# VILLAGE WASTE TRANSFER SITE NOT RE-OPENING

Recently the Village of Breton announced that we will not be reopening the waste transfer site within the Village and the residents now have cards that will allow them to access the waste transfer site 5km west of the Village on Highway 616. Since the county waste transfer site does not accept grass clippings and such The Village has arranged with GFL Environmental to provide compost bins. These will be emptied on a biweekly basis and will be able to have yard waste (branches, leaves, grass clippings, etc) disposed of in them.

Some residents have concerns about why/how this decision was made.

The fire bans and extreme dryness in the area is one of the major factors that initiated this change. The cost of the Village having to appropriately dispose of the yard waste in mass is far too large for a municipality of this size and would result in having to increase taxes. The method that had been being used was to burn it. And this "burn pile" that was burnt in February historically, resulted in a significant fire at our waste transfer site last May. Fire Chief Mark Raines was on site during this fire and his investigation deemed this was the cause. Having this risk within the Village, had the weather conditions that day been accompanied with a westerly wind the probability of large losses in our Village would have been high. In previous years, Fire Chief Raines strongly advised the Village to develop an alternative plan to the "burn pile" for the safety of the Village in the event of a fire, but previous administration and council chose not to do that at the time. Unfortunately, Chief Raines's concerns became reality last May which caused for action from administration and Council. Burying the waste was also considered. However, with the location of the ravine and the height of the water table in this area it would not be permitted (as per Alberta Environment). Administration has been researching solutions since the fire last May. We explored the cost of an incinerator and a chipper. However, these routes would also require additional equipment, manpower and expensive environmental precautions to be implemented. The purchase of the equipment alone was over \$200,000.00. This was not a feasible option. Multiple municipalities, of varying size, that use the organics bin were visited and they each stated it was an effective alternative for their municipalities so with that input we did not see why it wouldn't be for our Village as well.







**Community Volunteer Income Tax Program – FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION** - For Low Income Persons, Families, seniors and students. Although this is something that most of us would like to avoid thinking about and doing, I am afraid that this is unavoidable. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. The focus of the Community Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. This includes seniors, families, and students. If your income is approximately in one of the following categories, you may gualify for assistance. 1 person - \$35,000 / Couple - \$45,000 / Family \$52,500

We are not able to complete returns with income from the following sources: *Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding* \$1,000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information, and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between 8:30 - 4pm. Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run from March 1 – April 30, 2024

From the correspondence file; from the Breton Parents Association concerning the by-law regarding parking at the high school due to drinking being done by people not attending school.

Council voted to inform the Parent's association that this problem was the responsibility of the R.C.M.P. and the Village could not pass a Bylaw prohibiting selective parking on a public street.

By-law No. 473 was given both second and third readings.

The Secretary-Treasurer presented the Surveyor's Certification of Breton Civic Centre and informed council that both Steve Shaw and Adam Eckert feel that the survey is incorrect. The Secretary-Treasurer will check with Canadian Engineering regarding the matter.

Covenant The Breton Church on Lot B Block 17 Plan No. 782-1675 has been charged with \$7,104 frontage as September 9, 1980 per meeting. The water and sewer mains do not extend the full length of the property and therefore the total amount of frontage should not be charged at this time. The Secretary will have the total costs of highway crossing etc., ready for the next meeting.

Mr. Landgraf had inquired that if the rink supervisor would be using the school

snowblower the Village would have to contact Mrs. Lansdell to make arrangements. Council was informed that as per School Board policy, the snowblower should not be used. It was further felt that the students could clear the ice during the day and hence an ice scraper and shovel should be sufficient.

Other Village business dealt with at the same meeting; Council voted that Sherry Bogart be hired as Skating Rink Supervisor and that lights be installed at the rink.



# VILLAGE WASTE TRANSFER SITE NOT RE-OPENING

Continued from Front Page

Another concern has been illegal dumping. The dump was closed for a significant time period last year due to the fire, as well as closed this past winter. The concern of waste being dumped in the alleys or in rural ditches have not yet happened. If this does come to fruition, then the Village and County will be working together to remedy that.

An outside factor that also had to be considered in this decision was the pressure from the Provincial government on small municipalities to develop intermunicipal framework agreements with neighboring municipalities, thereby eliminating duplicate services. The County waste transfer station is 5km from the Village of Breton and in the eyes of the provincial government this is considered a duplicate service due to the proximity. In the process of developing an alternative solution, this is why we developed a partnership with the County of Brazeau for use of their waste transfer site.

Naturally residents are concerned about taxes increasing for this service. That will not be the case. We agree that people are struggling, and our council is not immune to the economic climate being faced. All of council are also taxpayers within this Village, as are some staff, so they are not willing to introduce items that are going to cause additional hardship to Breton taxpayers, them included. By being able to introduce this alternative for yard waste at no additional charge to taxpayers, with no need of taxpayers having to transport it anywhere, and eliminating risk to our Village made the most sense to our Council.

If after reading the background of this decision any residents have concerns we strongly urge you to attend the next Council meeting. It happens on <u>April 10th at</u> <u>7pm at the municipal office</u>. We invite you to consider attending to voice your concerns personally to Council. If you wish to do so, please email <u>admin@breton.ca</u> to have the delegate form sent to you to complete or feel free to drop into the office to complete one.

