

THORSBY 13U A TIER ONE CHAMPIONS

The Thorsby 13U A Bandits started off their provincial quest by going 6-0 in tiering games in Thorsby and High Prairie. After their tiering success they were placed Tier 1 and would attend provincials in Hanna, AB. Along with our hometown Bandits, the qualifying Tier 1 teams were the Athabasca Trappers, SWEMBA Whitesox, Sherwood Park Athletics, Mannville Mammoths and Hanna Wildcats.

Thorsby started with a round robin win on Friday night against Athabasca by a score of 16-6. The following day they followed up with their second round robin win against the Sherwood Park Athletics by a score of 19-9. This setup a semi-final birth Sunday afternoon against the SWEMBA White Sox from Edmonton. The Bandits would walk away with a 14-5 win, earning themselves a spot in the provincial final. Our hometown Bandits came up against a Mannville team in the final that would push them to the brink. Trailing 12-8 going into the bottom of the 7th, the Bandits would rally for 5 runs in their last at bat, miraculously erasing their deficit and securing the provincial championship by a score of 13-12.





LOCAL FEMALE HOCKEY HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

What if I told you that hockey could take you on an adventure of a lifetime? Travel to new places, quadruple the size of what you consider "family", help form your identity, self confidence, habits of persistence and ability to work with other people? Let me tell you how it did for me.

Growing up, I was introduced to hockey by my Dad. The first time I could skate by myself, The sport sparked my passion. I knew that this was a sport that I wanted to pursue. I grew up on a farm just outside the village of Warburg (approximately an hour southwest of Edmonton, Alberta), with a population of just over 700 people. Like all small towns in Canada, the ice arena and curling rink were the two most popular spots in town. I played youth hockey with the same group of players and coaches from mites through midget (ages 7-18).

Players from Warburg went on to play in leagues such as Junior, WHL, NCAA, WHA, IIHF, and NHL. In fact, Head Coaches Lindy Ruff of the New Jersey Devils and Dave Hakstol of Seattle Kraken are from Warburg, battled for the 2023 Stanley Cup in the playoffs and were two of the three finalists for the Jack Adams Award (Coach of the Year)! How did so many great hockey players come from such a small town? The answer is simple...great coaching, knowing the value of hard work and loving what you do. So many successful players had a parent who coached. I am so grateful that my dad, Gary Bredin, was my coach. He not only taught my teammates and I

the game, he taught us discipline, team work, respect and through example, how to be a leader. Most importantly he made practices fun, which seeded the desire for all of us to continue the tradition of giving back to our communities. Great coaches produce great players.

I played numerous sports growing up from the equestrian sport of 3-Day Eventing, volleyball and track and field. Sports were seasonal, allowing for a "break" and change in perspective from one sport to the next. Hockey presented a particular physical challenge: high-intensity, strength, endurance, and agility. The physical demands of the game are what make it so exciting and rewarding. There's nothing quite like the feeling of pushing yourself to your limits, both physically and mentally, and edging out a competitor for the win. I was fortunate enough to make and help captain Team Alberta during the Canada Winter Games. This is where Carol Mullins, from Cornell University (I am told she was the only US College coach in attendance at that time), noticed me. From there I had the opportunity to play for Team Canada in the U19 rivalry series against the United States in Lake Placid.

This was an exciting time I was recruited by Cornell University in NY, the University of Alberta and the University of Calgary. I chose Cornell. I flew into Syracuse and Coach Carol picked me up and dropped me off at my dorm. I had not seen the campus prior to moving in on the first day. With my biological family 3000 miles away, my team became my extended family. I majored in Applied Economics and Business Management.

At Cornell we had a great relationship with the local lthaca girls hockey association. I was paired up with 12 year old Chelsea Traunstein. Her family welcomed me with open arms. They had me and many of my teammates over for home cooked meals, made us cookies and came to our home games with signs and cheers. When my younger sister Correne, who played for Dartmouth College came to Cornell, there was a sign posted - "BIG SISTER VS LITTLE SISTER" which made my sister and I smile. In return for their support, our college team ran drills at the girls practices. They called it the "Cub Club". This experience is an example of the connection hockey creates in personal lives and in the community.

Once I graduated, I didn't want to hang up my skates. I signed a contract as one of three foreign players with SC Reinach in Swiss Hockey League. I had a great year, led the league in scoring and my team won the Swiss Championship! My cub-club sister and her family even came over to visit me. Hockey gave me the opportunity



to go to many places - from Munich, Germany to Paris, France and all around Switzerland. I met amazing friends and am still in contact with a couple to this day.

After Switzerland, I had the opportunity to earn my MBA, in return for being an assistant coach on the women's ice team at the University of Findlay, Ohio. After one year at Findlay I landed at the NCAA Division 1 University of New Hampshire with head coach Brian McCloskey. Brian is one of the smartest hockey minds I have come to know. He taught me to see more with my ears than with my eyes, especially on the recruiting trail. I also worked with goalie phenom, Erin (Whitten) Hamlen. Everyone says it takes four years for a new coach to get their own players in to see real success and that rained true. In the 2005-2006 season we had 33-3-1 record, winning the Hockey East regular season and tournament title. We then advanced to UNH's first Frozen Four appearance losing in the semi-finals to eventual Champions, Wisconsin.

