CARNWOOD HALL POSSIBLE CLOSURE

I had the wonderful opportunity to listen to some of the stories of the Hall. Imagine a time when students came to the Liberton School, walking miles or riding their horses to come to a one room, grades 1 to 9, school that didn't have electricity, a furnace, nor plumbing. The land was donated by the Barnet family, next door, and water was brought over in buckets from the Barnet home. The Home and School association had dances and concerts that were always well attended as the community came out to be together.

The original school burned down in December of 1949 when the wood stove caught fire as the teacher attempted to warm the building for the entrance of the students. While the students had an extended holiday, a foundation was built and the current building was brought in.

The school closed in June 1955 and in 1956 it became registered as the Carnwood Country Society. It continued to be a vibrant part of the community. The club ran on donations and when the addition was put on, with running water, electricity, washrooms, and a kitchen,

everybody came out and donated money, labour, and materials to make it. 4-H clubs, baseball teams used it as their home. Weddings, funerals, family events, elections, community dinners and dances kept it going.

For so many years now, it has been a place of gathering and celebrating, but it would seem now that its time will end. Unless there is some community interest and people ready to take over, it will be closing. The current executive is quite senior and despite attempts to bring in the community, people seem to be involved in other activities. There will be a motion forthcoming to close it within the next year. While we would love to see it have a new life, the reality is that we just can't keep it going.

If anyone can pick up the torch, that would be wonderful. There is still some time...







HEAT EXHAUSTION AND HEATSTROKE

With the weather forecast for the next week take time to take care of yourself and to also check on any elderly or persons living alone. Make sure you take precautions not to have heat exhaustion or heat stroke. Heat exhaustion does not usually need emergency medical help if you can cool down within 30 minutes. If it turns into heatstroke, it needs to be treated as an emergency. Check for signs of heat exhaustion. The signs of heat exhaustion include:

- * tiredness
- * dizziness
- * headache
- * feeling sick or being sick
- * excessive sweating and skin becoming pale and clammy or getting a heat rash, but a change in skin colour can be harder to see on brown and black skin
- * cramps in the arms, legs and stomach
- * fast breathing or heartbeat
- * a high temperature
- * being very thirsty
- * weakness

The symptoms of heat exhaustion are often the same in adults and children, although children may become irritable too. If someone is showing signs of heat exhaustion, they need to be cooled down and given fluids.

Things you can do to cool someone down.

If someone has heat exhaustion, follow these 4 steps:

- * Move them to a cool place.
- * Remove all unnecessary clothing like a jacket or socks.
- * Get them to drink a sports or rehydration drink, or cool water.
- * Cool their skin spray or sponge them with cool water and fan them. Cold packs, wrapped in a cloth and put under the armpits or on the neck are good too.
- * Stay with them until they're better.

They should start to cool down and feel better within 30 minutes.

Preventing heat exhaustion and heatstroke

To help prevent heat exhaustion or heatstroke:

- * drink more cold drinks, especially if you're active or exercising.
- * wear light-colored, loose clothing.
- * avoid the sun between 11am and 3pm
- * avoid excess alcohol.
- * avoid extreme exercise.

If you're inside on a very hot day, close curtains, close windows if it's hotter outside than in your home and turn off electrical equipment and lights that get hot. This will also prevent dehydration and help your body keep itself cool. Children, older people, and people with long-term health conditions (such as diabetes or heart problems) are more at risk of heat exhaustion or heatstroke.

To the Editor:

Here are a few more issues that Brazeau County residents might ponder and perhaps ask their councillor how these issues benefit the County.

This writer's information has it that a road allowance extension of Township Road 474 between RR54 and RR55 is being prepped for a road. Given that this mile has extensive water, drainage, and preparation issues, why is it being done? Who benefits, as ALL landowners in the area have access to their holdings now! It appears to this observer a complete waste of money.

Why is it that Brazeau County does not have fees for subdivisions? Why is it that the rest of us (taxpayers) subsidize the beneficiaries of subdivisions? If it's true that subdivisions cost us (taxpayers) around \$1.70 to \$1.80 for every tax dollar a subdivision generates, why do we want subdivisions at all. Perhaps a check who is a prolific subdivider might provide an answer.

According to my information, the sound "system" in the County building room used by the Ag Service Board is very poor. However, a motion to hold ASB meetings in the main conference room (with better sound) was defeated. So much for looking after the public interest.

One might inquire as to conference attendance by ASB members, what it cost the public, and especially what benefit to the county accrues. To this writer's knowledge, no written reports are available to answer the above. Perhaps it's time for council to implement a "no satisfactory report, no per diem and no future conference attendance (at county expense)". To facilitate the above, this writer knows someone who would be happy to help determine what a satisfactory report consists of and whether a report meets a minimum standard

Regarding Mr. Guyon's per diems for the last two months, one might seriously consider whether we are receiving value for the money. Note: He received \$8,000 for May; other Councillors around \$5,000. He received \$14,000 for June. Others: Wiltse, \$8800; Westerlund, \$6000; Gunderson, \$6400; Ekstrom, \$4200; Brooks, \$4200; Heinrich, \$3600.

Not bad for a part-time job with little or no oversight. More on this later.
