Our Community without Volunteers

Why does FCSS promote volunteerism so much and really what difference do volunteers make to our community? Well, you may think that we could survive without volunteers and we could, but our community would look very different. Here are some of the ways our community would look different without the efforts of all our great volunteers.

- No Volunteer Fire Department to respond to your house / barn fire. - This was very apparent last year with the wildfires in the area.
- No hot lunch program at your child's school
- The soccer, baseball and football fields, along with the hockey rinks becoming empty without coaches, managers and executives to run the program.
- The activities, sports teams, agencies that are receive funding received from the events coordinated by the Breton Agricultural Society members. As well as the opportunity to have a Community Garden available.
- The RV Park / Campground and skating rink closed

without the Volunteer help of our ELKS.

- Our youth not developing leadership skills through Scouts and 4H and Breton Youth Centre Volunteers.
- The history of our community lost without the Volunteers of the Breton Historical Society keeping it alive.
- The quality of life for those at the Breton Extended care lowered without Volunteer help at meal time and entertainment.
- Children that do not learn to swim, without the Volunteer work of the West End Pool Society.
- The operation of the Food Bank, youth clubs and spiritual support without Volunteers from the churches.
- Preschool children not having the opportunity for social development without Playschool programs.
- Christmas time not being as festive for the families that receive food hampers and gifts for the children from Christmas Wishes.
- Rural residents not feeling as safe without a Rural Crime Watch Program.
- School being only about academics without the support of Parent Advisory Councils assisting with extracurricular activities.
- Parks, playgrounds and community activities not being supported without the work of the Royal Purple ladies.
- Beautiful flowers to enjoy throughout the summer due to the work of the Volunteers with the Flower Club.
- Our Seniors not being active and less socializing, without groups such as the Golden Age Club
- Local Community Halls not being operational
- The work done by your municipal elected officials.
- Community programs such as Story time at the library not being able to be offered.
- The Volunteer work of your friends and neighbors who lend a helping hand with errands, childcare and support.

Community Volunteer Income Tax Program - FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION - For Low Income Persons, Families, seniors and students. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. If you did not file a tax return in 2023 you may not be receiving benefits from the government that you are eligible for. The focus of the Community

Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. This includes seniors, families, and students. If your income was approximately in one of the following categories, you may qualify for assistance.

1 person - \$35,000 / Couple - \$45,000 / Family - \$52,500

We are not able to complete returns with income from the following sources: *Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding \$1,000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons*

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information, and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between 8:30 - 4pm. Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run until April 30

We require the following information to complete your return: *Personal Information (Social Insurance Number, Birth date, Marital Status, Address) / Dependent's information - spouse/ children's names, birth dates. / All "T" Slips (T4's, T4A, OAS etc.) / All Forms, Schedules, and Labels you have received from Revenue Canada. / Receipts for any expenses such as medical, moving, tuition, sporting activities. Printouts from your pharmacist are available for those with numerous prescriptions.*

"Yoga for Wellness" Will continue for the month of May, 10:00 - 11:00 am, Breton Community Center

Gentle flow yoga to help strengthen and relax the body and the mind. Pose sequences, meditation and breath work also promotes flexibility, balance, as well as, mind and body wellness. Adults of all ages are welcome; however, class content was developed with age 55 plus in mind. Instructed by June Knobel, Certified Yoga Teacher with, Yoga Association of Alberta. \$2 drop in fee

The Adult Exercise Program - This class runs from 9:30 - 10:30 am on Friday mornings. Equipment is provided. This class will focus on toning, balance, increased mobility, strength gains, and increased flexibility. Participants will be able to either do the exercise standing or sitting, which ever their ability will allow. This program is facilitated by Cassie Kreil a certified instructor. Participants will be asked to pay a small fee of \$2/class. This is a drop-in group.

Busing to Aquacise or Walmart in Drayton Valley - Monday Mornings- Together with Warburg FCSS the bus will arrive in Breton at 9:15 to head to the Drayton Valley Gentle Aquacise class. Returning at 11:30. Purchase a 5 ride Bus pass for (\$36) or 10(\$72) bus pass from the Village of Breton office. Register with Shauna the Thursday prior to the Monday class to save your seat on the bus. If you register with the Active 55 program (at the pool) and live in Brazeau County (including the Village of Breton) there is no cost for the Aqua Size class. If you do not qualify for Active 55 the cost for the aquacise class is \$7.50 or a 10 card pass for \$67.50. We must have at least 8 riders to make a trip. The bus will also make a stop at Walmart for those that would like to shop for 1 hr.

2024 FINAL BUDGET



Brazeau County Passes 2024 Final Budget

submitted by BRAZEAU COUNTY, April 9, 2024

On April 5, Brazeau County Council passed its final budget for 2024, with a focus on core services and ratepayer relief.

The budget maintains the years-long freeze on municipal taxes. Fees, which were limited to zero or to minimal levels in previous years, are not set to increase.

The budget also includes \$14 million in capital investment in roads, equipment replacement, and other infrastructure, and accounts for a 30% incentive on residential taxes that are paid on time. It also maintains the 25% decrease in municipal taxes for properties for the small business sub-class.

"We as a Council are always aware that tax dollars are not our dollars, so we take as few as we can to provide services to residents," says Reeve Bart Guyon. "And we know that keeping taxes low is part of what makes Brazeau County so attractive as a place to live, work, and do business."

Infrastructure investments and other initiatives include:

- 27.2 km of newly budgeted improvements to existing roads
- 16.8 km of improvements to roads carried over from the 2023 budget
- Investment in solar power installation at the Cynthia SAS water treatment plant
- Relocation of a portion of the walking path on the ring road near Drayton Valley
- A new Fire services Command Vehicle for Drayton Valley/Brazeau County Fire Services • A new playground at Rocky Rapids Community Hall
- A second \$1,000 ASB bursary
- A modernized radio system to allow Fire Services to use the same communication system as the RCMP and other emergency responders (Year 2 of a 5 year commitment)

Once finalized, the budget will be available at www.brazeau.ab.ca, and information on taxes, including the incentive and reduced tax rate, will be published online and in the May/June issue of the Brazeau County News.

To the Editor:

I read in the Breton Booster (March 27) that the Village of Breton is not reopening its waste transfer site, but instead is taking Village waste to the County site. This raises some interesting questions, not so much with Village issues, but the County of Brazeau.

Is there in fact a legal, binding agreement for the County to receive Village waste? This writer does not recall any motion that the County has such an agreement. How might this play into liability?

Another item that might be of public interest has to do with year-round hazardous waste collection. The current program of once a year seems outdated and problematic for those who have to store them until disposal is available. One excuse coming my way is that staff availability is a problem. It doesn't seem to be a concern to send any number of staff to a conference for several days without issue, but we cannot have a frequent special waste pickup? There is no evidence that conference attendance has any value to the county, but the number of people that would and do benefit from special waste disposal is numerous.

Additionally, several million is spent on roads (paving) that benefit very few, but we cannot have frequent hazardous waste pickup?

On another issue, the County accepted a substitute road around a gravel extraction site instead of requiring a replacement of the original county road. The substitute road in question is longer, probably of lesser quality, and apparently subject to flooding.
