



Community Volunteer Income Tax Program - FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION - For Low Income Persons, Families, seniors and students. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. If you did not file a tax return in 2023 you may not be receiving benefits from the government that you are eligible for. We will continue to file Income Tax Returns for those that did not meet the deadline of April 30th.

Yoga for Wellness - Will continue for the month of May, 10:00 - 11:00 am, Breton Community Center. Gentle flow yoga to help strengthen and relax the body and the mind. For residents 60 and older, you receive 50% off the rates when you provide identification. Either show us your identification in-person when you apply, or attach a copy of your identification to your application if you're mailing or emailing it to us.



Cindy was predeceased by her mom Iona and her grandparents, Norman and Bernice Haffner and Norman and Mary Holmgren.



ALBERTA REJECTS UNCONSTITUTIONAL CAP ON PLASTIC PRODUCTION

April 25, 2024, Press Release

Minister of Environment and Protected Areas Rebecca Schulz issued the following statement:

"Every modern convenience and necessity is either made from or contains plastic, from surgical gloves to your iPhone. Despite this, Minister of Environment and Climate Change Canada Steven Guilbeault has announced that he intends to cap the production of plastics in Canada.

"This unilateral announcement is a slap in the face to Alberta and our province's petrochemical industry, and the thousands of Albertans who work in it.

"Plastics production is a growing part of Alberta's economy, and we are positioned to lead the world for decades to come in the production of carbon neutral plastics.

"Minister Guilbeault's proposal would throw all of that into jeopardy and risk billions of dollars in investments. This includes projects like Dow Chemical's net-zero petrochemical plant in Fort Saskatchewan, a \$9-billion dollar project that will create thousands of jobs.

"His proposal will also fail to reduce plastic production. If the federal government limits plastic production in Canada, other counties like China will just produce more. The only outcome that this federal government will achieve will be fewer jobs in Canada.

"Last year, the Federal Court ruled that Minister Guilbeault's decision to classify plastics as 'toxic' was both 'unconstitutional and unreasonable'.

"Minister Guilbeault's decision to cap production is even more egregious and is equally unconstitutional. Under no circumstances will Alberta permit any limit on our ability to produce and export plastic products.

"Instead of wasting everyone's time, the federal government would be better served by taking a page out of Alberta's plan, which diverts plastics from landfills and turns used plastics into new products. This is the promise of Alberta's plan to create a Plastics Circular Economy, a modern miracle in which, through chemistry, we can have all of life's conveniences and necessities while protecting our environment and reducing plastic waste.

"If the federal government refuses to abide by the constitution, we will take them to court again to defend our jurisdiction and the thousands of Albertans who work in the petrochemical sector."

APRIL HIGHLIGHTS:

Central Alberta District Crime Reduction Unit (CAD CRU) make significant seizure and lay charges

Breton, Alta. - On April 11, 2024, CAD CRU were asked to assist Thorsby/Breton RCMP with a break and enter investigation. RCMP received information that a civilian was following a suspect vehicle believed to be involved in a break and enter when it slowed and then shot at the civilian.

As a result of the investigation, CAD CRU identified a suspect and requested assistance from Edmonton Police Service in conducting surveillance. As a result of their assistance, RCMP were able to obtain two search warrants, one for a property in Breton Detachment area and one for a residence in Parkland Detachment area.

On the morning of April 12, 2024, a break and enter was reported in Rimbey Detachment area, where numerous items including a truck and trailer were reported stolen. This truck and trailer, along with another truck, were observed returning to the Breton residence, at which time RCMP Emergency Response Team executed the

search warrant. During this, one of the suspects used the vehicle he was driving and rammed police vehicles in an attempt to escape. This vehicle was later was determined to be a stolen vehicle which had been revinned. Both drivers were arrested, which a search incidental to arrest resulted in the seizure of the following:

- · a loaded 9mm Beretta
- · 682 grams of suspected methamphetamine
- 70 grams of suspected cocaine.

Also inside the vehicle were numerous items that had been stolen from the Rimbey break and enter. It is believed that all items taken from this break and enter were recovered, including a truck and trailer, a gun safe containing 8 hunting rifles/shotguns, jewellery, passports, and food.

The search of the Breton property identified numerous stolen items, including the following:

- · Vehicles
- Side by sides
- Snowmobiles
- Tools
- Flat deck trailers
- A hot tub

The approximate value of the recovered items at this scene is \$120,000.

The Parkland residence search warrant was also executed on the same day. As a result of this search warrant, the following was seized:

- · Vehicles
- · Holiday trailers
- A side by side
- Enclosed trailers
- Flat deck trailers
- Aboat
- 2 firearms

The approximate value of the recovered items at this scene is \$320,000.

As a result of this investigation, Justin Handbury (38), a resident of Alder Flats, has been charged with 64 offences, some of which include:

- Break and Enter (x2)
- Possession of stolen property over \$5000 (x15)
- Possession of stolen property under \$5000 (x7)
- Possession of a restricted / prohibited firearm
- Possession of a controlled substance for the purpose of trafficking (x2)
- Possess/Transfer/Sell and Identity Document (x5)

After a Judicial Interim Release Hearing, Handbury was remanded into custody and appeared in Alberta Court of Justice in Drayton Valley on April 16.

Marlace Monds (37), a resident of Alder Flats, has been charged with multiple offences including:

- Possession of stolen property over \$5000 (x14)
- Possession of stolen property under \$5000 (x7)

Monds was released for court in Alberta Court of Justice on April 24 in Breton.

