SPILL SHUTS DOWN LOCAL HIGHWAYS

Information from the Village of Breton Facebook and Media News

A substance spill which occurred last Thursday evening, January 25, forced RCMP to divert traffic on approximately 38 kilometres of affected highway. Hwy 20 from Township Road 470 to Hwy 39 as well as Hwy 39 from Hwy 20 to Hwy 770.

The substance spilled was determined to be VGO (Vacuum Gas Oil). This product is a thick waxy liquid which is apparently non toxic but it is recommended that entry into ditches, sewers and waterways should be prevented. Due to this information, Breton Suds Bucket Car Wash was closed and the Village of Breton Public Works worked hard to close off any drains on the roads so the material that had been spilled wouldn't

get into the Village sewer system.

On Saturday, January 27 a wash station was set up at the Village of Breton Waste Transfer site (5207 - 52 Street) to clean vehicles affected by the sticky substance and appointments were estimated to continue until at least Wednesday. Vehicles were taking an average of one hour but some were taking up to three hours. To book an appointment please text (preferable due to high number of calls) or call 587-842-1271.

Breton Car Wash will reopen January 30 but only to vehicles that do not have VGO on them.

As of Monday night, there was still not an estimated time of reopening for Highway 20 but over half of Highway 39 had been fully cleaned/remediated. A lane of hwy 39 has also been opened with flag/sign holders & a pilot truck escort for safely moving traffic.

The cleanup includes people that are walking the ditches and hand shovelling any remnants of the VGO they are finding. Two environmental firms have been hired to do water testing along the ditches. Thankfully the snow seems to be solidifying the VGO and preventing it from getting into the ground even with the temperatures the last few days. Crews are working 24 hours a day to get everything cleaned up properly

Highway clean up crews will also be removing snow in the Village of Breton by putting it into containment bins, melted and removed by a vac truck. Please call 587-842-1271 if you have any VGO material in your driveway, garage etc and they will work out a way to help you

> remove it. Breton Public works has been working hard on grading and snow removal so if you see them in your area, please move your vehicles.

> The Village of Breton has been doing a wonderful job keeping everyone updated on Facebook and monitoring emails and phone calls. They just ask everyone to be patient and want to thank the community. "All the residents are doing so wonderful with showing compassion and empathy in this event. Great job to you all!".

What a fabulous week of nice weather we have had. The closing of Hwy 39 and Hwy 20 over the weekend caught us by surprise. Just a good reminder to have an emergency kit on hand in case you are unable to travel to get necessities. Thank you to everyone for your patience while this was being taken care of. It shows us how easily our plans can change when there is an emergency.

Here are a few things to keep on hand in case of future situations:

Basic Disaster Supplies Kit

To assemble your kit store items in airtight plastic bags and put your entire disaster supplies kit in one or two easy-to-carry containers such as plastic bins or a duffel bag.

A basic emergency supply kit could include the following recommended items:

- * Water (one gallon per person per day for several days, for drinking and sanitation)
- * Food (at least a several-day supply of nonperishable food)
- * Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert
- * Flashlight
- * First aid kit
- Extra batteries
- * Whistle (to signal for help)
- * Dust mask (to help filter contaminated air)
- * Plastic sheeting and duct tape (to shelter in place)
- * Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties (for personal sanitation)
- * Wrench or pliers (to turn off utilities)
- * Manual can opener (for food)
- * Local maps
- * Cell phone with chargers and a backup battery
- * Additional Emergency Supplies

Consider adding the following items to your emergency supply kit based on your individual needs:

- Soap, hand sanitizer and disinfecting wipes to disinfect surfaces
- * Prescription medications. Organize and protect your prescriptions, over-the-counter drugs, and vitamins to prepare for an emergency.
- Non-prescription medications such as pain relievers, anti-diarrhea medication, antacids or laxatives
- * Prescription eyeglasses and contact lens solution
- Infant formula, bottles, diapers, wipes and diaper rash cream

- * Pet food and extra water for your pet
- * Cash or traveler's checks
- * Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records saved electronically or in a waterproof, portable container
- * Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person
- Complete change of clothing appropriate for your climate and sturdy shoes
- * Fire extinguisher
- * Matches in a waterproof container
- * Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items

- 2.3 the name shall not imply the Division's endorsement of partisan political or ideological positions, nor of commercial products or services.
- 2.4 unless otherwise directed by the Board, naming options shall include suggestions solicited from the community.

