Once received, they can use that information for identity fraud.

If you get a call from your service provider, tell them you will call them back and end the call. Look up the legitimate phone number for the company and communicate with them directly by always making the outgoing call.

2024 LEDUC COUNTY REGIONAL SUBDIVISION AND DEVELOPMENT APPEAL BOARD (QUASI-JUDICIAL BOARD)

The Leduc County Regional Subdivision and Development Appeal Board (LCRSDAB) is an independent, quasi-judicial board that adjudicates hearings on appeals from affected parties relative to decisions made by the subdivision authority and the development authority – similar to a court hearing. The LCRSDAB makes their decision on fact-based evidence, then applies legal rules as per legislation and planning documents such as the Municipal Development Plan and the Land-Use Bylaw.

When the SDAB makes its decision, it's final and cannot be overturned unless the SDAB makes a law or jurisdictional error.

All board members must successfully complete a training program set or approved by the Minister of Alberta Municipal Affairs.





THE TOPS TEN

Tips for a Healthy Brain

- 1. <u>Eat colourfully</u>. Richly coloured foods provide powerful antioxidants. Think: sweet potatoes, oranges, broccoli green, blueberry blue. A recent study in the Journal of American Medical Association found that people who ate more dietary antioxidants had 70% less chance of developing Alzheimer's Disease and dementia. Focus on nourishing your brain by choosing a healthy diet. Eating a diet of fruit, vegetables and fish can cut your chance of developing the condition by 40%, according to some studies.
- 2. <u>Thwart stress</u>. Begin by accepting in advance that stress will come. It's part of life. Then, when it arrives, calmly say to yourself here it is-stress There is a challenge I must face. You've cut stress in half by not fighting its inevitability. No more wasting energy flailing around like a child and thinking. Why? Oh, why does this have to happen to me? Your energy will be used instead to face this new challenge like an adult. You have lessened the stress tremendously.
- 3. <u>Sleep</u>. When we lose sleep, don't get enough sleep, or don't sleep at regular times, hormones become imbalanced, and our brains don't work as well. Poor sleep or sleep loss leads to fatigue, immune suppression, memory, concentration, and mood disorder. Optimal learning cannot take place against a background of sleep debt. Sleep debt makes us inefficient, more easily agitated, tired, crabby, and stressed because we are not at our best. Try to go to bed and wake up at the same time every day. Get to sleep before midnight and get at least 7-8 hours of sleep a night. Difficulty falling asleep? Actively relax by tensing then relaxing individual muscle groups.
- 4. Move and do. Don't be a couch potato-or a computer potato. Exercise is a natural antioxidant, anti-inflammatory and stress buster. It will help you sleep better and lower your cholesterol and blood sugar. Regular exercise improves the blood supply to the brain, reduces depression and puts a spring to your step. A Swedish study showed that regular exercise can reduce the risk of developing Alzheimer's disease by 50%. Unplug the TV between viewing sessions so

- you're more aware of your decision to be inactive-and perhaps under stimulated. Swap a book for TV. Learn a new hobby or a musical instrument.
- 5. <u>Use your head</u>. Challenge your brain. Many studies have shown that using your head-whether by reading, doing crossword puzzles, enjoying games or being actively engaged in intellectual pursuits-reduces your risk of dementia. Participating in these can cause synapse growth, which allows nerves in the brain to communicate with each other more efficiently.

Axe the Taxes for Summer

OTTAWA, ON – Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is joining Pierre Poilievre and the Common Sense Conservatives in calling on Justin Trudeau to pause the carbon tax, the federal gas tax, and the GST for the summer to bring some desperately needed relief for Canadians.

OWNER OR THIEF?

If you were driving through a residential area and you saw someone getting out of their car and carrying groceries up to a house, unlocking the door and going inside, you would assume that it is the owner.

Another day as you drive through the same neighbourhood, you see someone parking their car behind a large bushy area. They get out of the car wearing a black hoodie, hammer and black bag in their hands. As you watch, they sneak up the driveway and going to a side window they cut the screen, open the window and climb inside. You can safely assume that this is not the owner. Why? 


