COACHES FROM WARBURG FIND SUCCESS IN FIRST ROUND OF PLAYOFFS

Spring is a time of year that hockey fans love with the NHL playoffs getting closer to name this year's Stanley Cup champions. As we are now down to the final 8 teams, competing we think it is time to highlight some of the local talent that is representing the small village of Warburg in the playoffs. Did you know that there is not just one head coach but rather 2 head coaches in the remaining 8 teams that came from Warburg? That's right...2 head coaches in the NHL from Warburg. Both Lindy Ruff, head coach of New Jersey Devils, and Dave Hakstol, head coach of Seattle Kraken, are still in the running for the Stanley Cup. Now that we are down to the final 8 teams you could say that 25% of the head coaches still in the playoffs are from Warburg.

Lindy Ruff was one of 4 boys in the Ruff family, all of which displayed hockey talent. Lindy's older brother Randy played and coached Junior hockey, Marty was drafted by the St. Louis Blues (but never appeared in any NHL games) and Brent passed away in a bus

crash while playing hockey for the Swift Current Broncos.

Lindy was drafted in 1979 by the Buffalo Sabres where he played most of his career as well as the New York Rangers. In 1993 he started his coaching career as an assistant coach for the Florida Panthers. In 1997 he became the head coach for the Buffalo Sabres. Lindy is currently coaching the New Jersey Devils on their quest for the Stanley Cup.

Dave Hakstol also grew up on the farm just outside of Warburg and had a passion for the sport of hockey. He has 1 brother (Brian) and 1 sister (Sandra) that are still in the area.

Dave had a slightly different path than Lindy starting off playing for Red Deer in the AJHL in 1986. In 1989, Dave went to the University of North





Dakota to play hockey. After retiring as a player, Dave began his coaching career in 1996 for the Sioux City Musketeers. In 2015, Hakstol became the first head coach to jump from coaching NCAA hockey to NHL being named the head coach for the Philadelphia Flyers. Dave was named the first head coach of the Seattle Kraken in 2021 and hopes to lead his team right through to the Stanley Cup.

Make sure to show your support and cheer loud and proud for the hometown boys when their teams are playing. These are exciting times for everyone who knows these 2 talented coaches. So be proud and show the youth that growing up in the small Village of Warburg still provides ample of opportunity if you work hard and put your mind to it, I know these 2 did....

All fire permits are suspended, as per the Forest and Prairie Protection Act, and no new fire permits will be issued.

You can use gas/propane appliances, such as barbecues, heaters and firepits, and use solid-fuel (charcoal and pellets) appliances.

WILDFIRE PREPAREDNESS IN ALBERTA: PROTECTING YOUR HOME AND COMMUNITY

Wildfires are a common occurrence in Alberta, with hot and dry weather creating ideal conditions for these devastating events. The province experiences an average of 1,300 wildfires per year, which can cause significant damage to homes, communities, and wildlife. As a homeowner or community member, it is important to be prepared for the possibility of a wildfire. Here are some tips to help you get started:

Create a Defensible Space

Creating a defensible space is one of the most important things you can do to protect your home from wildfires. This involves creating a buffer zone around your property that is free of flammable materials. Remove any dead trees or shrubs, clear away dry leaves and debris, and trim back any overhanging branches. Keep your lawn well-watered and maintained, and avoid storing firewood or other flammable materials near your home.

Have an Emergency Plan

In the event of a wildfire, it is important to have an emergency plan in place. This should include a designated meeting place for your family, as well as an evacuation plan. FLOWER WATERING CONTRACT 2023 SEASON

Thorsby Communities In Bloom is currently looking for a passionate community minded individual to water all the planters for the 2023 Summer Season in the Town of Thorsby.

The Responsibilities Include:

BREAKING NEWS!!

FIRE BAN IN EFFECT

Leduc County and the Town of Thorsby are now under a fire ban. There is an extreme risk of wildfire due to dry conditions.

