Local father and son duo from Warburg have been destroying cars and racing in the mud for years. Together Chad and Lantz Revne travel all over Alberta, BC & Saskatchewan participating in and running derbies. They travel as far as Armstrong BC and St. Walburg Saskatchewan to participate in this traditional motor sport that brings families and



communities together for smashing, crashing fun.

Chad Reyne (Bad Chad) started his derby career in 1990 at the age of 15. For 30 years he smashed different makes and models of Chevy with great success at the top level in 3 provinces. He even competed at Rexall place in Edmonton

with the Monster Trucks show for 15 years. Chad recently received the Western

Canadian Legends of Destruction award for 30 years of service. He has now stepped aside from smashing cars to work on builds with his son and as a Tech Inspector for demolition derbies across Alberta and BC. Recently, on September long weekend, Chad was the Tech Inspector for the 49th Annual Demolition Derby in Fernie BC.

Lantz Reyne, following in his father's footsteps started his career at only 12. Together, he and his dad build their derby cars and mud racing trucks to compete. This summer alone, Lantz has placed 4 times and won 3rd in Fernie BC. The Fernie Derby



is considered one of the largest derbies around attracting thousands of people each year and raising money for local causes. Lantz will be heading to compete in Armstrong BC on October 8 for one of the last Derbies of the season.



Maybe you remember the days of the Demolition Derby's in Warburg, Thorsby and even Sunnvbrook.... it's wonderful to see this sport is still alive!



Seniors Assisted Transportation Subsidy

Pilot project Sept. 1 to Dec. 31, 2023

The cost of transportation can be a barrier for many rural seniors. Leduc County FCSS provides a subsidy to eligible older adults (65+) who need transportation for medical appointments. Drive Happiness is a non-profit that provides safe, reliable and affordable assisted transportation to low-resource seniors.

Eligibility

- At least 65 years of age
- Resident of Leduc County, Town of Calmar, Town of Thorsby, or Village of Warburg

► Have sufficient mobility to enter and exit vehicles independently

Number of rides

Seniors 65 years to 79 years are eligible for five free round trips for medical appointments.

Seniors 80 years and older are eligible for 10 free round trips for medical, recreational, social or supportive needs.

Memberships

All program participants are required to purchase a Drive Happiness annual membership. Membership fees are determined by Drive Happiness and are based on household income.







- 1. Vulcan, a small town between Calgary and Lethbridge, is famous with Star Trek enthusiasts. Why? Because they truly took their name to heart and built a 31-foot Enterprise replica next to the spaceship-shaped visitors centre. Even the plaque is written in three languages: English, Vulcan, and Klingon!
- 2. Sylvan Lake, a small town and popular lakeside retreat, is also home to an inland lighthouse. It was built to commemorate its 75th birthday in 1988 but was rebuilt in 2015.
- 3. Wolverine, the comic book mutant, is from Alberta. According to Marvel history, Wolverine was born in Cold Lake, Alberta in the 1880s. I wonder if any of them had ever been to Cold Lake...
- 4. The town of St. Paul features a UFO landing pad, just in case Aliens need to stop for fuel on their way to distant galaxies (Okay, we made that part up). But they do have a UFO landing page and a UFO tourist information centre where you'll find "actual" photographs of UFOs, crop circles, and cattle mutilations.
- 5. The town of Mundare has a 42' tall statue of a sausage coil.



Barbecue Cups

Ingredients:

- 1lb lean ground beef cooked
- 3/4 cup barbecue sauce
- 1 can pillsbury grands! flaky layers original biscuits, refriderated
- 3/4 cup cheddar cheese

Instructions:

- 1. In 10-inch nonstick skillet, mix cooked beef and barbecue sauce. Heat over medium-high heat, stirring constantly, until hot.
- 2. Pull each biscuit apart into 2 layers; press each into 4-inch round. place 1 round in each of the 10 greased regular size muffin cups. Firmly press in bottom and up sides, forming 1/4-inch rim. Fill with beef mixture: sprinkle with cheese.
- 3. Base 375 degrees for 13 to 15 minutes or until edges of biscuits are golden brown. Cool 1 minute; remove from pan.

You can substitute chicken instead of beef

Chicken Ranch Wraps

Ingredients:

- 2 cups cooked grilled chicken breasts chopped (seasoned with your favorite spices, see note*)
- 1/4 cup Hidden Valley® Simply Ranch dressing
- 1/2 cup mozzarella Cheese
- 1/4 cup Cilantro minced (optional)
- 48" tortillas

Instructions:

- 1. Lay tortillas on a clean flat surface. Place about 1/2 cup chicken, 1 tablespoon ranch, 2 tablespoons of cheese, and 1 tablespoon of minced cilantro on each tortilla. Fold tightly to form a burrito shape.
- 2. Heat a heavy-duty pan or grill to medium heat. Coat with a light layer or oil or cooking spray and cook wraps for 1-2 minutes on each side or until the tortilla is crispy and golden. Remove from heat, slice in half and serve immediately.

Notes

*For the chicken: You can use cooked rotisserie chicken, leftover chicken, or grilled chicken seasoned with your favorite spices. I like to season my chicken with a tablespoon of fajita seasoning and grill in a hot pan for 5-6 minutes per side or until cooked through.

Cheesy Pepperoni Pizza Sticks

Ingredients:

- 1 Pillsbury pizza crust, tube
- 40 pepperoni slices
- 10 mozzarella cheese sticks

- 2 tbsp butter
- 1/2 tsp garlic powder
- 1/2 tsp dried parsley
- marinara sauce, for dipping (Optional)

Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 450 degrees F.
 Spread pizza dough out on a lightly greased baking sheet. Cut the dough into 10 equal size rectangles.
- Arrange 4 pepperoni slices on each rectangle and top with a mozzarella cheese stick.
- 4. Roll up the pizza dough, enclosing the cheese stick, pinching the seams closed.
- 5. Melt the butter and add the garlic powder and dried parsley. Brush the pizza sticks with the butter.
- 6. Bake for 10 to 12 minutes or until golden brown.
- 7. Enjoy warm with a side of marinara sauce for dipping if desired.

Chicken and Waffle Sliders

- Ingredients:
- 1 cup Cornmeal
- 1 cup All-Purpose Flour
- 1 Tbsp. Baking Powder
- 1 tsp. Salt
- 1 Tbsp. Sugar
- 1 Tbsp. Honey
- 1 1/2 cups Buttermilk
- 4 Tbsp. Butter melted
- 1 Egg
- Instructions:
- 1. Preheat waffle iron and spray with cooking spray if necessary.
- 2. In a small bowl, combine honey, buttermilk, melted butter and egg.
- 3. In a large bowl, combine cornmeal, flour, baking powder, salt and sugar.
- 4. Add the wet ingredients to the dry ingredients and stir until well combined.
- 5. Bake in waffle maker according to manufacturers directions.
- 6. To make chicken and waffle sliders, layer cornbread waffles with fried chicken, bacon, and cheddar cheese.
