

## Back-to-school

For some parents and children, going back to school can create anxiety and stress. It's important to remember that the notion of attending school may not be the main stressor; instead, it may be the separation from home and the child's trusted adult that contributes to the anxiety of back-to-school.

Anxious feelings are normal and expected in children and teens returning to school, changing schools, or for first timers starting kindergarten. The transition to backto-school can be stressful and disruptive for the entire family.

In the days leading up to school, your anxious child may cling, cry, have temper tantrums, complain of headaches or stomach pains, withdraw, plead, bargain or become irritable or angry.

**Worries are common**. Anxious children and teens worry about many different school-related issues, such as teachers, friends, fitting in, and/or being away from their parents. Some common concerns include:

- Who will be my new teacher and what if they are mean?
- Will any of my friends be in my class?
- Are my clothes ok?
- Who will I sit with at lunch?
- What if I miss the bus?
- What if math is too hard for me?
- I can't remember anything I learned last year!
- What if something bad happens to mom or dad while I am at school?

Although it is normal for your child to have worries, **it is crucial your child attends school**. Missing school will only increase your child's fears because it reduces their ability to build resiliency. Furthermore, when children and teens stay home because of anxiety, they miss:

- Valuable opportunities to develop and practice social skills.
- · Important chances for success and skill mastery.
- · Being acknowledged for their talents.
- Fostering close friendships with classmates.
- Learning basic skills like reading, writing and mathematics.

## Five steps to deal with back-to-school worries

### STEP 1 Take care of the basics

Ensure your child is getting enough sleep, eating regular meals and healthy snacks and has daily exercise. When your child's mind and body are nourished with a good night's sleep and a decent breakfast, tackling school concerns are easier; your child will be more likely to listen to you and they will cope better when you insist on school attendance.

### STEP 2 Provide empathy

Listen to your child's concerns. What is your child worried about? What does your child expect to happen? Let your child share their fears and talk about what is on their mind. Take advantage of the good opportunities to simply listen to your child such as when you are in the car, standing in line at the store, at bath-time or during dinner. For some kids and teens this "casual" method of talking feels less intense and makes it easier for them to express themselves. While others may prefer private time with your undivided attention.

### STEP3 Problem solve

Once you know what is bothering your child, you can start to develop a coping plan. Anxious youth are often poor problem solvers and doubt their ability to cope. Addressing your child's fear head on by creating an active plan with concrete solutions will significantly reduce their concerns. For example, try either of these approaches: "If [the worst] happens, what could you do?" or "Let's think of some ways you could handle that situation." These approaches give parents the opportunity to coach their child on how to cope with (and interpret) both real and imagined situations.

### STEP4 Focus on positive aspects

Once you understand what your child is afraid of, you can create a coping strategy to address their fears and encourage your child to re-direct attention away from their worries and towards the positives. Ask your child, "what are three things that you are most excited about on your first day of school?" Most kids can think of something good, even if it's just eating a special snack or going home at the end of the day. Chances are the fun aspects of back-to-school are simply getting overlooked by repetitive worries.

### STEP 5 Pay attention to your own behavior

For parents of younger children or children starting at a new school, it can be anxiety-provoking for parents to hand over care and responsibility of their child to teachers. Children take cues from their parents, so the more confident and calm a parent is, the more a child will believe they can handle this new hurdle. When saying goodbye in the morning, be supportive yet firm. Say goodbye cheerfully – once! Ensure you don't reward your child's protests, crying, or tantrums by allowing them to stay home. Instead, in a calm tone, say: "I can see that going to school is making you scared, but you still have to go. Tell me what you are worried about, so we can talk about it."

### Optional school preparation timeline steps

### One to two weeks before school

 Gradually return your child to a school-day sleep and wake routine. If your child has been going to bed several hours later than usual and sleeping in

during the holiday, roll the clock back by 15 to 30 minutes daily. For example, instead of going to bed at 11 p.m., help your child get to bed by 10:45pm on day one, by 10:30 p.m. on day two, etc. Do this until your child is in bed and asleep at a reasonable time and they are able to get up and out of bed consistently at the appropriate time. You may also need to ask everyone in the family to adjust to the new schedule, so your child isn't the only one making changes.

- Ask your child to help plan school lunches for the first week. You can go to the store together to shop for these items.
- Create a list of school supplies together and plan a fun shopping trip.
- For younger children, go to the schoolyard and play a few times before the first day of school. This can help your child feel more comfortable in his/her surroundings, making the transition of back-toschool a familiar one.

### Two to three days before school

- Go to the school several times walking, biking, driving, or taking the bus. For young children taking the school bus, describe and draw out the bus route, including where the bus goes and how long it takes to get to school. Talk about bus safety.
- For new students, take a tour of the school. Most schools are open a few days before the official first day as teachers are setting up their classrooms. "Peek in" and ask for a quick look around. Show your child the classrooms, the cafeteria and the bathrooms. If possible, meet your child's teacher with your child present.
- Ask your child to help choose what they want to wear on the first few days.
- Together with your child, pack up the schoolbag the night before, including a special toy or comfort item for younger children who are nervous about separating. A reassuring note in a child's lunch can also help ease separation anxiety.

### The first day of school

- Prepare a favorite breakfast to make the morning more fun.
- Decide who will take your child to school if this is an option. Having your child go to school with a friend for the first couple of days may feel less scary or try driving your child for the first week until they feel confident to take the bus.
- If your child has a history of separation anxiety in other settings, tell the teacher. Most teachers are experts in this area and have years of experience!
- Most importantly, celebrate success! You got this!



