onions, minced
- salt and pepper to taste
- · 4 ounces Cheddar cheese, shredded
- 4 (10 inch) flour tortillas
- 1/2 cup salsa

Beat together eggs and milk. Heat a lightly oiled skillet (or non-stick pan) over medium high heat and cook egg mixture, stirring occasionally, until firm.

When almost done, stir in ham, green onions, salt and pepper.

Spoon 1/4 of the egg mixture on top of each tortilla.

Sprinkle the eggs with cheese, fold over the tortilla to make a roll and top with salsa if desired.

BRUNCH BURRITOS

- butter flavored cooking spray
- 2 cloves garlic, crushed
- 1 (8 ounce) package mushrooms
- 1 teaspoon garlic salt
- 6 eggs. beaten
- 4 (10 inch) flour tortillas
- · 2 cups shredded Monterey Jack cheese
- 16 cherry tomatoes
- 1 (5 ounce) package alfalfa sprouts

Liberally spray a medium saucepan with cooking spray. Repeat spraying while cooking as needed.

Over medium heat, cook the garlic for approximately 3 minutes. Stir in the mushrooms, and season with garlic salt. Cook until mushrooms are tender, about 3 minutes, and set aside.

In the same saucepan, scramble eggs. Stir in the mushrooms, and continue to scramble until eggs are firm.

Transfer 1/4 of the egg mixture into each tortilla. Top each with 1/2 cup cheese, 4 cherry tomatoes and 1/4 of the sprouts. Roll tortillas, and serve.
