

Seniors Services provides preventative social programs that assist seniors and adults with disabilities in maintaining their independence and enhancing their quality of life.

Housekeeping subsidy

Provides access to affordable housekeeping services through a partnership with local service providers.

To be eligible for the housekeeping subsidy, you must:

- ▶ Be a senior (65+) or an adult with a disability or inability to complete household task.
- Meet annual income thresholds.
- ▶ Be a resident of Leduc County (including) New Sarepta), Calmar, Thorsby or Warburg.

Housekeeping fees are determined based on family income level and eligibility to other subsidies. Seniors who are eligible for subsidy from the Government of Alberta will be assisted with applications.



Seniors Services also offers one-to-one support to assist you with:

- Information and referrals to other local resources.
- Assistance with forms and applications.
- Advocacy and coordination of services.
- Goal setting and future planning.







TOM'S WALK IN **DEVON MAY 26**

In 2018, Global NEWS covered this event. Here is the story written by Jennifer Ivanov.

"Teachers in Devon band together to support fellow teacher and mom who lost son to suicide

A group of teachers in the small community of Devon, Alta., south of Edmonton, have banded together to support a colleague facing an unimaginable loss.

On March 30, Kelly and Stuart Maxwell lost their son Thomas, a talented musician who struggled with schizoaffective disorder.

Thomas took his own life. He was just 23 years old.

According to colleagues, the parents worked tirelessly to help their son and had found a local program which helped the family learn how to communicate more effectively.

A group of teachers and friends of the Maxwell's have organized a walk to help raise money for the "The Sashbear Foundation," an organization which runs the program that helped the Maxwell family.

Tom's Walk for Mental Health and Suicide Prevention gets underway at 1:30 p.m. at Devon's Field of Dreams baseball park.

Participants are walking approximately 5 kilometres to the banks of the North Saskatchewan River, near the bridge where Thomas took his last breath."

Now, 6 years later - "Tom's Walk is more than just a walk; it's a heartfelt journey that began in 2018, a mere six weeks after we lost Tom to his battle with mental illness. Every May since then, this annual memorial event has brought us together. By 2024, it blossomed into the Tom's Walk for Mental Health Society, a nonprofit close to our hearts. This walk isn't just about mental health challenges: it's a safe space to share our

stories and support each other. It's where all of us with a similar experience can honour our loved ones' memories and hear their names spoken. Our goal is simple: to share resources, ignite hope, and raise funds for The SILA Skills Group, which conducts workshops and training to build resilience and create connections. We invite you to walk with us, share your story, and be part of this supportive community". - Stu & Kelly Maxwell (Tom's parents).



DROUGHT AND FLOOD PROTECTION PROGRAM NOW OPEN

Alberta News, May 6, 2024

Alberta's new Drought and Flood Protection Program is now accepting applications for projects to help protect homes, businesses and lives.

Many parts of Alberta have experienced flooding in recent years, while others have seen water shortages and may face severe drought this year. Many communities need assistance in developing the expensive local infrastructure needed to protect residents from extreme weather events.

To help, Alberta's government is launching the new \$125-million Drought and Flood Protection Program. Municipalities and Indigenous communities across the province can now apply for funding to improve their drought and flood resilience and adapt to severe weather.

"We are helping communities build the infrastructure they need to help protect people's homes and keep businesses going during droughts or floods. These emergencies can devastate public infrastructure and private property, damage the environment, disrupt our economy and put lives at risk. That's why I encourage any and all communities to apply." Rebecca Schulz, Minister of Environment and Protected Areas

The Drought and Flood Protection Program builds on the work of the Alberta Community Resilience Program. This year, \$25 million is being made available for projects to benefit communities across the province that are facing drought and flood. Another \$100 million will be available for funding over the next four years, with applications accepted each year.

The Drought and Flood Protection Program will help communities design and construct projects that protect critical infrastructure from drought and flooding and help ensure public safety is protected. This could include important drought-related projects to improve water storage, upgrading open-ditch irrigation canals to reduce water loss through evaporation, or relocating water intakes to help communities access water during dry periods. It could also include flood-related projects, such as berms, flood walls and other infrastructure.

Applications for shovel-ready projects are strongly encouraged, but all projects that meet the eligibility criteria will be considered for funding. All municipalities, Improvement Districts, Special Areas, Metis Settlements and First Nations are eligible to apply by June 6, 2024.

Quick facts

- Budget 2024 allocated \$25 million per year from 2024-25 through 2028-29 for the Drought and Flood Protection Program.
- Projects eligible for funding include, but are not

limited to:

- Drought and flood-proofing or relocation of critical infrastructure and infrastructure required to access those services.
- Structural measures such as berms, flood walls, bank protection and stabilization works, retention ponds and diversion structures intended to protect critical infrastructure and ensure public safety.
- □ Purchase of property for the purpose of relocation or for access to and/or construction of a project.
- Bio-retention infrastructure designed to increase flood attenuation and reduce the impacts of drought.
- Under the program:
 - □ There is no minimum funding requirement for applications.
 - A funding cap of \$10 million per project is in place to ensure the program is able to support multiple projects each year.
 - All approved projects will be cost-shared, with the Government of Alberta covering up to 70 per cent of total eligible costs and the grant recipient(s) covering the remaining 30 per cent.
- More application and program information is available online.
- Disaster Recovery Programs in Alberta have paid out more than \$1.7 billion to cover uninsured losses associated with flooding since 2010. There has also been more than \$5 billion in insured losses.