## CYANOBACTERIA (BLUE-GREEN ALGAE) ADVISORY ISSUED FOR PIGEON LAKE

WETASKIWIN COUNTY – Cyanobacteria (blue-green algae) has been identified in the waters of Pigeon Lake. Residents living near the shores of this lake, as well as visitors to this lake, are advised to take the following precautions:

Avoid all contact with cyanobacterial blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.

Do not swim or wade or allow your pets to swim or wade in any areas where cyanobacteria is visible.

Do not feed whole fish or fish trimmings from this lake to your pets.

Consider limiting human consumption of whole fish and fish trimmings from this lake, as it is known that fish may store toxins in their liver. (People can safely consume fish fillets from this lake).

As always, visitors and residents are reminded to never drink or cook with untreated water directly from any recreational body of water, including Pigeon Lake, at any time. Boiling of this water will not remove the toxins produced by cyanobacteria. An alternate source of drinking water should also be provided for pets and livestock, while this advisory is active.

Cyanobacteria is naturally occurring, and often becomes visible when weather conditions are calm. Appearing like scum, grass clippings, fuzz, or globs on the surface of water, cyanobacteria can be blue-green, greenishbrown, brown, and/or pinkish-red, and often smell musty or grassy.

People who come in contact with visible cyanobacteria or who ingest water containing cyanobacteria may experience skin irritation, rash, sore throat, sore red eyes, swollen lips, fever, nausea and vomiting and/or diarrhea. Symptoms usually appear within one to three hours and resolve in one to two days. Symptoms in children are often more pronounced; however, all humans are at risk of these symptoms. Exposure to the bacteria may be fatal to pets.

Weather and wind conditions can cause algae blooms to move from one location in the lake to another. As such, this advisory will remain in effect for Pigeon Lake, until further notice.

Please note that waters of Pigeon Lake in which the cyanobacterial bloom is NOT visible can still be used for recreational purposes, even while this Health Advisory is in place.

If you suspect a problem related to cyanobacteria or if you require further information on health concerns and cyanobacteria, please call Health Link at 811. Additional information is also available online, at www.ahs.ca/bga.



## **GREAT TRIVIA**

From the Internet

'<u>A SHOT OF WHISKEY</u>' - In the old west a .45 cartridge for a six-gun cost 12 cents, so did a glass of whiskey. If a cowhand was low on cash, he would often give the bartender a cartridge in exchange for a drink. This became known as a "shot" of whiskey.

**BUYING THE FARM** - This is synonymous with dying. During WW1 soldiers were given life insurance policies worth \$5,000. This was about the price of an average farm so if you died you "bought the farm" for your survivors.

**IRON CLAD CONTRACT** - This came about from the ironclad ships of the Civil War. It meant something so strong it could not be broken.

**<u>RIFF RAFF</u>** - The Mississippi River was the main way of travelling from north to south. Riverboats carried passengers and freight but they were expensive so most people used rafts. Everything had the right of way over rafts which were considered cheap. The steering oar on the rafts was called a "riff" and this transposed into riff-raff, meaning low class.

COBWEB - The Old English word for "spider" was "cob".

SHIP STATE ROOMS - Travelling by steamboat was considered the height of comfort. Passenger cabins on the boats were not numbered. Instead they were named after states. To this day cabins on ships are called staterooms.

**SLEEP TIGHT**- Early beds were made with a wooden frame. Ropes were tied across the frame in a crisscross pattern. A straw mattress was then put on top of the ropes. Over time the ropes stretched, causing the bed to sag. The owner would then tighten the ropes to get a better night's sleep.

**SHOWBOAT** - These were floating theatres built on a barge that was pushed by a steamboat. These played small towns along the Mississippi River. Unlike the boat shown in the movie "Showboat", these did not have an engine. They were gaudy and attention grabbing which is why we say someone who is being the life of the party is "showboating".

**OVER A BARREL** - In the days before CPR, a drowning victim would be placed face down over a barrel and the barrel would be rolled back and forth in an effort to empty the lungs of water. It was rarely effective. If you are over a barrel, you are in deep trouble.

**BARGE IN** - Heavy freight was moved along the Mississippi in large barges pushed by steamboats. These were hard to control and would sometimes swing into piers or other boats. People would say they "barged in".

**HOGWASH** - Steamboats carried both people and animals. Since pigs smelled so bad they would be washed before being put on board. The mud and other filth that was washed off were considered useless "hog wash".

**CURFEW** - The word "curfew" comes from the French phrase "couvre-feu", which means "cover the fire". It was used to describe the time of blowing out all lamps and candles. It was later adopted into Middle English as "curfeu" which later became the modern "curfew". In the early American colonies homes had no real fireplaces so a fire was built in the center of the room. In order to make sure a fire did not get out of control during the night it was required that, by an agreed upon time, all fires would be covered with a clay pot called a "curfew".

**BARRELS OF OIL** - When the first oil wells were drilled, there was no provision for storing the liquid so they used water barrels. That is why, to this day, we speak of barrels of oil rather than gallons.

HOT OFF THE PRESS - As the paper goes through the rotary printing press friction causes it to heat up. Therefore, if you grab the paper right off the press, it's hot. The expression means to get immediate information.


