

Brazeau County Agricultural Services Division will be carrying out roadside spraying of prohibited noxious, noxious weeds and woody vegetation (brush) throughout the County from May to October. For public safety, a buffer zone will be maintained between these roadside spray areas and county residences/yard sites.

As per our Vegetation Management policy, spraying on roadsides is done under the authority of Alberta's Weed Control Act. Brazeau County is required to control the weeds on the roadside just like any other landowner is on privately owned land. As well, in the public interest of safety, brush control is performed to increase the sightlines on roadways and intersections. As a result, costs of maintaining these open roadways are reduced where brush and trees are managed properly as it makes snow removal easier and allows roads to dry out guicker after precipitation falls.

The following programs related to herbicide use are available to residents:

- Hawkweed Program (County staff will treat up to 5 acres infested with Hawkweed on private land at no cost)
- · Herbicide Rebate Program (the County will reimburse landowners 50% of the cost of herbicide used on the landowner's property to control prohibited noxious and noxious weeds)
- No Spray Agreement (the County will not use herbicides in the ditch adjacent to a landowner's property; responsibility for weed control is assumed by the landowner)

NEW SPACE OFFERS A PLACE TO SAY GOODBYE

Saying final goodbyes surrounded by the love of family and friends is something that should be available to everyone and a new service in Drayton Valley is providing another option to make that possible.

Now families who have a loved one choosing MAID (medical assistance in dying) have another choice on how to share their last memories together. Colleen Sekura and her team at Drayton Memorial have created the Butterfly Room, a space where people can gather to say their goodbyes.

Located in a separate and quiet area of Drayton Memorial (the former United Church), the Butterfly Room is an alternative for those who don't wish to have MAiD in their homes, or a clinical setting. In fact, there is nothing clinical about the Butterfly Room at all. A collection of couches and chairs provide plenty of space for friends and family to spend time with their loved ones, and each other, in a setting that resembles a comfortable living room. It's a cozy atmosphere for people to share their final memories and moments, whatever they wish those to be.

That was the whole premise behind the creation of the room, said Sekura. A place where friends and families can feel at home and spend the time leading up to the loved one's death, however they choose.

"The important thing is to put people's wishes first, "It is a very personal act that should be respected and done properly," said Sekura "Do you want to watch a hockey game or a movie? Do you want a glass of wine? Some people want to be in groups of four or five, and we can accommodate groups up to 30."

Providing comfortable, neutral spaces for MAiD is a service that's starting to grow in demand, noted Sekura, and one Drayton Memorial had the room and desire to be able to offer. She is not aware of any other similar service being offered in the local area and it is one she believes is needed. Those choosing end of life may not wish to have it done at home, or in a medical facility, or those options may not be open to them. Under the regulations governing it, MAiD can take place in any location so long as it is administered or facilitated by a physician or nurse practitioner. Spaces like the Butterfly Room provide another choice for individuals and families. The individual having MAiD can be comfortable in the main part of the room in a spacious recliner, or behind a decorative room divider they can rest in a bed, still with lots of room for people to visit with them. The decision to furnish the room without items usually associated with a clinical setting, such as a hospital bed, was deliberate

and made with the individual and their loved ones in mind.

The Butterfly Room offers refreshments and lunch for attending guests and included in the room rental, Drayton Memorial also provides the services of a death doula to assist in navigating grief and the death process. The Butterfly Room is now ready for use and families can

rent the space for the day. Family and friends can come and go throughout that time to visit. For more information on the Butterfly Room or to inquire about using the space, contact Drayton Memorial at 587-977-2637.
