

Houskeeping subsidy

Provides access to affordable housekeeping services through a partnership with local service providers.

To be eligible for the housekeeping subsidy, you must:

- Be a senior (65+) or an adult with a disability or inability to complete household task.

HELPING COMMUNITIES REDUCE EMISSIONS, ENERGY COSTS

February 1, 2024 Alberta News

New funding will help rural and urban communities across the province become more energy efficient and reduce costs.

With high inflation and energy costs, many Alberta municipalities are looking for ways to improve energy efficiency and save money. However, upgrades and improvements are often expensive or otherwise challenging to put in place.

Using Technology Innovation and Emissions Reduction (TIER) program funding, Alberta is investing \$18 million to help communities hire staff, replace windows, upgrade lights and make practical improvements to arenas, community centres and other buildings. This funding will allow the Municipal Climate Change Action Centre (MCCAC) to build on its suite of programs, helping Alberta municipalities save energy, lower costs and reduce emissions.

This is part of the government's Emissions Reduction and Energy Development Plan, reducing emissions while creating jobs and supporting a strong economy.

In 2022, the MCCAC's Recreation Conservation Program helped complete upgrades at the Max Bell Centre, saving the facility \$7,000 a year while producing 43 fewer tonnes of emissions annually.

Additionally, the Town of Barrhead completed an ice plant replacement for Barrhead Arena, saving more than \$22,800 per year while reducing emissions by 37 per cent compared with the previous system.

The new \$18 million in funding will enable programs to help Alberta's communities access supports for energy conservation, energy management, outreach and engagement, and more, all through the MCCAC. A capacity-building initiative is currently underway, a new Municipal Energy Management Program will launch this spring and a program for energy efficiency upgrades in community buildings is expected to open this summer.

More information on these and other programs will be announced as they launch in the coming months.

PRESERVING CHOICE FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTH

February 1, 2024 Alberta News

Alberta's government is introducing policies to make sure children are supported as they grow into adults to become the people they want to be.

The government is introducing policies across several ministries to preserve the choices children and youth have before potentially making life-altering and often irreversible adult decisions involving the alteration of their biological sex while also ensuring women and girls have the opportunity to participate safely and meaningfully in sport. In addition, the government will improve access to health services for Alberta's transgender community and social supports for children identifying as transgender and their families.

Supports for transgender adults

Health care supports for transgender Albertans are critically important, which is why the government is working to bring medical professionals who specialize in pre- and post-operative transgender care for adults to Alberta. Having this expertise in the province will ensure transitioning Albertans have improved access to an Alberta-based medical expert to assist them with their unique and complex medical needs without having to travel to Quebec, which is currently the practice.

In addition, Alberta Health will develop a private registry of medical professionals who specialize in this field to make it easier for transgender Albertans to access needed medical treatment and care.

Child-and youth-centred policies

In the coming months, Alberta's government will implement the following health policies related to children identifying as transgender:

- All gender reassignment surgeries for minors aged 17 and under will be prohibited.
- The use of puberty blockers and hormone therapies for the purpose of gender reassignment or affirmation will not be permitted for children aged 15 and under, except for those who have already commenced treatment.
- Mature teens, aged 16 and 17, may only choose to commence puberty blockers and hormone therapies for gender reassignment and affirmation purposes with parental, physician and psychologist approval.

As it relates to Alberta's education system, the following reforms will be implemented:

 Parents must be notified and opt in to any instance when a teacher provides formal instruction on subject matter involving gender identity, sexual orientation or human sexuality.

- All third-party resource materials or presentations related to gender identity, sexual orientation or human sexuality available in Alberta classrooms must be preapproved by the Ministry of Education to ensure they are age-appropriate.
- Parents must consent for their child aged 15 and under to alter their name or pronouns used by school teachers, administration and other educational staff.
- Parents must be notified for their child aged 16 or 17 to alter their name or pronouns used by school teachers, administration and other educational staff.

Alberta's government is also developing a counselling pilot project to help youth identifying as transgender and their families work through often difficult and complex issues and discussions.

Women, girls and transgender athletes

Finally, as it relates to women, girls and transgender female athletes, Alberta's government will work with sporting organizations in the province to ensure biologically born female athletes are able to compete in a biological female-only division without having to compete against transgender female athletes while also

expanding co-ed or other gender-neutral divisions for athletic competitions to ensure that transgender athletes are able to meaningfully participate in the sport of their choice.

EARLIER BENEFIT PAYMENT DATES

January 26, 2024 Alberta News

Albertans who rely on the Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped (AISH) and Income Support programs will now receive their payment four business days prior to the first of the month.