Please see Wild Rose School Division "Policy 02 - Appendix C - Naming of Facilities" for the entire policy.

The Board will only consider names that align with these policy guidelines.

AARON PRITCHETT INTERVIEW

Canadian Country music performer Aaron Pritchett doesn't want to be fenced in, put in a little box or pigeon holed and he's coming to Drayton Valley's EPAC Pembina stage to prove it worked for him. I interviewed Aaron by phone on January 24.

"I've always tried to push the boundaries. When I came out with my song called "New Frontier", people in the radio industry were telling me that your music has changed the Canadian country music scene. And people said "Oh, well, you've pushed the envelope and you definitely think outside the box, but it's accepted on radio, so that's pretty cool!" Aaron shared his recipe for success. "I'm going to pick the songs I love and record them the way I want to hear them. I think it's worked out really well."

With 13 Top Ten hits over two decades Pritchett has made a career with winners like "Hold my Beer", "Worth a Shot", "Warm Safe Place", "Better When I Do", and his new single and tour "Liquored Up". Throughout it, Pritchett has earned more than 30 Juno, CCMA, WCMA and BCCMA nominations including multiple wins for Entertainer of the Year, Male Vocalist of the Year and a CCMA SOCAN Songwriter of the Year award.

On Challenges New Country Artists Face

With new artists what we're finding, its very tough for them to come into the industry with something different, we have limitations on what's too Country and what's too Pop, or too Rock feeling Country. You've got to try to have good enough songs and recordings to get on radio. And there's parameters that you have to stay within and if you try to go outside the little box that you're put in, then you're not accepted and your music's not accepted. The lines are blurry.

But I've been very fortunate in my years in being in the industry. I think terrestrial radio looks at my songs, and go, Well, you know what. He didn't have his first number

I hit until he was almost 49 years old. He's been in the industry for almost 30 years and, you know, he's in his 50's now and he's going to be a grandfather, but, you know what, his music is still great! It's not only current, but it's also thinking ahead. This is just enough outside of what he did last time and what radio is doing right now that we want to play it.

Ya, they have been very kind to me: the radio industry and the Country music industry and especially the fans. They are always there and there seems to be new ones all the time. They accept the music that I come out with and I love that.

On the new single and tour, "Liquored Up!"

It's a catchy title! "Liquored Up" is meant to be tongue in cheek. It means, basically, shutting off; I want to shut off and live in my own world for the rest of the night. The song was written by some friends and when I head the demo I thought this really fits who I am and what I do. Obviously, recording with Matt, we are a bit of the party guys too; it fit perfectly!" You've got a lot of country fans in Drayton. I have friends that are from Drayton! They know that country music runs deep there, for sure! I'm excited to get there, play some of my songs and hopefully people get to know me, Matt Lang, and Cory Marks after we do our show.

What an EPAC audience can expect on February 11.

I like to say we start it off with a BANG and end it with a BOOM and BURN HOT in between! That's what I've always done for the audience. They're spending their hard-earned money to come and watch my show and they want to be entertained. My shows are pretty high energy, VERY high energy actually. I've designed a show that's different from any other show I've ever done. Instead of having an opener, I've brought everybody in to do one big show. We do an acoustic set, we play some songs from what got us into country music, and who are heroes with me, Matt and Cory. I'm going to play some of the new songs from the album.

Willie Wonka?

I stole an idea from Willie Wonka! We have 300 vinyl records pressed to sell only on this tour. You'll hear the whole new album and a few extra bonus tracks on there. Within the 300 limited vinyl run there is going to be a Gold Album. So whoever gets the Gold Album, if somebody in Drayton gets the Gold Album, I will fly out to your town and do a home concert for you! Just me and my guitar sitting there singing songs. You buy the Gold Album; that's what you get!

Aaron Pritchett and band, with Matt Lang and Cory Marks will perform at 7:30 PM, Sunday, February 11 at the Eleanor Pickup Performing Arts Centre in downtown Drayton Valley. Tickets are available at the door and www.ticketpro.ca. The interview was edited for length and clarity.


