A BLAST FROM BRETON'S PAST

Last week community member Roy Young stopped by the museum with an interesting photograph from yester year. It was a group photograph he had taken in February 1977. The museum has posted the photograph and identity of the individuals on Facebook, but understands not all people in the community engage in

social media and would enjoy seeing the photograph in the Breton Booster.

Unlike today, 47 years ago it was not too common to see a photograph of a women's hockey team. But in 1977, Bob Freeson thought it would be a great idea to form a women's hockey team in Breton. They played on the outdoor ice rink located near the Centennial Park in Breton. Notice the small round circles of light in the photo, the rink was illuminated only by a small incandescent light bulb at night. It is unclear to the museum who the team played, or how long the team existed.

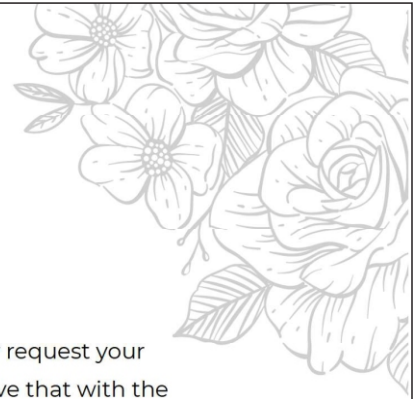

Community Volunteer Income Tax Program - FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION - For Low Income Persons, Families, seniors and students. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. If you did not file a tax return in 2023 you may not be receiving benefits from the government that you are eligible for. The focus of the Community Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. This includes seniors, families, and students. If your income was approximately in one of the following categories, you may qualify for assistance.

1 person - \$35,000 / Couple - \$45,000 / Family - \$52,500
We are not able to complete returns with income from the following sources: *Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding \$1,000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons*

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information, and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between 8:30 - 4pm. Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run until April 30

We require the following information to complete your return: *Personal Information (Social Insurance Number, Birth date, Marital Status, Address) / Dependent's information - spouse/ children's names, birth dates. / All "T" Slips (T4's, T4A, OAS etc.) / All Forms, Schedules, and Labels you have received from Revenue Canada. / Receipts for any expenses such as medical, moving, tuition, sporting activities. Printouts from your pharmacist are available for those with numerous prescriptions.*

"Yoga for Wellness" Will continue for the month of May, 10:00 - 11:00 am, Breton Community Center

The Adult Exercise Program - This class runs from 9:30 - 10:30 am on Friday mornings. Equipment is provided. This class will focus on toning, balance,

increased mobility, strength gains, and increased flexibility. Participants will be able to either do the exercise standing or sitting, which ever their ability will allow. This program is facilitated by Cassie Kreil a certified instructor. Participants will be asked to pay a small fee of \$2/class. This is a drop-in group.

Busing to Aquacise or Walmart in Drayton Valley - Monday Mornings- Together with Warburg FCSS the bus will arrive in Breton at 9:15 to head to the Drayton Valley Gentle Aquacise class. Returning at 11:30. Purchase a 5 ride Bus pass for (\$36) or 10(\$72) bus pass from the Village of Breton office. Register with Shauna the Thursday prior to the Monday class to save your seat on the bus. If you register with the Active 55 program (at the pool) and live in Brazeau County (including the Village of Breton) there is no cost for the Aqua Size class. If you do not qualify for Active 55 the cost for the aquacise class is \$7.50 or a 10 card pass for \$67.50. We must have at least 8 riders to make a trip. The bus will also make a stop at Walmart for those that would like to shop for 1 hr.

BRAZEAU COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS



April 16, 2024 Regular Council Meeting

2024 Tax Rate Bylaw and Residential Tax Incentive Bylaw

Council gave required readings to Tax Rate Bylaw 1179-24 and Residential Tax Incentive Bylaw 1177-24. The 2024 Tax Rate Bylaw has been calculated based on the 2024 Annual Budget, as approved by Council at its meeting on April 5. The 2024 Tax Rate Bylaw is presented with no increase to municipal tax rates. The presented bylaw also continues to carry forward a 30% reduction in the residential and farmland tax rate directed by Council in 2015, as well as a 25% reduction in the tax rate for small business and vacant non-residential properties that meet the eligibility criteria.

The Residential Incentive Bylaw sets out a 30% tax incentive on the municipal portion of residential property taxes for 2024. This formalizes the process Brazeau County has undertaken for residential property owners since 2020 and is in keeping with the requirements of the Municipal Government Act.

Eligibility for the tax incentive will remain the same as in previous years in that all taxes must be paid by the June 30 due date, including any arrears. The tax incentive will be pro-rated for those properties that are enrolled in the Tax Installment Payment Plan.

Tax notices will be sent in late May.

Financial Audit Presentation

Auditor Phil Dirks of Metrix Group presented the results of the annual financial audit conducted earlier this year. He confirmed that the County is in good financial shape.

The County has \$51.7 million in assets, \$14.6 million in liabilities, including \$6.7 million in debt, and a remaining debt capacity of \$49 million.

By law, all municipalities must be audited each year. The approved financial statements will be posted to the County website shortly.

Support for 4-H Achievement Day

Council approved an event grant of \$1,000 and in-kind support of \$2,074 to assist with the set up and take down (including the removal and hauling of the straw and manure) at the Drayton Valley Omnplex for the Drayton Valley 4-H Beef Interclub's Achievement Day on May 27, 2024, pending receipt of outstanding documents and confirmation that those documents meet the requirements of the FIN-7 Policy.

RMA Wildfire Working Group

Council appointed Councillor Donna Wiltse to the Rural Municipalities of Alberta (RMA) Wildfire Working Group.

