RR64/BUCK CREEK FIRE UPDATE

10:30am, May 8, 2023

The fire remains out of control this morning. We know that Alberta Emergency Alert has cancelled the alerts for our area and it is causing a lot of confusion for our evacuees. We had scheduled messages to post every hour over the last 24 hours to reiterate that the fire remains out of control and that it is not safe to re-enter the community.

We do not have a timeline established for re-entry as the fire is still out of control and unpredictable. It's worth noting that this is a marathon, not a sprint. The incident is not expected to end soon. The situation is dynamic and continuously evolving.

Resources from Alberta Wildfire have been brought in to provide additional support to crews already on site. The weather is working in our favour again today and will allow us to reinforce the fire breaks and strengthen our efforts to manage the fire.

The evacuation order remains in effect this morning for residents in the following area: from Township 480 North to Township 494 and Range Road 64 West to Range Road 90. This includes the entire community of Drayton Valley. From Highway 39 North on the east side of the North Saskatchewan River is NOT part of the evacuation order.

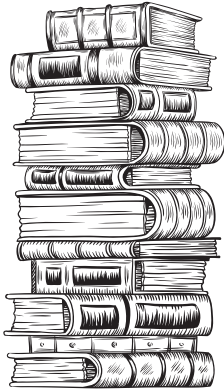

BE PREPARED

If you have not already gathered items incase, we need to evacuate at some point here is a list of items that you can put together. ***List is on next page.*

The lingering effects of unexpected emergencies and disasters are different for everyone. Knowing what to do after an emergency can help reduce stress and aid in a quicker recovery.

If you had to evacuate, you cannot return home until authorities have told you it's safe to do so. Use extreme caution at all times. Being prepared can help speed up your recovery time, so you can get back to your life and work sooner.

The process to repair and restore your life after an emergency or disaster is not easy and takes time, flexibility and patience.

Examples of recovery include:

- removing waste and debris
- contacting your insurance company
- replacing lost or destroyed documentation.
- finding a new housing
- getting mental health support

Find out where your community will post information on support and recovery after an emergency.

EMERGENCY FINANCIAL HELP FOR WILDFIRE EVACUEES

May 8, 2023

Albertans forced to evacuate their homes due to ongoing wildfires will soon receive emergency financial assistance.

Starting May 9 at 9 a.m., any Albertan who has evacuated under mandatory order for seven consecutive days or more can apply for a one-time emergency evacuation payment to help during this difficult time.

Eligible evacuees will receive \$1,250 per adult and an additional \$500 per dependent child under 18 years. This means that an evacuated family of four will receive \$3,500.

Evacuees can apply for the payment at www.alberta.ca/emergency using an Alberta.ca Account. Funds can take up to 24 hours to flow into accounts and will be disbursed via e-transfer. Evacuees who are unable to receive an e-transfer or who cannot apply online can contact 310-4455 for assistance and to make alternate payment arrangements. Government ministries are working closely with First Nation and Métis communities to ensure supports are provided directly where appropriate.

This is part of the government's ongoing emergency response to wildfires across Alberta. Emergency responders continue working around the clock to keep people safe and reduce the threat to homes and infrastructure.

The Emergency Management Cabinet Committee continues to meet regularly to respond to the current wildfire situation across the province. Cabinet continues to have decision-making abilities and will make decisions as needed to deal with this emergency situation.

The most up-to-date evacuation information is available at www.alberta.ca/emergency, Alberta Emergency Alert or by downloading the Alberta Emergency Alert mobile app, which immediately pushes all alerts out to subscribers. Albertans seeking information or supports can call 310-4455.

Anyone who has been evacuated due to wildfires is asked to register at local reception centres or at www.emergencyregistration.alberta.ca.

Quick facts

- Albertans can visit alberta.ca/emergency for more information and to access the payment application.
- Evacuees can apply for the payment at alberta.ca/emergency using an Alberta.ca Account.
- Payments will be disbursed via e-transfer, which can take up to 24 hours following application. To receive payment via e-transfer, Albertans will need a personal email address and a bank account.
- For Albertans who are unable to receive an e-transfer, alternative arrangements will be made through the Alberta Supports Contact Centre.
- Applications will remain open until 30 days after that specific community's evacuation order ends.