# OLIVER TWIST REVIEW

*"Oliver Twist"* was a delight, a classic, a treat, and a success. The box office, the audience's laughter and tense silences, and heartfelt applause were evidence of its high accomplishment. Miss Joanne's deft direction hit all the right notes, landed all the right steps. It was comedy, drama, pathos, tragedy and social commentary. It was Dickens in community amateur musical theatre form. It had five performances March 21-24 on the Pembina stage of Eleanor Pickup Arts Centre.

But don't equate amateur with untalented and uncommitted, or worse, label community theatre as just vanity. In conversation with the principal actors treading EPAC's blonde boards, I heard a common commitment to the art of musical theatre and supporting fellow actors. Andrew Farrow, in playing Fagin, appreciated Steve Goodman's actor's work ethic and commitment to playing Bill Sykes. "He knows his character... an actor who cares about his part." Goodman responded, "You have to. You take the character and pour your heart and soul into it. Take Fagin: such a lively characterization! Psychotic in a way!" Goodman continued, "Every moment I'm alone, I'm playing Bill Sykes. I'm going over my lines in character. He's not a nice guy, assaults women. Trying to embody that is tough for me because that's not my personality." Farrow has also worked to know Fagin. "I started reading on Fagin - he's compared to King Lear, the mastermind on the throne. Throughout the play are moments of manipulation. In the end, he will always choose his own skin. Yet, there are people that Fagin cares very deeply about." Jack Dawkins the Artful Dodger is one; Nancy is another.

Morgan Holden played Dodger as a lovable scamp and Riley Neveu proved an impressively talented Oliver Twist, Jack's young protege. Their onstage and offstage relationship appeared similar. Riley explained that when Oliver first meets Dodger in a park he thinks, *"Who the heck is this guy to just come up and talk to me. But when he takes me to Fagin, I need him as a friend."* Dodger agrees, *"Dodger just sees Oliver as the next kid he can steal from. Then Oliver asked too many (good) questions and the Dodger realizes Oliver could become a thief! Over the course of the play he gets fond of Oliver."* 

Fagin needs Dodger to tutor his young Gang of Thieves, but is protective of Nancy, Bill Sykes' woman, played by Kailey Hogan. Tyanne Wirsig as Bet, Nancy's friend, liked how "out there" Nancy's character is, as embodied by Hogan. "Nancy's going through some hard stuff, but she doesn't let that get her down. It's something all of us could use. I like how she does the right thing, the admirable thing, in the end." Hogan admires Tyanne's characterization of Bet. "She is always there for me when Bill Sykes takes his anger out on me. She is the good person. Nancy is always getting beat around and pushed round and can be kind of silly. Tyanne plays Bet as more serious. The, "I'll be there for you." type. Bet is someone that keeps Nancy going. It's nice." Tyanne replies "We like to say sidekick!" Not surprising: they've danced, sang and acted together since they were 9 and 8! Both want to keep musical theatre in their life as best they can.

"Oliver Twist" started with Aurora's Grade 3/4 choir performing as the Orphan Boys. The enthusiastic, high energy rendition of "Food Glorious Food" and "Oliver" were wonderfully sung, energetically choreographed and precisely maneuvered. Music teacher Heather Karlstrom had her choir practiced, confident and clearly there to do their best. Triple threats were in abundance as twenty boys and girls sang, danced and acted the part of Victorian workhouse orphans. As Mr. Bumble (Ken Henley) and Mrs. Corney (Heather Nickel) then served them their workhouse meal of "an unlimited supply of water" and "small quantities of oatmeal"-gruel, Oliver rebels. His request of, "Please, sir, I want some more." is cause for him to be sold away. A chain of events begins, leading to violence, murder and a Dickens-esque coincidence that leads to Oliver's happy reunification with family. For Oliver, a complete change of circumstance - for Fagin, his Gang and the Orphans, not so much.

A capable and colourfully costumed chorus supported the unfolding narrative with impressively performed familiar songs. Interspersed were scenes of Mr. Bumble and Mrs. Corney's middle class hypocrisy towards the orphans in their care and their marital regrets. Ken Henley and Heather Nickle were both comic and tragic as the bickering, grasping pair as they blamed their lessers for their lot. Much of Dickens' social commentary on England's Poor Law System remained in the narrative and lyrics.

Darcy Mulroy's versatile, mobile set turned the Pembina stage into: Victorian Workhouse, middle class parlour, mortuary, slum pub, park, London street to London Bridge. Corey Houle manned the EPAC light and sound boards and enhanced the mood and atmosphere of every scene.

Shakespeare wrote, "Our revels now are ended. These are our actors...we are such stuff as dreams are made on." Our actors, our actresses, their parents, spouses, production team members, light and sound specialists, venue volunteers, and community sponsors collaborated over months to bring this "revel", and "such stuff" to the Pembina Stage. Our community responded, attended, appreciated and applauded. Brava! Bravo! And now the company rests, until the curtain calls again.



- · Credit card interest rate reduction schemes.