This change, based on feedback from Albertans who receive AISH and Income Support payments, will give individuals more time to pay their bills and help prevent unnecessary late charges. The new payment date will begin with the March 2024 payment cycle.

"We know how important it is to alleviate financial pressures for individuals who rely on these benefits. This move aims to provide people with additional time to pay rent, manage their financial obligations and avoid incurring any unnecessary late charges." Jason Nixon, Minister of Seniors, Community and Social Services

All clients will receive notice to update any automatic bill payments when they receive their February 2024 direct deposit slip/cheque. This ensures that they will have the time necessary to change any automatic payments from their accounts. Clients can also find the full payment date schedule online so they can plan accordingly.

"I am pleased that the Government of Alberta has listened to Albertans who receive AISH or Income Support by changing the benefit payment date. Since 2020, payments on the first of the month created financial challenges for many Albertans. Implementing this change will greatly assist people in meeting their financial obligations." JOSH AND JESS TUBING

My kids were the kind of kids that believed anything could be done, and they would try just about anything. After all, I have said for years that you are only as limited as your imagination. I remember coming home one day and seeing heads on the other side of the house roof as I looked up. It turns out that some of the kids were using the roof as a platform to jump onto the trampoline from. They could not understand why I was so firm telling them that they could not do that again. Nor could they double bounce the neighbour kid like that anymore. My heart went in my mouth when I saw the little neighbour boy falling back through the clouds. Sure I am exaggerating, but not by that much. Twenty-five feet up can sure seem like that high.

There wasn't a season that I can think of which never brought its challenges. One particular spring, after a huge dump of snow, the sun was out as bright and warm as a summer day. The yard had become a swimming pool of small icebergs and unstable land, a pirate's delight I suppose. If we never had company over I would have been in the yard helping to navigate or build a ship of some kind. I had two or three huge tubes blown up that were now floating in the yard. These were multipurpose tubes apparently because they were the tubes that we had to go downhill in the winter only a month before. There were ropes tied to the tubes so that we could pull them back up the hill, at times by the snowmobile. That was so much fun, but that is another story.

The kids had been told to play nice and to stay dry. Parents can say the strangest things can't they. There are ponds of water all over the yard, and you let your kids go out in their rubber boots and basically challenge them to stay dry. Like that's going to work!

During a Sunday afternoon visit with some friends in our living room, Josh, who was ten, came in a few times with the same request. He wanted permission for him and his seven year old sister, Jess, to float on the tubes. There is no harm in that I thought, but I made it very clear that they are to stay in the yard and that he is to watch his younger sister. Before I had finished the sentence he was off and you could hear the excitement in his voice as he bounded around the corner to their private lake in the backyard. We all watched them for a while from the back deck. They were having so much fun. After about a half an hour had passed, all of that was going to change.

A few houses up from our yard was a drainage spillway which allowed all of the excess water an avenue of escape. It plummeted down about ten feet through an iron gate and onto the large shards of ice pointing toward the sunny sky. A couple hundred yards up from this was the main road and a large culvert that ran under the road.

The water was coming through this culvert like a white water river in the mountains.

Joel had apparently heard the screams and had gone to investigate what was going on. He ran back to the house and said that Jess was stuck in the ice, and then he turned and ran back. Needless to say I was out of there in no time. I grabbed some ropes at the side of the house and splashing through the water and ice in the backyard, where they were supposed to be, I followed the yelling and came to the rushing waters at the end of the alley. There in the middle, sitting precariously on this tire tube, was my little five year old girl. "It's ok Jess, daddy's here". The only thing that stopped her from going over into the iron grate and the waterfall was the eight feet of ice that was slowly breaking up. I told her not to move, realizing that if she fell off into this torrent that she would be swept under the ice and held under the ice with great pressure against this grate.

I also knew that time was of the essence and she was too far out to reach. There was a rope tied to her tube but if she were to try to manipulate this she could lose her balance and fall in or flip the tube. The only thing that I could think of was to throw her a rope. "Now hold it tight and try not to move to your left or to your right. Daddy's going to pull you closer so you can get out. You are going to be alright". I prayed and began to pull her. The tube was being pressured by the incredible force and I knew I had to pull harder. I prayed that she would not go under and I also knew that if she did that I would be going in after her. By this time the whole family and some neighbours were watching. I pulled again and she came within grabbing distance and that is what I did. We all had a hugging time as the reality of what could have been came to life. I still get a strange sensation thinking about how all of this could have unfolded.


