- · Your local pharmacist





BRAZEAU COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

December 5, 2023 Regular Council Meeting

Prohibition of Wildlife Feeding Bylaw

Council gave all three readings to Bylaw 1167-23, the Prohibition of Wildlife Feeding Bylaw.

The Bylaw forbids the intentional feeding of any wildlife within the hamlets and multi-lot subdivisions of Brazeau County, or to scatter or leave food outside a building or residence or in a park for the purpose of feeding or baiting wild animals.

This bylaw does not prohibit bird feeders that are not accessible to other wildlife. The bylaw does not apply in these situations:

- a. The leaving of food as bait in a trap by a property owner or resident to capture a sick or injured animal inhabiting or habituating their property pursuant to the bylaw
- b. The leaving of food as bait in a trap by a property owner or resident to remove any nuisance species listed under the Pest and Nuisance Control Regulation
- c. The leaving of food as bait by a licensed trapper, a peace officer, or an employee of a pest control agency licensed by the province, in the performance of their duties.

The bylaw also forbids interfering with a peace

officer who is attempting to capture any wildlife in accordance with the bylaw; attempting to remove any seized wild animal from a peace officer; or assisting a wild animal to escape capture.

The County will produce educational material regarding the bylaw and feeding of wildlife, as well as mail outs as needed.



BEWARE OF SCAMS

Be careful who you trust when people call you or show up at your door. Here are some of the newest scams around Alberta reported by RCMP Alberta.

FRAUDULENT PHONE CALLS & REQUESTS

Red Deer, AB - Over the last few months, Red Deer RCMP have received numerous reports from local residents reporting fraudulent phone calls and requests. Reports to police say Red Deer residents are being contacted by scammers, who claim to be from a wide range of businesses and government agencies.

Some of the most common are:

- Police
- CBSA
- STARS Air Ambulance
- Financial institutions and banks
- Employers
- · Other Government organizations
- Fire extinguisher companies

There are many variations of the scam being used. Scammers often tell the victim that they owe money or need to pay for a service, a legal issue, or investment opportunity. The scammer tells the victim that in order to settle the bill the victim needs to purchase a certain amount of gift cards. Once the victim purchases the cards, they are instructed to tell the scammer the numbers listed on the back of the card. Another variation involves the scammer telling victims that they need to go to their nearest bitcoin ATMs and send them bitcoin.

Typically the scammer will tell the victim not to discuss the situation with anyone else, they may even ask to communicate using an encrypted message application such: WhatsApp, Telegram, or Signal.

Fraudulent calls can also come from a phone number that appears legitimate, they do this by using computer or phone applications to change their name and number; this is called 'caller ID spoofing'. 'Caller ID spoofing' is also used in 'grandparent scams' where the fraudster portrays themselves as a friend or family member requesting money so that they can get out of a dire situation.

Red Deer RCMP would like to remind the community that legitimate companies and government agencies will never ask you to settle a debt or pay a bill through the purchase of gift cards or bitcoin.

IMPERSONATING POLICE OFFICERS

Edson RCMP have recently been made aware of a scam involving a group of people physically impersonating police officers.

In the most recent case, an Edson victim was called by a number listed as RCMP. When they answered the phone, the person on the other end of the line stated they were calling from the RCMP and that the victim was going to be arrested due to some outstanding "money laundering" scheme.

At the same time, two people, dressed as police officers, knocked on the door asking if the victim had gotten a call. The two suspects confirmed that the victim would be arrested unless they pay a fee. The victim was instructed to empty their account and purchase gift cards and give the information to the person on the phone. The suspect on the phone said that the money would be given back if it was proven that they were not part of an ongoing investigation.

Alberta RCMP would like to remind the public to always be aware of scammers:

- At no time will an RCMP officer request a fee, gift cards, or otherwise money in exchange of forgoing an arrest.
- If an arrest warrant is issued, the warrant will be executed as specified on the warrant. If a warrant to search a home or seize an account is granted, the warrant will be executed as specified and you are entitled to read the warrant.
- If ever you are in the presence of someone stating they are a police officer and you have doubts, you are allowed to ask for identification. Furthermore, you may call 911 or your local detachment or dispatch number to confirm that the officers before you are who they say they are.