No outdoor fires are allowed – including open burning and fires contained to approved burn barrels, firepits or charcoal barbecues – and all outdoor fires currently burning must be extinguished immediately. The discharge of fireworks is not allowed.

All fire permits are suspended, as per the **Forest and Prairie Protection Act**, and no new fire permits will be issued for the duration of this ban.

Citizens can use cooking and heating appliances – such as barbecues, firepits and patio heaters – fueled by liquid fuel like propane or natural gas.

If you see a fire, please call 9-1-1 and report it as soon as it is safe to do so.



Fire officials will continue to monitor conditions, and will update the public at leduccounty.com and albertafirebans.ca when the ban is lifted or downgraded.

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT DECISION FOR MUNICIPALITIES

Thorsby, Alberta – The Town of Thorsby responded to the federal government's disappointing decision to pass unbudgeted and unaccounted for costs on to municipalities.

Despite months of municipal advocacy led by the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM), provincial-territorial associations and local leaders across Canada, the federal government has indicated in the most recent federal budget it will not be meeting the request to absorb the retroactive costs associated with the latest RCMP collective bargaining agreement.

Tuesday's budget further confirmed that communities across Canada that are dependent on RCMP services for local policing, including are expected to cover these costs—a decision falling well short of the call from municipalities to fully absorb the costs.

Local governments were not at the table for these negotiations. And while cost estimates were provided to some municipalities, these turned out to be far below the final agreement's increase over six years, with retroactive pay going back to 2017.

This decision is an example of a federal commitment that deeply impacts municipalities, without municipalities being properly consulted or involved. Municipal governments are paying a growing share of policing costs, but they cannot run deficits and have limited revenue tools.

FCM has clearly reiterated the need for municipalities to be actively involved in any future processes regarding contract policing, calling this recent decision unacceptable. This is a position supported in full by Thorsby.



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



10 THINGS NEVER TO SAY TO SOMEONE WHOSE **BODY IS CHANGING:**

- 1. You don't need to lose weight. This might be intended to assure someone that you care about them no matter what the scale says, but it may be taken as a negative comment. You were trying to say they are fine, but you aren't supporting their journey!
- 2. Have you tried XYZ diet? It worked well for me! Suggesting a specific diet may encourage people to favor extreme weight -loss solutions over healthy lifestyle changes. This simplistic view of weight management may be insulting to someone who feels lie they have tried everything and have failed yet again.
- 3. Didn't you try to lose weight last year? Reminding someone of past attempts to lose weight can imply that you believe they will fall short yet again. Try offering positive encouragement instead!
- 4. Why are you eating that? Aren't you on a diet? Being the food police isn't going to win you any favors or help anyone lose weight. It can be discouraging and come across as a critique of what they are eating.
- 5. Having curves is ore attractive than being skinny anyway! It is not necessary or OK to devalue one kind of body to praise another kind of body. All bodies, of any shape and size have value!
- 6. How much have you lost so far? This can be upsetting to someone who feels they haven't lost weight as quickly as intended (or may have re-gained a few pounds). They may think, "Why are you keeping tabs on my progress anyway?"
- 7. You're barely eating anything.../ Are you sure

- you're healthy? A usually well-intended comment that shows you don't understand your friend's new eating habits. It could make the dieter self-conscious about what they eat in front of you and others!
- 8. What can you eat? It can make someone feel like they're being perceived as a picky eater or a difficult dinner guest. Instead, try asking what kinds of meals that person has been enjoying lately, rather than making them list the food that they have had to eliminate.
- 9. But this was made just for you! The wave of guilt and temptation that can come when faced with a plate of grandma's cookies can be overwhelming! Saboteurs, whether they do so purposefully or not, can be hugely detrimental!
- 10. Nobody will notice if you're just a few pounds lighter! Losing even a few pounds can have a profound psychological and physical impact on a person. It's best to not make assumptions about how weight loss will change someone else's life.
