



ADVOCATING FOR DUAL CREDIT AND OFF CAMPUS PROGRAMS

Alberta is facing a shortage of skilled trades people, and in response, the Black Gold School Division continues to focus on connecting our high school students with opportunities in support of diverse career pathways.

Our Dual Credit program allows students to earn college/university credits from a postsecondary institution and high school credits from their school by completing college-level coursework all while attending High School. Additionally, students can earn hours and high school credits by enrolling in the Registered Apprenticeship (RAP) courses.

The program offers students with numerous benefits, including cost savings, flexibility, career exploration, and the development of new skills.

"Students report that after taking dual credit courses, they developed the confidence to pursue full time post secondary when they graduate," said Curriculum Manager Terri Reid. "This allows them to pursue more meaningful and rewarding career opportunities."

The Off-Campus Education courses offered at the Black Gold Outreach School include Agriculture and Workplace Safety, Work Experience, the Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP), the Green Certificate Program, and their prerequisites.

"The purpose of the Off-Campus program is to familiarize students with the world of work," said Reid. "Real-life resumes and interviews can help them land a quality job, while customized skill and safety training gives them opportunities to excel at their worksites."

Black Gold Schools received funding approval for an addition to Calmar Secondary School to house a new collegiate school, which will provide students with opportunities to complete their first period apprenticeship training and related work/registered apprenticeship program placements in addition to their high school graduation. Construction on the Calmar Secondary Collegiate School is expected to begin in Spring 2024.

As per the Education Act, school divisions are required to pay the tuition for dual credit courses, which results in the costs of many dual credit programs, including some first period apprenticeship training for trades, exceeding the per-pupil funding received for individual students.

"Dual credit courses often require lower pupil-toteacher ratios in order to provide supervision and hands-on student support," said Superintendent of Schools Bill Romanchuk. "In order to achieve those ratios, school divisions are then required to be more economically stringent in other areas and increase pupil-to-teacher ratios in other classes to balance the books."

After more than seven years of dual credit implementation - with ample evidence of benefits - and a full two years after the Alberta Education Dual Credit Framework commitment, school divisions are waiting to see a consistent, sustainable funding structure. "We continue to deal with unpredictable start-up or pilot funding, which limits our ability to expand dual credit opportunities," said Romanchuk.

"We are working with other school boards through the Alberta School Board Association to address concerns around dual credit and career education," said Board Chair Esther Eckert. "Further, on September 20th we requested MLA assistance in advocating for a sufficient, sustainable and equitable funding structure for dual credit programming to support student pathways to postsecondary education and workplace training."

The Division's Dual Credit program is based on partnerships with Lakeland College, Olds College, Portage College, Northern Lakes College, Southern Alberta Institute of Technology (SAIT) and Alberta Education. For more information, please visit www.blackgold.ca/schools/programs.





OTTAWA, ON – Members of Parliament Blaine Calkins, Gerald Soroka, Damien Kurek, and Senator Pierre-Hugues Boisvenu, hereby issue the following statement:

"Bill C-336, known as Noah's Law, represents a significant piece of legislation designed to bolster the safety of vulnerable Canadians, with a particular emphasis on women and children. This bill aims to accomplish this by introducing critical amendments to both the Criminal Code and the Sex Offender Registry Act

"In response to MP Gerald Soroka's introduction of Bill C-336, MP Blaine Calkins has presented Petition e-4460 in the House of Commons. This petition has garnered substantial support, with nearly 22,000 Canadians fervently urging the Government of Canada to promptly address the deficiencies in the justice system.

"Petition e-4460 specifically calls for the implementation of the following provisions outlined in Bill C-336:

"Mandatory Reporting Requirements: Establish mandatory reporting requirements for convicted sexual offenders whenever they change their place of residence.

"Failure to Comply as an Offense: Specify that the failure to comply with these reporting obligations constitutes an offense, resulting in the issuance of an arrest warrant.

"Dedicated Classification for Offenders: Create a dedicated classification for offenders who have been convicted of sexual assault offenses against children and received sentences exceeding two years or those convicted of two or more violent sexual offenses or offenses involving the abduction of women and/or children.

"The urgency of this proposed legislation cannot be overstated. Canada's justice system necessitates immediate action to address its shortcomings and safeguard the most vulnerable members of our society."



FALL PUMPKIN WORKOUT AND COOLDOWN FOR ALL **FITNESS LEVELS**

The holidays will be here before we know it, and getting more active is one of the best thigs we can do to feel better, stronger, and healthier. The calm but powerful energy that comes from pushing out bodies just a little more will help us tackle whatever stressors the season throws our way.

Have fun, get moving and feel GOURD-geous with this pumpkin workout, followed by a soothing cool down. Whether you do one or both, these activities are a great way to squeeze in extra movements during commercial breaks while watching TV or whenever you have an extra five or 10 minutes to spare.

The Pumpkin Workout

P is for PUSHING your arms overhead 10 times.

U is for UP AND DOWN from your chair five times. Be sure to stay slow and controlled.

