#### ALLAN GODDARD CONTINUES TO PRESERVE OUR HISTORY

Allan has been writing and sharing stories with the Breton Community in our paper, on Facebook and on the Breton Museum website for as long as I can remember. I was so excited to come across this excerpt from November 14, 1990 in the "County of Leduc No.25 history" and wanted to share it with all of you.

"The historical society had been formed initially to put out a history book, The Ladder of Time, which was published in 1980. They progressed from there and were going to start a museum. When they advertised for volunteers I thought that was something that I would like to do.

Mrs. Hooks had been president at that time, and felt that as she had been at it for ten years, it was time for a change. That's how I ended up as president- this will be my third term.

The museum is an on-going project for the Breton Historical Society. Also, there was the Black cemetery just north of Breton. The society cleaned it up, restored it and erected a cairn.

The museum is progressing steadily. We focus on the Black history, the logging industry, the railway and agriculture. The Breton test plots are the longest continuing plots on grey-wooded soil.

The more the museum becomes known, the more interest there will be. We have had visitors from many different places - Allan Goddard, interviewed November 14, 1990."

Thank you Allan Goddard for your years of sharing and preserving Breton's history.






#### **Community Information Night - Celebrate** Breton & Chili Cook Off -**Tuesday September 24**

## MILLIONS OF REASONS TO SEARCH LOST-MONEY DATABASE

Alberta's government is seeking the rightful owners of a combined \$154 million in unclaimed money and property.

Alberta's unclaimed property registry holds money that is lost, abandoned or forgotten. The registry currently contains millions in cash, cheques, money orders and other unclaimed items belonging to people who may be entitled to an unexpected payout.

Alberta's unclaimed property registry returned \$1.4 million to 650 people in 2023 alone. Almost 350,000 individual items remain unclaimed in the registry, including one valued at more than \$850,000. If claimed, it will be the largest single balance the province has ever paid out, surpassing the current record of \$368,124, which was returned to its rightful owner in 2019.

"Who doesn't like free money? Alberta's unclaimed property registry is free and easy to check, and a quick search of the registry could help reunite someone with money that they may not even know they were entitled to." Nate Horner, President of Treasury Board and Minister of Finance

Since its inception in 2008, Alberta's unclaimed property registry has returned \$13.8 million to more than 8,500 owners. Sources of the unclaimed funds include unclaimed deposits, uncashed wages, loan overpayments and unclaimed funds from inactive investment accounts.

Alberta's unclaimed property program is governed and managed by the province through the Unclaimed Personal Property and Vested Property Act. The act provides 10 years for owners to stake and reclaim their lost money, after which the money is transferred to the government's general revenue fund to help pay for programs and services for Albertans.

## MORE BOOTS ON THE GROUND TO FIGHT RURAL CRIME

July 18, 2024, Alberta News

New surveillance teams led by the Alberta Sheriffs are now on the ground and working alongside local police to make rural communities in Alberta safer.

Rural crime continues to be a top concern among residents and businesses in rural Alberta, which is why Alberta's government remains committed to addressing it through enhanced surveillance and other crime reduction initiatives. Alberta's government invested \$4.3 million for the Alberta Sheriffs to put more boots on the ground. This investment supported the establishment of two plainclothes teams – one in northern Alberta and one in southern Alberta – to support police in carrying out surveillance on criminal targets in rural areas.

Both teams are now fully staffed and operational, ready to fight crime in rural areas across Alberta. These rural surveillance teams will work to prevent crime, monitor agricultural theft and work in collaboration with local law enforcement to share intelligence and resources to keep Albertans and their property safe and secure.

"Criminals and organized crime are not welcome in Alberta. Full stop. The addition of two new surveillance teams will further support our law enforcement partners in stamping out criminal activity in Alberta's rural areas. This is about supporting local investigations to address local crime in our smaller communities. Together, both teams will form another key component of Alberta's efforts to combat crime and ensure Albertans feel safe at home and in their communities, regardless of where they live." Mike Ellis, Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Services

The Alberta Sheriffs have an existing surveillance unit that is part of the Alberta Law Enforcement Response Teams (ALERT) and focused mainly on serious and organized crime investigations. The new surveillance teams will fill a gap by helping rural RCMP detachments with local investigations.

"Through their specialized knowledge, training and experience, Alberta's new surveillance teams are providing another important mechanism in the fight against crime in Alberta's rural communities. Working in close collaboration with the RCMP and other policing agencies, their efforts will play a key role in gathering evidence and information that will help disrupt crime throughout the province." Mike Letourneau, superintendent, Alberta Sheriffs

"This announcement by the Alberta government and Minister Ellis is a positive step forward for the residents of Alberta, especially in rural areas. The creation of these new surveillance teams will help augment our ongoing crime reduction strategies in Alberta communities, and we look forward to working with them going forward." Trevor Daroux, assistant commissioner, criminal operations officer, Alberta RCMP

The new surveillance teams are part of a suite of measures to expand the role of the Alberta Sheriffs and make Alberta communities safer. Other actions include the expansion of the Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods (SCAN) unit – which uses legal sanctions and court orders to target problem properties where illegal activities are taking place – and the

expansion of the RAPID Response initiative with funding for the Sheriff Highway Patrol to train and equip members to assist the RCMP with emergencies and highpriority calls.


