EVERY FAMILY SHARES A STORY

From Africa to Alberta

The Impey Family's Transcontinental Journey

Part 4: The Shadows of War

We left off chapter 3 with the Impey family leaving the Dutch controlled Transvaal State, just prior to the declaration of the Boer War in October 1899. They travelled to East Griqualand in the Eastern Cape Colony where Ida's mother and other family members resided. For the duration of the war Ida and children would remain with her family. The older boys stayed with her sister and attended school with her sister's children. In June of 1900 George and Ida welcomed another son, George... yes, another George to keep track of.

George tried to find work but due to the war none was available. He joined the East Griqualand Mounted Rifles as a volunteer, providing border defense. George's brother Dick Impey was an early casualty of the war in Natal Province.

Near the end of 1900, a call came for men who had lived in the Transvaal Province to join the Johannesburg Mounted Rifles. George enlisted for a six-month tour of duty, and was put in charge of the Military Scouts. George's knowledge of the Benoni area, where they patrolled, helped him evade capture on several occasions while on scouting duties. He returned after his six months tour to East Griqualand and rejoined the East Griqualand Mounted Rifles. George was commissioned to the rank of Captain, in charge of the Griqualand Light Horse for the remainder of the war.

The Boer War spanned almost three years, from October 11, 1899 to May 31,1902. During the early part of the war, the Dutch forces with their siege and guerrilla type tactics proved problematic to the English forces. However, with additional forces from England and several British Colonies sent to South Africa the outcome of the war eventually turned in favor of the British.


At the conclusion of the Boer War the Impey's returned to the Transvaal, and the rented farm of Mr. Jacobs, which they had vacated just prior to the war. The British military had taken over the farm to grow produce for the soldiers, but when George presented his agreement with Mr. Jacobs, they agreed to let him return to the farm and take care of the crops on a share basis. George was also able to secure eight oxen from the herd of surplus transport oxen used by the military. On arriving at the farm ...Ida writes "I could hardly recognize the place; the English and the Boers had a fight there and the

house had been shelled, and blown to pieces... also many of the fruit trees." George was to irrigate the crops as required, and harvest the crops. George and Ida would become acquainted with some of the Military Police who were providing martial law in the area and they hired Ida to bake bread for them. So once again they started over.

Mr. Jacobs, the owner of the farm, had been taken as a prisoner of war by the British forces and sent to Celyon for the duration of the Boer War. In 1903 he returned to his farm, but wouldn't continue the lease of his farm to George and Ida. After they harvested their crops, they moved into Pretoria and George returned to transporting freight. Their family was expanding again, another son Hugh was born in January 1904. The family now consisted of George and Ida plus six sons and two daughters.

It was about this time George and Ida started to hear a great deal about the new colony of British East Africa, which would become Kenya. Sir Charles Elliot was governor of British East Africa, at the time, was instructed to invite settlers from South Africa with farming experience to take up land in the new colony on easy terms. Until this time, George and Ida had only been able to rent or lease farms on a crop share basis. This arrangement had not proven to be a long-term stable arrangement. The lure of cheap land and opportunity likely played a significant role in their decision to leave South Africa and relocate to British East Africa.

Well, the Impeys are on the move again! We will pick up the story as they leave South Africa and start out on the next leg of their journey.




FUN ALBERTA FACTS ABOUT CITIES AND TOWNS