M is for MARCHING in place for 30 seconds.

THE PUMPKIN COOLDOWN!

Remember never to stretch cold muscles. This cooldown is also a nice way to finish your walk or workout. Hold each stretch for 7 to 10 seconds, repeating 3 to 4 times.

P is for pressing your palms up overhead with your fingers interlaced, push your palms forward while dropping your chin toward your chest. Gently spread shoulder blades apart as you push palms.

U is for upper back stretch. With fingers interlaced push your palms forward while dropping your chin toward your chest. Gently spread shoulder blades apart as you push palms forward.

M is for making gentle arms circles. Make 10 forward circles followed by 10 backward circles.

P is for pulling a resistant band apart with your arms out in front of you, palms to the ceiling at shoulder-height.

K is for gently hugging your right knee while you're seated. Keep your left foot planted on the ground while you perform a few hip circles. If it feels okay. Switch sides and repeat.

AHS TO REOPEN BRETON MEDICAL CLINIC NEXT MONTH

AHS News Release - October 24, 2023

BRETON – Breton and area residents will once again be able to access medical appointments closer to home when the Breton Medical Clinic reopens on Nov. 7 after being closed in late June.

Set to provide appointments on Tuesdays from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., the clinic will be supported by two physicians — Dr. Ahmed El Furgi and Dr. Youssef Jadi — who will travel to the community from Drayton Valley to deliver family medical care as well as care to those who reside in long-term care at the Breton Health Centre.

"I'm glad that AHS has been successful in attracting the necessary physician supports to reopen this facility, ensuring the people of Breton are able to access healthcare where and when they need it most," says Andrew Boitchenko, MLA for Drayton Valley-Devon.

Patients can begin booking appointments starting Oct. 24 by calling 780-696-3944. Messages for appointments will be responded to on Tuesdays in the order they are received. Patients are asked to bring their Alberta Health Care number and a list of medications to their first appointment.

Alberta Health Services (AHS) will be solely responsible for the operation of the medical clinic when it resumes operation as part of a commitment to supporting access local healthcare in the community. Previously, operational responsibilities for the medical clinic were split between physicians and AHS.

Under AHS operation, the provincewide clinical information system Connect Care will be implemented at the clinic to ensure consistent processes, such as electronic charting, information sharing agreements and reconciliation of old patient records. This streamlined approach, combined with clear expectations for new recruits to support the medical clinic as part of their contract, will support physician recruitment efforts for the area.

"We know Breton residents value having access to a medical clinic in their community, and AHS remains committed to supporting the operation of this facility well into the future," says Janice Stewart, Chief Zone Officer for AHS Central Zone.

TO THE EDITOR:

Warburg Village bylaws and enforcement

For the past 19 years I have been an owner of properties in the Village of Warburg. I have also properties in the Village of Thorsby for 20 years. My experience between the villages has been totally different. I have never had conflict with the Village of Thorsby but I am in constant conflict with the Village of Warburg.

Prior to Covid 19 I was a regular coffee club attendee in Warburg and through conversation with other property owners I found that I was not alone in my issues with the micro-managed affairs of the village. Some situated in the Sarvis Road section South of the railroad tracks vehemently want nothing to do with the Village of Warburg. One went so far as to say he would do no business in the Village of Warburg, although the Welcome to Warburg sign is situated South of Sarvis Road acreages.

It seems the Village of Warburg relishes the fact that they think they are or want to be a bedroom community. The village has in fact lost many businesses and business opportunities in those 19 years.

My welcome to the Village of Warburg was a run in on the street with the Mayor METKE, who demanded "DO YOU HAVE A PERMIT FOR THAT!!! I was hauling a shed from our farm to put on my commercial lot. When the Korean businessman purchased the Corner Gas and Restaurant they were immediately slapped with an UNSITELY PREMISES ORDER with a two week period to remedy. Being new the area, he knew no one to help him and his language barrier made it very difficult. Part of the order was the removal of tall dry grass in the hay field on five acres. No farmer wanted the hay and it cost him \$200 a acre to cut it down.

Two years ago I purchased an acreage in the middle of Warburg, which is surrounded by old forest trees and caraganna hedge. A year ago I had a cargo trailer stolen from the yard and my new tenant has a small dog which insisted on leaving the yard. I put up two gates and a fine wire fencing to try to contain the property. The village has sited me for placing a fence to the front of my acreage contrary to Section 41.2 which says that fences are not

permitted in the front yard of any lot even though there is an exception under Section 41.2.2 which refers to Section 37 which only indicates there is to be no wall, shrub, trees, hedge or any object over the one meter height in a 6 metre triangle at the corner of an intersection.

I sent in my objections to the restrictions, but the Development Officer has a different reading to the bylaw. I pointed out that I have pictures of about 15 properties in residential areas which do not comply with the bylaw. Her comment was that the bylaw was changed and that those properties are 'Grandfathered'.

I've been advised that there is going to be a meeting to amend the fencing bylaw in the Village Of Warburg on the 13 November 2023 at 7:00 pm.
