BATTERY RECYCLING IN THORSBY

Did you know that batteries are one of the most dangerous items to leave in a landfill. The thin metal exterior of a battery will decompose within 100 years, exposing the heavy metals inside, which will never decompose and are toxic to the environment. Fortunately, both single-use and reusable batteries can be recycled easily.

Thanks to local resident Pearl Elson and the Town of Thorsby, we now have a place to dispose of our batteries locally. On February 7, the battery recycle boxes arrived and we now have two collection sites. One is located at the Town of Thorsby Office and the other at the Arctic Spas Recreation Complex.

Like many of us, Pearl Elson had lots of small batteries in her home and driving all the way into Leduc to recycle them was a burden. She talked with friends and family about what they did with their batteries and it seemed as if everyone just threw them in the garbage. She wanted to make sure that there was a place close to home that would be easier for everyone to recycle their batteries. This gave her the drive to talk to council.

Pearl first approached the Town of Thorsby Council and Administration on December 12 proposing that the Town

become a collection site for recycled small batteries. She pursued her initiative and also offered to transport the batteries from Thorsby to a safe recycling site in Leduc. Thanks to Pearl's perseverance and the Town of Thorsby's partnership for making a positive impact on our environment.

Please consider recycling your batteries. One thing to

note is both ends of the batteries must be taped. Electrical tape is preferred but any tape should work. Not taping the ends could result in a fire.

Car batteries and lawnmower batteries can also be dropped off at Thorsby Public Works. Please place them outside the Public Works Office door at 4836 - 49 Street.

- · act fast because it's urgent or a time-sensitive offer

Did you know that you can be victimized more than once by fraudsters? Scammers can continue to target you with promises to recover lost funds. Never send money to anyone unless you are sure it's legitimate.






THE TOPS 10 WAYS TO GET A GOOD NIGHT'S SLEEP

STURLING: IT'S THE EVOLUTION OF CURLING FOR ALL

25 years ago in Didsbury, AB, Brian Dingman and myself co-invented the two-person team sport of curling, which we initially dubbed "Stick" curling. Brian who just loved the sport of curling experienced a health problem which limited his mobility to the use of a cane and was no longer able to chase or sweep rocks up & down the ice.

He would come to the rink and watch fellow curlers participate and wished there was some way to play the game he so dearly loved. For the fun and love of the game Brian & I decided to throw a few rocks against one another for old times sake.

Delivering the rocks went well for Brian; the struggle was to get to the other end of the rink. After a few ends; a couple of friends saw what we were doing and joined us. Thus Brian did not have to travel up and down the ice. This is why and how the 2-person team sport of curling evolved. Oh by the way we teamed up to win the first AB 2-person championship in 2004. The sport later transformed into "Sturling" with the addition of Garry Sherman to the team.

The innovation stemmed from a realization that players using the stick could compete on equal footing with traditional slide curlers, eliminating the need for divisive rules. Sturling is a fusion of 'S" for stick or slide delivery, 'T' for two-person team, & 'URLING,' comes from the original word. Sturling embraces a wide range of participants, accommodating those with disabilities, physical limitations, or simply advanced age. The game allows for both stick and slide deliveries, fostering an environment where individuals can play together regardless of their preferred technique. The benefits of Sturling are numerous, making it a game-changer in the curling community. You might say that it is indeed the only thing that ever has.

Key Advantages of Sturling:

Sturling Involves More People: By offering a choice of stick or slide delivery, Sturling increases participation, leading to larger bonspiels and more extensive leagues without sacrificing a competitive balance. Sturling has provided myself and others the oppertunity to competed against the likes of the Chinese Olympic teams, members of the Swiss national team, and curlers like Kaitylin Laws, Chelisey Carrie, John Morris, & Kerick Martin.

Sturling Provides Continuous Action: Sturling's format minimizes downtime, keeping players engaged and delivering 18 rocks per game in less than an hour, Removes Gender or Age Restrictions: Sturling is inclusive, allowing men and women of all ages to compete on an equal footing, creating a superior social


atmosphere.

Sturling Enhances Bonspiels: Sturling's one-day format improves the efficiency of bonspiels, attracting more participants and diversifys the club's activities.

For example: a "32" team event; can be hosted on 8 sheets of ice, guaranteeing each team 3 games; resulting in 48 games being played in 7 hours using the progressive draw format."

