



EVERY FAMILY SHARES A STORY

From Africa to Alberta

The Impey Family's Transcontinental Journey

Part 3: The Journey Continues

We left off the second chapter of the Impey family's story with George and Ida arriving in the town of Boksburg, at Christmas 1894, where George's brother Richard and family lived. Their infant son Collin, who had been ill on their arduous trip from East Griqualand to Boksburg passed away shortly after their arrival.

Some time previous to their arrival, gold had been discovered in the area and George obtained work freighting coal to supply the mines. A farm, with irrigation, was rented but a severe drought came drying up the water source to irrigate. Since the owner of the farm had guaranteed water, he agreed to cancel their contract.

Their journey continued, with George and Ida moving to nearby Benoni. George secured a contract from a Mr. Hodgson to freight large stone from a quarry to the gold mines, which were used to build cyanide dams used in the extraction of gold. Mr. Hodgson also rented a small farm to George and Ida on a crop share.

Political turbulence had existed in South Africa for some time between the British and the Dutch. On December 29 1895. British colonial administrator Colonel Jamieson crossed the border from Rhodesia into the Transvaal. The intended goal of the raid was to trigger an insurrection of the British expatriates in the Dutch controlled Transvaal. The raid proved to be a dismal failure, on the part of the British, only lasting 4 days. George and Ida were caught up in the turmoil of this raid, having to leave their farm for a period of time. When George and Ida returned to their farm, rain had come, the crops looked green and promised a bumper crop. There is an old saying... if it wasn't for bad luck we wouldn't have any luck, seemed to hold true for George and Ida. Early the next day, the sky darkened with a heavy looking brown cloud, it was swarms of locusts and soon the land was covered with the hungry insects...Ida writes... "all day we made smoke screens and walked through and through driving the swarms, but those that rose, just flew over us and settled down behind ... at nightfall the fields were bare and brown". Once again George went back to freighting coal and stones for Mr. Hodgson at Benoni.

In January 1897 Ida's mother came to stay, as Ida was expecting their 6th child. Their second daughter Enid was born in June. When Ida's mother returned home, Ida

and the three younger children went with her. Will and Pringle, the two eldest boys went to Ida's sister Nelly's to attend school with her children. The following year George and Ida's 7th child, a son James was born.

The rock quarry where George had found employment hauling stone was shut down, due to lack of demand, and once again the Impey family were on the move. This time they trekked from Benoni to a farm near Rietfontein which was under irrigation and had an orchard and house on the property.

Again, darkening shadows of political unrest and potential war was intensifying between the British and the Dutch. After only a few months on the farm and several unsuccessful attempts by the local Dutch residents to convince George to swear allegiance to the government of Paul Kruger, they were warned by the owner of the farm to be prepared to leave on short notice. They took these warnings seriously, and in early September 1899 the family left the farm with their horses and a few possessions. Travelling by train out of the Transvaal province to the Natal border. Once in Natal they gathered their horses and wagon and set out on a 120-mile journey to East Grigualand where Ida's mother resided. The Second Boer War was declared on October 11, 1899 between the British government and the Dutch South African Republic (Transvaal) and the Orange Free State.

We will end this installment of the Impey Family's Journey. Look for the next chapter as we follow George's involvement in the Boer War and find out where their journey will take them next.