- Jesse Jeffcott (41), a resident of Alder Flats, has been charged with the following:
- · Break and enter and theft of firearm
- · Theft of motor vehicle
- Theft of property over \$5000 (x2)

After a Judicial Interim Release Hearing, Jeffcott was remanded into custody and appeared in Alberta Court of Justice on April 19, 2024, in Ponoka.

The investigation continues. RCMP would like to recognize the support units who assisted in this successful investigation, including CAD CRU, Breton/Thorsby RCMP, Parkland RCMP, Drayton Valley RCMP, Critical Incident Program, Police Dog Services, Auto Theft Unit and RPAS.

A Provincial Example, A Federal Necessity

The 2021 tragedy in Hinton, where we lost 16-month-old Noah McConnell and his mother, Mchale Busch, has left a deep scar on our community. This horrific event not only brought grief but also a pressing call for tangible measures to prevent such occurrences in the future. It was in this context that I came across an OP-ED by the MLA for Camrose, Jackie Lovely, detailing Alberta's legislative response to cases like Noah and Mchale's.

In response to the loss suffered in Hinton and similar cases, Alberta's government has introduced significant legislative changes, aimed at tightening the reins on violent and sexual offenders. The new measures include a provincial ankle bracelet monitoring program, targeting repeat violent and sexual offenders, as well as individuals on bail who pose a clear risk to public safety. These steps are a decisive move towards enhancing the security and wellbeing of our communities.

While Alberta has taken commendable steps, it highlights a glaring gap at the federal level. My Private Member's Bill, C-336, known as Noah's Law, seeks to address this gap by intensifying the monitoring of highly-likely-to-repeat sex offenders. Noah's Law would extend reporting obligations to 30 years for highly-likely-to-repeat sex offenders and mandate completion of a rehabilitation program before any easing of reporting requirements can be considered. Additionally, it proposes stricter requirements for offenders to report any change of address and makes failing to report a criminal offense.

The actions taken by Alberta in response to these types of tragedies serves as both a blueprint and a call to action. It is imperative now more than ever for the federal Liberal government to follow suit. We have the responsibility and the means to ensure that the lessons learned from past tragedies translate into stronger protective measures nationwide. Let us honour the memories of those we've lost by ensuring a safer future for all Canadians.

HELPING COMMUNITIES SAVE MONEY, LOWER ENERGY COSTS

Alberta's new \$6-million program will help municipalities make energy-saving upgrades, reducing costs and emissions.

Arenas, community centres and other facilities consume large amounts of energy. These facilities can be costly to operate and upgrades are often expensive to implement. With inflation and energy costs on the rise, many municipalities want to improve energy efficiency and save money.

Thanks to funding from the Alberta government, municipalities can now apply to the Community Energy Conservation Program to make energy-efficient upgrades to municipally owned buildings. This will help communities of all sizes save energy, lower energy costs and reduce emissions.

"We are helping municipalities make the practical upgrades they need to increase energy efficiency and lower energy costs. By making upgrades to rec centres, arenas and community halls, we can reduce emissions while supporting growing communities for years to come." Rebecca Schulz, Minister of Environment and Protected Areas

Under the new Community Energy Conservation Program, up to \$500,000 is available per municipality, including community-related organizations. The funding can be used for recreation centres, libraries, community halls, transit centres, fire halls and waste water treatment facilities, among others.

"Local facilities, from community halls to hockey rinks, are at the heart of every municipality in Alberta. Urban or rural, large or small or mid-sized, the municipalities of Alberta have been calling for an energy conservation program to make a difference in their communities. I am looking forward to seeing this program in action and to see the efficiencies and savings it will create at the local level." Ric McIver, Minister of Municipal Affairs

Communities can apply for funding to help conduct energy audits of existing community facilities. They can also receive funding for a wide range of projects, including upgrading insulation, heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems, interior and exterior lighting, and more. Municipalities are encouraged to visit the Municipal Climate Change Action Centre's website for more information.

The Community Energy Conservation Program is part of an \$18-million investment by Alberta's government to help reduce costs for municipalities through the Municipal Climate Change Action Centre. It is part of Alberta's Emissions Reduction and Energy Development Plan, which is reducing emissions, creating jobs and supporting a strong economy.

"The Community Energy Conservation Program provides an opportunity for rural municipalities, which may otherwise not have access to funding, to improve the energy efficiency of their buildings. This will allow rural municipalities to continue to fund their core services while reducing their energy usage." Kara Westerlund, vice-president, Rural Municipalities of Alberta

Quick facts

- Applications for the Community Energy Conservation Program are now open and will close in March 2026, or when funding has been fully allocated, whichever comes first.
- Under the program, funding will be provided through:
- Energy audits: Up to 50 per cent of pre-GST energy audit costs (per facility), to a maximum of \$7,500 for all municipal facilities.
- Retrofit projects: Up to 50 per cent of project costs.
 Projects may receive 25 to 50 per cent of project costs depending on the abatement rate.
- Retrofit project bonus: A bonus of 10 per cent project cost rebate will apply if a project results in a 20 per cent or greater reduction in facility-wide emissions.
- Eligible costs include the equipment, materials, labour, installation, and project or construction management costs required to complete the project.
- The Municipal Climate Change Action Centre was established in 2009 as a partnership between Alberta Environment and Protected Areas, Alberta Municipal Affairs, Alberta Municipalities and Rural Municipalities of Alberta.
- Through this partnership, the Government of Alberta invests in programs that provide funding, technical assistance and education to Alberta municipalities and community-related organizations to help lower energy costs and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- Alberta's government has provided more than \$24 million to the Municipal Climate Change Action Centre since 2019.


