

10 Back-to-School Tips for Kids and Parents

The new school year means new friends, teachers, clothes, and classrooms. It's normal for kids (and their parents) to feel anxious about returning to school. Here are some simple ways to ease the transition from vacation-mode to school-mode.

Whatever their age, many kids are apprehensive about starting school or going back to school. The good news is there's a lot you can do to ease their minds and help them get ready for a new school year.

1. Early to bed, early to rise

Getting back into a school sleep schedule, Link opens in a new window. won't happen overnight! A few weeks before school starts, get your child into the habit of going to bed earlier. Gentle winding-down activities such as bath time and reading before bed can help your child relax

2. Re-establish a routine

Establishing a consistent routine is important for kids. Write out the steps in the routine and rehearse them with your child. In the evening, this could include doing homework, playtime, brushing their teeth, having a bath, and reading before bed.

3. Encourage independence

Children who play an active role in preparing for back to school - such as choosing and organizing school supplies and new clothes - are more likely to get excited about going back to school, which in turn eases their jitters. Is your child old enough for chores like emptying the dishwasher or making lunches? Daily, ageappropriate tasks will help your child gain independence and confidence.

4. Choose the right backpack

Backpacks that are too heavy or worn improperly could result in muscle strain, headaches, and neck pain. Try to choose a backpack made of sturdy, lightweight fabric with wide, padded straps that will support your child's shoulders. Watch that they don't sling it over just one shoulder.

5. Talk about safety

Review outdoor safety rules - things like looking both ways before crossing the street, taking the same route every day if they are walking, familiarizing themselves with crosswalk rules, and being cautious in talking to strangers.

6. Establish healthy habits

Involve your children in choosing and preparing healthy lunches and snacks. Help them find physical activities they enjoy. Take them shopping for healthy snacks and lunch items , they can pack themselves. Try to stick to regular meal times.

7. Limit screen time

Back to school is the perfect opportunity to re-establish screen time limits. Why not have the whole family "unplug" in the evenings before bedtime? Choose a spot where everybody can charge their devices overnight. Use an alarm clock instead of a cellphone to wake up in the mornings.

8. Map it out

If your kids are starting at a new school, practice walking or driving to the bus stop or to the school building a week or two before school starts. You could even play in the school playground before school starts. This creates fun memories associated with the school before summer vacation ends.

9. Talk about first-week jitters

- Reassure your child that being nervous is natural even for teachers. You can help your child cope with these feelings when you:
- · Let them express their fears. Perhaps you can offer stories of your own first-day jitters when you were a child.
- Teach them to breathe deeply and slowly to calm their nerves.
- Discuss the scenarios that worry them. For example, if they're worried about who to sit with or talk to on the first day, help them plan a strategy and rehearse it so they'll know what to do.

10. Celebrate the start of a new school year

If you celebrate the first day of school, your kids will see back-to-school as a transition they can really enjoy. Try a back-to-school party the day before school starts, complete with cake, balloons and educational gifts. And don't forget to take a picture on the front step in their firstday-of-school outfits. It's going to be a great year!

Breton Community Chili Cook Off



- Each team is responsible for all cooking utensils, extension cords, power bar, set up and clean up. Please keep chili tightly covered when not serving. Any remaining chili must be taken home by the group entering.
- You may provide additional items to accompany your chili (ie - cheese, tortilla chips, sour cream).
- Bowls, and spoons will be provided. Additional meal items such as veggie tray, dessert and refreshments will be provided by the Breton Agricultural Society and Breton FCSS.





EVERY FAMILY SHARES A STORY

From Africa to Alberta

The Impey Family's Transcontinental Journey

Part 5: On the Road Again

We pick up the Impey family story in April 1904 with their decision to leave South Africa and move to the new Colony of British East Africa, where it was advertised land was available on easy terms. They joined a party with ten other families travelling to the new colony. The family left Pretoria travelling by train to Delago Bay, Mozambique, where they boarded a ship bound for British East Africa. They transferred to another ship in Zanzibar before continuing on to Mombasa. Their stop in Mombasa was brief, but Ida does comment that "it was a smelly dirty place". The final leg of the trip was by train to Nairobi, which at the time was nothing more than a tent town.

Several European countries had previously colonized parts of Africa, but in 1885 the Berlin Conference established guidelines among the colonizing countries on how Africa would be divided up between: England, France, Germany, Belgium and to a lesser extent Spain, Italy and Portugal.

When the British Government took over administrating British East Africa, they advertised available land on easy terms. The British government soon changed their mind and land was given out as large land grants to

wealthy individuals and companies, especially near the rail lines. many cases the grantee hired people, like George and Ida, to carry out the improvements which had to be performed before receiving title to the land. However, the Homestead Act in Western Canada made 160 acres of land available to individuals for a nominal filing fee of ten dollars. After completing the required duties individuals were granted title to their land.


