SODIUM IN YOUR DIET

You've probably heard that most Americans eat too much sodium. Your body needs a small amount of sodium to work properly, but too much sodium can be bad for your health. Diets higher in sodium are associated with an increased risk of developing high blood pressure, which is a major cause of stroke and heart disease. Despite what many people think, most dietary sodium (over 70%) comes from eating packaged and prepared foods-not from table salt added to food when cooking or eating. The food supply contains too much sodium and American who want to consume less sodium can have a difficult time doing so. That is why the U.S. Food and Drug Administration is working with the food industry to make reasonable reduction in sodium across a wide variety of foods. Even though sodium may already be in many packaged foods when you purchase them, you can lower your daily sodium intake by using the Nutrition Facts label.

SODIUM AS A FOOD INGREDIENT

As a food ingredient, sodium has multiple uses, such as for curing meat, baking, thickening, flavor and as a preservative. Some common food additives like monosodium glutamate (MSG), sodium bicarbonate (baking soda) sodium nitrate and sodium benzoatealso contain sodium and contribute (in lesser amounts) to the total amount of "sodium "listed on the Nutrition Facts label.

Surprisingly, some foods that don't taste salty can still be high in sodium, which is why using taste alone is not an accurate way to judge a food's sodium content. For example, while some foods that are high in sodium (like pickles and soy sauce) taste salty, there are also many foods (like cereals and pastries) that contain sodium but don't taste salty. Also, some foods that you may eat several times a day (such as breads) can add up to a lot of sodium over the course of a day, even though an individual serving may not be high in sodium.

9 EASY TIPS FOR REDUCING SODIUM CONSUMPTION

- 1. **Read the Nutrition Facts level.** Compare and choose foods to get less than 100% DV (less than 2,300 mg of sodium each day.
- 2. **Prepare your own food when you can**. Limit packaged sauces, mixes, and "instant" products (including flavored rice, instant noodles and read-made pasta).
- 3. Add flavor without adding sodium. Limit the amount of table salt you add to foods when cooking, baking, or at the table. Try no-salt seasoning blends and herbs and spices instead of salt to add flavor to your food.
- 4. **Buy fresh**. Choose fresh meat, poultry, and seafood rather than processed varieties. Also, check the package on fresh meat and poultry to see if salt water or saline has been added.
- 5. **Watch your veggies**. Buy fresh, frozen,(no sauce or seasoning) or low sodium or no -salt added canned vegetables.
- 6. **Give sodium the "rinse.**" Rinse sodiumcontaining canned foods, such as beans, tuna, and vegetables before eating. This removes some of the sodium.
- 7. **Unsalt your snacks**. Choose low sodium or no salt added nuts, seeds and snack products (such as chips and pretzels) -or have carrot or celery sticks instead.
- 8. **Reduce your portion size.** Less food means less sodium. Prepare smaller portions at home and consume less when eating out-choose smaller sizes, split an entrée with a friend, or take-home part of your meal.
- 9. **Make lower-sodium choices at restaurants**. Ask for your meal to be prepared without table salt and request that sauces and salad dressings be served "on the side". Then use less of them. You can also ask if nutrition information is available and then choose options that are lower in sodium.

SODIUM AND BLOOD PRESSURE

Sodium attracts water, and a high-sodium diet draws water into the bloodstream, which can increase the volume of blood and subsequently your blood pressure. High blood pressure (also known as hypertension) is a condition in which blood pressure remains elevated over time. Hypertension makes the heart work too hard, and the high force of the blood flow can harm arteries and organs (such as the heart, kidneys, brain, and eyes). Uncontrolled high blood pressure can raise the risk of heart attack, heart failure, stroke, kidney disease, and blindness. In addition, blood pressure generally rises as you get older so limiting your sodium intake becomes even more important each year.

Letter To The Editor - Education

With fires burning across the landscape and many Albertans forced to leave their homes, you could be forgiven for forgetting the province is in the middle of an election.

It seems of small importance in comparison, but it is not without consequences. The reality is this election will decide the future of Alberta. It is the most important election in Alberta's history. It is a choice between those who want to keep moving Alberta forward by protecting the services and values Albertans hold dear, or those who want to take Alberta backwards by recycling failed ideological policies that have already failed Albertans once before. This is particularly true when it comes to Alberta schools. Since day one, the UCP has cherished Alberta's diverse education system and worked to grow it even stronger.


