Counselling Subsidies – Breton and Area FCSS is pleased to offer Counselling Subsidies.

A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

- Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills;
- Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;
- Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting;
- Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment;
- · Reduce stress with life balance; and/or
- · Learn new skills and behaviors.

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees range from \$15 per session to \$50 per session. The maximum number of sessions available is seven for individuals and nine for couples or families.

Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc.

We know that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. These sessions can be arranged to be in person in the Karunia offices in Leduc, over the phone in your own safe environment or virtually on your computer.

To apply for the subsidy services, application forms are available through the Breton FCSS Office at 4916 50th Avenue or by contacting them at <u>fcss@breton.ca</u> or calling 780-696-3636. ALL APPLICATIONS ARE STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL.

Breton and Area FCSS will be doing the intake of the applications. Counselling services are provided by Karunia Counselling by Registered Psychologists, Registered Provisional Psychologists, Canadian Certified Counsellors and Masters or PhD level student interns under the supervision of a qualified psychologist. All applications will be kept in strict confidence.

Buck Creek Wildfire After-Action Review

Council approved Council approves the expenditure of \$28,352 to complete the Buck Creek Wildfire After-Action Review.

The intent of the After Action Report is to gain an impartial, third-party examination of the response to the Buck Creek Wildfire so that Brazeau County and its partners can identify and understand strengths, as well as areas for improvement. Information gathered will be used to inform future emergency response training, process improvement, recovery documentation, and firefighter strategy.

It is anticipated that the Town of Drayton Valley will contribute 50% to the cost of the review and will be an active participant in the completion of the review. The results will be shared with the Town and the proposal includes final presentations delivered to both Town and County Councils at separate meetings. However, the Town's contribution has not yet been confirmed.

North Saskatchewan Watershed Alliance

Scott Millar and Rosey Radmanovich gave an overview of the non-profit organization's activities and work on watershed planning and management.

Brake Signage in Lodgepole

Council approved the installation of a third sign in Lodgepole asking drivers to avoid the use of engine retarder brakes.

Ring Road Walking Path

Council direct Administration to paint around the bend on the walking path on the Ring Road near Meier Road and to put up two appropriate educational signs.

STRATHCONA COUNTY RCMP -WARNS PUBLIC OF AN ONLINE SCAM

Sherwood Park, Alta. – In August 2023, the Strathcona County Property Crime Unit (PCU) became aware of an online scam targeting people through social media.

In each case, the suspect befriends the victim on social media asking permission to paint or draw photos of them. Afterwards the suspect will offer the victim a various amount of money or promises the victim employment. The suspect will send a fraudulent cheque to the victim and then direct them to deposit the cheque into their bank account. As a gesture, the suspect will tell the victim to keep some of the money for themselves and spend the remainder on gift cards. Lastly, the victim is directed to provide the suspect with the gift card numbers.

The Strathcona County PCU has learned that banks are following up with the victims advising them that these cheques they are being sent are fraudulent. This is a reminder to the public to be cautious when communicating with someone over the internet, especially when an unknown person to you is offering any sort of financial promise or transaction.

SUPPORTS AVAILABLE TO HELP INDIVIDUALS THINKING OF SUICIDE

AHS News, September 10

To mark World Suicide Prevention Day on Sept. 10, Alberta Health Services reminds Albertans to take any mention of suicide seriously, and get help right away if someone you know is in immediate risk of suicide:

- Call 911, a suicide hotline (see telephone numbers below), or the police.
- Stay with the person or ask someone you trust to stay until the crisis has passed.
- Encourage the person to seek professional help.
- Don't argue with the person ("It's not as bad as you think") or challenge the person ("You're not the type to attempt suicide.")
- Tell the person you are there to support. Talk about the situation as openly as possible

It can be hard to know if someone is thinking about suicide but recognizing the risk factors and warning signs is important. People can be more at risk of suicide when they experience barriers accessing social and health services, mental illness, traumatic life events, family violence, or have a diagnosis of a serious physical illness. Use the REACH Pathway to help remember what you can do to support someone who is struggling:

- Recognize when someone is struggling.
- · Engage in conversation and listen.
- Ask about suicidal thoughts and feelings.
- · Connect to support and resources.
- Heal yourself by taking care of your own mental health.

World Suicide Prevention Day was created in 2003 by the International Association for Suicide Prevention (IASP) in partnership with the World Health Organization. Talking about suicide and mental health can be difficult, but it's one of the most important ways to help reduce stigma. Together, we can help prevent suicide by showing understanding and compassion and by encouraging people experiencing mental health challenges to reach out for support.

When talking about suicide, use people-first language (someone with suicidal thoughts vs a suicidal person). Phrases such as death by suicide, died by suicide, or suicide describes what happened and respects family and friends left behind. For anyone who might be struggling, it's important to emphasize that support is available.