Now back to George and Ida. George found property near Lumbwa where they stayed about

two years, however the high altitude caused George's health to suffer from malaria. Due to George's poor health they moved to a farm owned by a Russel Bowkers, called Wild Dogs Run on the Ronga River. When Wild Dogs Run was sold, they moved nearby to manage a farm owned by Mr. Sargeant. It was here that George and Ida's youngest son Richard "Dick" was born in 1908. The family now consisted of seven sons and two daughters. George continued to freight to help with finances. The family was growing up, the three eldest sons now assisted George hauling freight.

About 1910, George was contacted by Mr. Grant who had received a land grant of 10.000 acres at Eldama Ravine. Mr. Grant needed a house and improvements carried out before he could receive title to his land grant. In return, for George building a five-room burnt brick house, performing the improvements required and living on the property, Mr. Grant would transfer to George and Ida one thousand acres where the house was located. They moved to land selecting a location for the house and suitable soil for making bricks they constructed the house. Things were starting to look up for George and Ida, in time they received title to the house and 1000 acres, calling their farm "Ettrick". The farm was located a mile from the District Commissioner's Station, post office and several small stores. Land was prepared for the planting of mielie (corn), along with many fruit trees and a large garden. George, along with his sons would continue to haul freight with large wagons pulled by eight yokes (16 head) of oxen. The two eldest sons: William and Pringle, now adults in their early twenties, returned to South Africa to seek careers. Life seemed good, but the storm clouds of war were starting to form over Europe. The upcoming conflict would dramatically impact the people of Europe, and the Impey family in distant British East Africa. Look forward to the next chapter of the Impey story.

Council sets an interim budget each fall before adopting a final budget in the spring.



A PROVINCE WIDE CURRICULUM PILOT

Alberta News, August 23, 2024

The new draft kindergarten to Grade 6 (K-6) social studies curriculum will be piloted by more than 1,700 teachers across the province starting this September.

Alberta's government and its education partners are continuing to modernize the education system and improve student success by developing and piloting a curriculum that will drive a passion for learning. The new draft K-6 social studies curriculum, which was developed after nine months of consultation with education partners, teachers, parents and Albertans, focuses on building students' critical thinking skills and empowers them to be engaged citizens.

Since the new draft K-6 social studies curriculum was released in April 2024, 62 school authorities and more than 1,700 teachers across 429 schools have signed up to pilot the curriculum during the 2024-25 school year.

Content changes

Following extensive engagement with Albertans and education partners since August 2023, as well as research and best practices from other jurisdictions, Alberta Education released an updated draft K-6 social studies curriculum in April 2024 to help school authorities and teachers prepare for optional classroom piloting, beginning in September. Draft curriculum content was adjusted to:

- strengthen opportunities that encourage the development of critical thinking skills, including research and analytical skills, throughout the curriculum:
- enhance the development of skills related to the concept of active citizenship;
- address feedback on developmental appropriateness and load;
- engage students in learning that promotes understanding of diversity across Canada and throughout the world, including First Nations, Métis, Inuit and francophone histories, contributions and perspectives; and
- reflect the growth of learners through learning progressions that expand from individual experiences to communities and beyond.

Supports and resources for school authorities

Alberta's government is providing flexibility in how school authorities participate in optional classroom piloting, including which grades are a part of the pilot and how many learning outcomes will receive feedback. Throughout the piloting process, teachers will be provided with the information and tools they need to work with the draft curriculum in their classrooms, including:

- teacher release days to support planning and instruction preparation;
- · learning and teaching resources;

- professional learning opportunities; and
- opportunities to provide feedback to Alberta Education on the draft curriculum, including how it is experienced in classrooms.

Teachers can access comprehensive learning and teaching resources and professional learning supports aligned with draft curriculum, including subject-specific overviews, quick reference videos, illustrative examples and fact sheets online. Piloting teachers can also collaborate with colleagues across Alberta through an online teacher planning tool called Boards.

Alberta Education will consider all feedback from classroom piloting to finalize the new K-6 social studies curriculum and identify additional learning and teaching resources prior to provincial implementation. The final K-6 social studies curriculum is expected to be implemented in classrooms starting in September 2025.

Quick facts

- Budget 2024 provides \$34 million to support curriculum piloting and implementation in the 2024-25 school year.
- As part of the curriculum engagement process, Alberta Education also gathered feedback to update the ministerial order on Student Learning and the Guiding Framework for the Design and Development of Kindergarten to Grade 12 Curriculum.
- The new ministerial order focuses on career education, knowledge and skills development, educational programming and preparing students to be active and engaged citizens.
- The new Guiding Framework focuses on inclusive language and representation of diverse voices, includes content to align with new curriculum and removes references to pedagogy.
- Currently, there are more than 450 learning and teaching resources aligned to draft K-6 social studies curriculum available online.
- The 62 school authorities piloting draft social studies curriculum can be broken down by school authority type as follows:
 - 31 public
- 16 independent
- 9 separate
- 2 francophone
- 3 public charter
- 1 First Nations