On recruiting trail, I met Sarah Matthews of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (RPI) and we became friends. She introduced me to her brother, Kyle, who is also an avid hockey fan. This introduction led to my move from UNH, to the position of assistant coach at RPI for six years. During this time Kyle and I were married and had two children, Cole and Kara. After Kara was born I decided to leave coaching and focus on our children.

As a coach you no longer experience the physical benefits of the sport, but the mental and social aspects couldn't be stronger. Hockey requires strategy, skill, and intelligence. It's not just about who can skate the fastest or shoot the hardest - it's about creating a team that understands the game and making split-second decisions that can make all the difference. This intellectual challenge is what keeps me motivated to stay in the sport.

I am a volunteer head coach in the Schenectady Youth Hockey Association. I have coached my son Cole from mini-mites through 12U AA and continue to love being a part of a team. I enjoy sharing my knowledge and creating positive experiences in a player's life, just as many have done for me. Some of my best friends today are hockey parents of my team.



I am thankful that my mom and dad gave me the opportunity to play the game I love and for my younger sister, who constantly challenges me to be better. My parents and grandparents were all avid hockey fans and supporters. I am carrying on the tradition of the sport that has brought us all so much joy and fulfillment.

When I look at my family, there is a common passion for sport. The combination of physical challenge, strategic

thinking and social connection bring us closer together. From talking hockey with my dad, building practice plans with my husband or watching my kids learn a new skill, I am thankful for all that sport has given us. The next time you are near the rink. take a moment to appreciate sport, give someone a high five and keep the passion alive!

First of all I would like to apologize for the lack of communication over the past few months. As a Board of Volunteers, the work gets done and sometimes the communication falls to the back burner but we have been rebuilding our Chamber since May of 2022 and here are a few things we have done so far:

- Raised money to replenish our depleted bank accounts
- Successfully organized 3 local annual events with the help and support of the community, local business and groups (Customer Appreciation -Christmas in the Village, Chamber Christmas Gala, May Long Weekend)
- Assisted Arctic Spas & the Town of Thorsby in bringing Gord Bamford to Thorsby. All funds raised went to the Thorsby Arctic Spas Recreation Complex for much needed upgrades (\$44,315.82).
- Officially formed as a Society with the Alberta Government
- Increased membership
- Appointed Chamber member to be on the Water for Life Task Force
- Became an Elavon (payment processing) referral partner
- Met with our local CAO and public works to discuss snow removal priorities and some of the "Upkeep & Maintenance" in our community
- Raised over \$10,000 towards future Chamber
 Projects

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT / TOURISM OPPORTUNITY

At our last Chamber meeting in June we had discussed the rebuilding of our Chamber Entrance sign but also putting Thorsby on the "Tourism Map" by adding something fun like a Thor Statue or Hammer. Since then we found a connection through Matt Ruhr (Ruhr Lumber) who not only builds statues/monuments but will do it for an affordable price because of family connections. We are waiting for preliminary drawings and costs and not sure if it will be Thor or just his hammer but we are very excited.

In discussion, we decided that in order to bring people into Thorsby, not just drive through or by, the best location would be Taylor Park, not at our Entrance sign. In saying this, Taylor Park is not finished and is not a place we want to promote yet. At the July 25 Regular Council Meeting, we submitted our proposal to the Thorsby Council to create a memorandum of understanding (MOU) where Thorsby & District Chamber of Commerce Society partner with the Town of Thorsby and so that the Chamber assumes responsibility over the construction and possibly maintenance of the park. The Council agreed.

Some of the ideas brought forward are to landscape, add a perennial garden to put the rock that was previously purchased which will honor Bob Taylor who donated the land, professionally move the tree in front to the back to make room for the statue/monument, move the fire pit, purchase and install picnic tables with bases for easy maintenance, cover the current mural with actual history of Thorsby, and more! We plan to recognize large contributors like Arctic Spas, ATB, Westower, Ruhr Lumber, Lone Wolf and others that have contributed or plan to contribute.

Taylor Park will now be a tourist destination and "on the map" with something very cool and unique for people to come and see! This Statue/monument would bring the "NEWS" to our little town when it is delivered, and not just our local paper. It will be a great addition to some of the great things Thorsby currently has to offer and is working on for the future. This also in turn will bring people to Thorsby to shop in our stores, eat in our restaurants and support our local businesses.

Why Thor or Thor's Hammer? Some stories say that Thorsby was named after Thor, the God of Thunder. On the website www.canadaehx.com it says "Needing a name for the post office, they chose to name it for their home Torsby in Sweden, and choosing to honour the Norse god Thor, gave it the name Thorsby." Whether or not it's true, what a fun way to promote our community. This is a huge opportunity for Thorsby!

We haven't forgotten about our entrance sign which needs a facelift and to be updated. Plans are still in the works but we need to know approximately how many businesses want to advertise on the sign. 