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AHS RESPONDS TO PROVINCIAL WILDFIRES

Submitted by Alberta Health Services, May 7, 2023

EDMONTON – Alberta Health Services (AHS), with the help of our EMS teams, have evacuated several healthcare sites in response to evacuation orders issued due to the current wildfire risk. The health and safety of patients and staff remains AHS' top priority. We are continuously monitoring the wildfire situation and continue to work closely with our community partners.

Evacuated acute care patients, long-term care and continuing care residents continue to be moved to other facilities across the province. While this has been an extremely challenging situation, the evacuations have gone well thanks to the cooperation of those having to move and the hard work of our staff, physicians, and supporting agencies. All zones are actively working around the clock to ensure patients and residents are safely cared for in temporary locations.

Evacuated patients and continuing care residents are being relocated in safe and appropriate settings. All zones are opening care spaces to accommodate those in need. These relocations are happening through EMS, chartered buses and flights as required. Patients and residents are being accompanied and supported by staff.

AHS is contacting families of loved ones to share patient/resident location information.

AHS has been working to identify additional staffing supports across all zones to ensure patients, residents and our care teams continue to be appropriately supported.

AHS sites safely evacuated and closed to date are:

- Drayton Valley Hospital and Care Centre
- Edson Healthcare Centre
- Fox Creek Healthcare Centre
- High Prairie Health Complex

If you have an emergency, please call 911. EMS resources remain in evacuated areas to provide support to those who need.

All appointments with laboratory services, mental health and public health in evacuated communities are postponed at this time. Clients will be contacted directly by AHS to be rescheduled as soon as possible. Home care clients impacted by evacuations are being contacted to arrange for alternative home visits and support from nursing teams.

Our teams are working with municipal leaders in these communities to establish plans for re-entry when it is deemed safe to do so.

We are extremely grateful for our frontline staff, leaders

and physicians who have come together to support the response across AHS, and especially to those who have been evacuated along with their families. We are also grateful for our partner organizations, including several continuing care organizations that continue to support these efforts.

We are also appreciative of our community partners and volunteers who continue to answer when called upon for their support.

AHS provides wildfire resources for Albertans at bit.ly/30XCnwc, including mental health, air quality, and emergency planning links.

AHS also has resources and services available to help you and your loved ones cope with healthcare needs and stress in this difficult time. Experiencing an evacuation can be stressful and overwhelming. If you need to talk, call the Mental Health Help Line at 1-877-303-2642 or Health Link at 811.

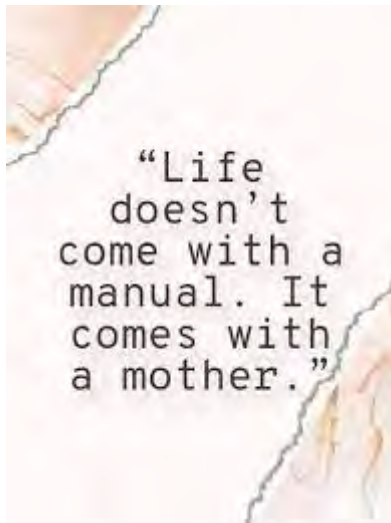

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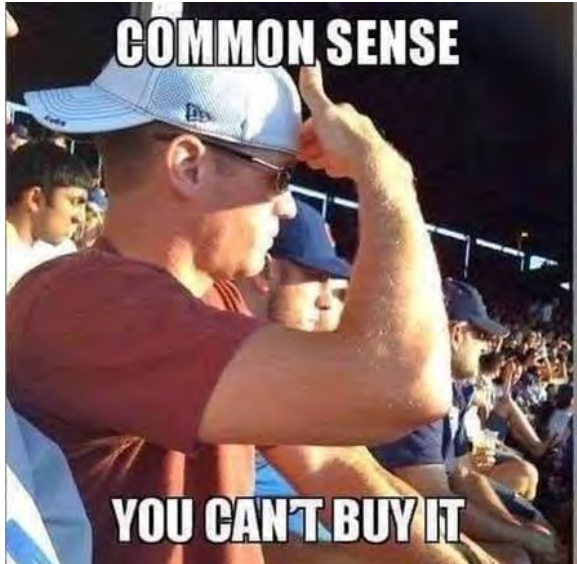