CENTRAL ALBERTA DISTRICT CRIME REDUCTION UNIT

(CAD CRU) make significant seizure and lay charges

from RCMP Media Relations, April 16, 2024

Breton, Alta. - On April 11, 2024, CAD CRU were asked to assist Thorsby/Breton RCMP with a break and enter investigation. RCMP received information that a civilian was following a suspect vehicle believed to be involved in a break and enter when it slowed and then shot at the civilian.

As a result of the investigation, CAD CRU identified a suspect and requested assistance from Edmonton Police Service in conducting surveillance. As a result of their assistance, RCMP were able to obtain two search warrants, one for a property in Breton Detachment area and one for a residence in Parkland Detachment area.

On the morning of April 12, 2024, a break and enter was reported in Rimbey Detachment area, where numerous items including a truck and trailer were reported stolen. This truck and trailer, along with another truck, were observed returning to the Breton residence, at which time RCMP Emergency Response Team executed the search warrant. During this, one of the suspects used the vehicle he was driving and rammed police vehicles in an attempt to escape. This vehicle was later determined to be a stolen vehicle which had been re-tinted. Both drivers were arrested, which a search incidental to arrest resulted in the seizure of the following:

- a loaded 9mm Beretta
- 682 grams of suspected methamphetamine
- 70 grams of suspected cocaine.

Also inside the vehicle were numerous items that had been stolen from the Rimbey break and enter. It is believed that all items taken from this break and enter were recovered, including a truck and trailer, a gun safe containing 8 hunting rifles/shotguns, jewellery, passports, and food.

The search of the Breton property identified numerous stolen items, including the following:

- Vehicles
- Side by sides
- Snowmobiles
- Tools
- Flat deck trailers
- A hot tub

The approximate value of the recovered items at this scene is \$120,000.

The Parkland residence search warrant was also executed on the same day. As a result of this search warrant, the following was seized:

- Vehicles
- Holiday trailers
- A side by side
- Enclosed trailers
- Flat deck trailers
- A boat
- 2 firearms

The approximate value of the recovered items at this scene is \$320,000.

As a result of this investigation, **Justin Handbury (38)**, a resident of Alder Flats, has been charged with 64 offences, some of which include:

- Break and Enter (x2)
- Possession of stolen property over \$5000 (x15)
- Possession of stolen property under \$5000 (x7)
- Possession of a restricted / prohibited firearm
- Possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking (x2)
- Possess/Transfer/Sell and Identity Document (x5)

After a Judicial Interim Release Hearing, Handbury was remanded into custody and will be appearing in Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on April 16.

Marlace Monds (37), a resident of Alder Flats, has been charged with multiple offences including:

- Possession of stolen property over \$5000 (x14)
- Possession of stolen property under \$5000 (x7)

Monds was released for court in Alberta Court of Justice on April 24 in Breton.

Jesse Jeffcott (41), a resident of Alder Flats, has been charged with the following:

- Break and enter and theft of firearm
- Theft of motor vehicle
- Theft of property over \$5000 (x2)

After a Judicial Interim Release Hearing, Jeffcott was remanded into custody and will be appearing in Alberta Court of Justice on April 19, 2024, in Ponoka.

FAMILIES ENCOURAGED TO TALK ABOUT ORGAN, TISSUE DONATION

AHS launches public awareness campaign, new name for program.

Alberta Health Services (AHS) has launched a new public awareness campaign and revealed a new name for its provincial donation program during National Organ and Tissue Donation Awareness Week, April 21-27.

All the Ways is a series of video and print ads showing creative methods of informing loved ones about your decision to donate organs and tissues. While the campaign's tone is light-hearted, the goal is to normalize talks about deceased donation. Grieving families faced with the difficult decision to donate often find it easier if they know what their loved one wanted.

The Alberta Organ and Tissue Donation Program is now Give Life Alberta. The new name is a call to action for Albertans to register their intent to donate online at www.GiveLifeAlberta.ca and to tell loved ones about their decision. Albertans can also continue to register to donate at motor vehicle registry offices. Signing the back of your Alberta Health card is still accepted, although not preferred over online registration, and families must be informed in case the card is lost.

One organ donor can save up to eight lives, and a tissue donor can save or dramatically improve lives for up to 75 people. While Alberta marked another record year – with 273 organ and tissue donors in 2023 — there are almost 300 people waiting for life-saving transplants in our province. Last year, nearly 50 people on the wait-list died.

Kinza Barney applauds the effort to encourage Albertans to act on their good intentions. When the Airdrie resident received news that her 15-year-old son Zachary would not survive a dirt bike crash, her family knew what he would want. He had an important conversation with his mother weeks before, while practising for his driver's test.

"He had asked me, 'Are you a donor?' because he knew that going in to get his driver's licence, eventually that was something that was going to be asked of him," says Barney. "I showed him my licence and said, 'See it says 'donor' and there's a little heart at the bottom. What do you think?' And he said, 'Absolutely. I want to be an organ donor.'"

Zachary's road test was scheduled for his 16th birthday in 2022. Instead, he donated his organs that day, saving five lives. *"Looking back, what a coincidence to have had that conversation with a 15-year-old ... only to be here today and having to make a decision that reflects his wishes," says Barney. "It made our decision a lot easier for sure."*

AHS donor coordinators are approaching more families than ever since Alberta's Bill 205 took effect one year ago. The bill creates a more structured pathway for the organ

and tissue donation process, and ensures specialists have adequate time to identify and assess potential donors and discuss the option with families.

"The families that have talked about organ and tissue donation, they are able to know exactly what their loved one's wishes are and either sign the consent or not," says donor coordinator Carey Beninger. "It makes such a difference in such a stressful time. They don't want to get it wrong. They want to be sure this is what their loved one would have wanted."