Sturling Beyond Borders: We corresponded with the WCF in hopes of getting them to try the 2-person team sport of curling; their view was that curling was traditionally a 4-person team sport and would not change; It was not until 10 years after we invented the 2-person team sport that they hosted the first Worlds Mixed doubles. Although the rules may be a little different, the 2-person game of curling is now being played world wide. The WCF is also about to host a 2-person mixed doubles wheelchair event in Richmond, BC from Mar 4 to 12. Both of the Alberta and British Columbia Seniors 55+ organizations have adopted Sturling into their winter games:

SHED LIGHT ON HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN ALBERTA

Human trafficking is one of the fastest-growing crimes in Canada. Many of us mistakenly assume that human trafficking isn't something that happens in rural Alberta, but the truth is, from 2011-2021, the number of police reported cases of human trafficking rose from 2 to 38, and 93% of reported victims are Canadians who are trafficked domestically. A significant number of these cases go unreported. It is a crime that we, as a community, must become more aware of.

Human trafficking involves recruiting, transporting, harbouring, or receiving people through force, coercion, or deception to exploit them. They are sent through trafficking networks within Canada and internationally.

This crime can impact any member of our community, including women, men, trans and non-binary individuals, and children. While the majority of the victims of human trafficking are female, 1 in 4 are male.

In Alberta, there is a notable push to combat human trafficking through awareness campaigns and the collaboration of the government, non-profit agencies, and First Nations.

By understanding human trafficking, we can prevent any more of our neighbours from being victims of this horrible crime.

Understanding Human Trafficking

Human trafficking is a global problem, including in Alberta, that takes many forms, including sexual exploitation, sex trafficking, forced labour, slavery, and forced marriage.

Trafficking can occur in industries such as agriculture, construction, manufacturing, and domestic work. Victims often have to work long hours for little or no pay as they or their families are threatened.

By educating the public and those in positions of authority, we can all work together to combat human trafficking and support its victims. Through the provided knowledge, we can recognize the signs of trafficking, protect survivors, and hold traffickers accountable.

Types of Human Trafficking

Sex Trafficking

There are different types of sex trafficking, including sexual exploitation and forced marriage. Sexual exploitation involves manipulating someone into engaging in commercial sex acts, while forced marriage involves the exploitation of individuals through marriage without their consent.

Often, victims of sex trafficking are forced to:

- provide sexual services
- work in massage parlours
- work in escort agencies or the adult entertainment industry

Labour Trafficking

Victims of labour trafficking are forced into providing drastically low or unpaid labour in various sectors, often hidden behind legitimate industries. They are caught in this situation through force, fraud, or coercion.

This can also include domestic servitude, where they are made to work as housekeepers or childcare providers with little to no contact with the outside world.

Organ trafficking is another concern where individuals are forced to give up their organs and other parts of their body.

Recruitment Methods Employed by Traffickers

Human traffickers are expert manipulators who exploit the vulnerabilities of their victims through a variety of recruitment tactics, in particular, grooming.

Grooming tactics are manipulative strategies employed by traffickers to establish trust, control, and dependency over their victims. These tactics are a gradual process. Understanding grooming tactics is crucial for recognizing potential red flags and preventing human trafficking. Here's a closer look at some common grooming tactics:

- 1. Building trust and friendship
- Creating dependency through financial assistance or isolation
- 3. Exploiting victim's vulnerabilities
- 4. Offering false promises and future plans
- 5. Introducing substances and creating dependencies
- 6. Coercion and threats
- 7. Normalizing exploitative behaviours

False job offers are another common ploy used to lure in victims. Traffickers may pose as employers, offering promising positions with attractive benefits. These deceptive job offers often target those who are new to the country, struggling with unemployment or seeking a better life, making them susceptible to traffickers' tactics.

Exploiting debts are also used by traffickers. The victims are forced into labour to repay a debt they couldn't repay otherwise.

Human Trafficking in Alberta

Like any other part of the world, there are difficulties addressing human trafficking and assisting vulnerable communities specific to Alberta.

Victims of human trafficking come from diverse backgrounds and age groups. An estimated 24% of trafficking victims are minors, with homeless youth being particularly vulnerable.

However, certain demographics are more vulnerable to human trafficking; for example, Indigenous people make up over 50% of trafficking victims in Canada. Immigrants and newcomers to Canada are also most likely to become victims of human trafficking.

The Government of Alberta is implementing the 9-point Action Plan to Combat Human Trafficking to protect atrisk individuals from being trafficked in Alberta. They are also empowering survivors of trafficking and providing new ways to deal with traffickers. The Protecting Survivors of Human Trafficking Act was enacted on May 12, 2020. This act includes new measures to help address human trafficking and protect survivors.

The Human Trafficking Task Force was also created to find ways to protect and empower survivors of human trafficking. There are human trafficking units assembled across Alberta, including within the RCMP and through ALERT.

Community organizations and front-line services are also active in preventing the trafficking of persons and supporting those who have escaped.

There are efforts at all levels in Alberta to prevent human trafficking and to support victims. By understanding human trafficking in Alberta, we, too, can help prevent this awful crime.

If you or someone you know is the victim of human trafficking, help is available. There are resources for those who are looking to escape trafficking and those who are experiencing long-term physical and psychological impacts.




