Calmar Collegiate Secondary School: Creating pathways to student success in the skilled trades

The Black Gold School Division's Board of Trustees joined elected officials and educational and industry partners at a groundbreaking ceremony today to mark the beginning of construction of a new addition to Calmar Secondary School, which will provide local and area students with clear pathways into post-secondary education and careers in the skilled trades and other fields.

"The Town of Calmar is honored to have been the chosen destination for the introduction of a new collegiate type school format," said Mayor Sean Carnahan. "Calmar Secondary School already houses a nationally recognized machining program with many local students standing on the podium in national competitions. The addition of carpentry, electrical and plumbing trades will make the school a well-rounded educational institution that will support education in both academic and vocational studies. We look forward to this new partnership and the successes it can bring all future students in their career aspirations and goals."

The new Calmar Collegiate Secondary School will be equipped with industry-standard equipment and resources to support both academic and skilled trades education, ensuring that all students receive a well-rounded and future-ready education.

The school will provide specialized programming for students in grades 7-12 for careers in the skilled trades (enhanced career explorations, work experience and/or registered apprenticeship programs) as part of their high school graduation requirements.

High school students looking to pursue careers in the skilled trades will be offered specialized programming to help them complete their first period Apprenticeship training. They can earn both high school credits and post-secondary credits through Northern Lakes College.

"We've had a strong, ongoing partnership with the Black Gold School Division for a number of years offering dualcredit opportunities for their students," said Dr. Puneet Arora, Dean of Business, Academics, Trades and Regional Stewardship at Northern Lakes College. "Our partnership is now at a new stage with the school division entering into a collegiate model in that we will now be able to offer students with pre-employment programs in the trades, especially in carpentry and electrical. We are also exploring the opportunity to offer a plumbing program, and in the future we hope to offer these programs to the adults in the community as well."

The school's initial focus will be on the carpentry, electrical, and plumbing skilled trades. Students will participate in work experience and registered apprenticeship programs, so partnerships with business and industry are critical to student success.

Calmar Collegiate Secondary School will continue to provide excellent academic programming in addition to its robust skilled trades programs. Students not pursuing the trades will have access to courses in business, finance, management and entrepreneurship, as well as fine arts and design studies, sports, technology, and more. They will also play a central role in the marketing of the projects created by their peers.







LEDUC COUNTY HISTORY

In 1991 the County of Leduc No. 25 under the direction of History Book Committee - Marjorie Bilar, Edward Chubocha, Robert MacDonald and Phyllis Schnick published "County of Leduc No. 25 History - A Pictoral and Anecdotal Collection" by Katheryn McNalley. Thank you to Leduc County for granting me permission to quote excerpts to share with our Leduc County residents. Here is another bit of interesting history...

Hamlets and Locals

pages 165-167 "County of Leduc No. 25 History" 1991

As the homesteaders began to carve up the wilderness, frontier entrepreneurs answered their needs for local supply depots and post offices, and tiny settlements began to appear across the County of Leduc landscape. In addition to post offices and general stores, many of these small centres offered blacksmith shops, hotels, and in later years, grain elevators, pool halls, and service stations. Hamlets were the heart of the farming communities, but with the dwindling rural population most have been severely reduced in size and others are but a memory.

Alsike - Alsike's name originated from the clover that was grown in the vicinity. This community provided a landmark at the junction of Highway 39 and Highway 12.

Berrymoor - The name conjures visions of ripe and juicy wild berries available for the picking, an apt description. Berrymoor is also known for the much used ferry, at one time the only method of crossing the mighty North Saskatchewan.

Buford - Buford, named for the new settlers' home town in North Dakota, provided for the needs of its Scandinavian inhabitants, and its cheese factory attracted many surrounding residents. As the railway was extended from Thorsby to Leduc, and new settlement was established on the rail line and it assumed the name Buford. Although the location was different, farmers travelled to the new Buford, this time with grain wagons loaded, destined for the grain elevators. The population of Buford today is 46. The original location became known as Glen Park.

Buck Creek - Harry Nielsen was a founder of this oil boom town, established in response to the needs of the voracious energy industry. The settlement quickly became a bustling burg, but has quieted in recent years with a current population of 89.

Carnwood - Carnwood, originally meant to be Cornwood after a parish in Devonshire, England, is a well-known landmark on Highway 57. **Clover Lawn** - This district was first known as Little Hay Lake. Upon building a new school in 1941, the locals renamed the school for the field of clover planted next to it. The district and general store soon became known by this attractive name, and a thriving community hall perpetuates the name today.

Fisher Home - The shore of Pigeon Lake, site of Fisher Home, is now primarily recognized for recreational purposes. In years past however, fishing was an important industry in this lake, with the delectable whitefish being shipped to such distant locales as Chicago and New York City.

Genesee - Bert White named this hamlet for his former hometown of Genesee, Idaho. It is said that is an Iroquois word meaning "valley beautiful". The site of the once-thriving settlement is now the location of the Genesee Power Project and the actual site of the hamlet is now covered by the power facility's cooling pond.

Glen Park - Glen Park was originally known as Buford, but assumed a new name when a community established on the rail line was named Buford. Glen Park housed a settlement of Scandinavians, and a cheese factory once graced the hamlet.

Ireton - Ireton was named after Henry Ireton (1611 - 1651) who was a general during England's Civil War serving under Oliver Cromwell. This community is now the site of a seed-cleaning plant.

Kavanagh - This landmark community on Highway 2A was named for Charles Edmund Kavanagh, one- time superintendent of the Royal Mail Service in Winnipeg.

Looma - A general store, community hall and a scattering of houses, bordered by a railway and Highway 21, Looma offers all of the qualities of a typical County of Leduc hamlet. The population as of 1990 records 23 residents.

Lindale - Early settler, Charles Lindell named the first post office Lindale. The first homesteaders arrived in 1905, others followed in their footsteps for many years after. The population of the hamlet today is 28.

Michigan Centre - The founders of this thriving farming community named the centre for their previous home, the state of Michigan.

Mission Beach - A community rich in history, Mission Beach derives its name from its proximity to Rundle's Mission.

Nisku - The Cree word for "wildgoose" offers a descriptive name for this tiny community. Today 48 residents continue to make their homes in this hamlet, adjacent to the Nisku Business Industrial Park.

Rolly View - Rolly View, the name chosen by Sally Schmidt, aptly describes the rolling hills of this active dairy farming community. The picturesque hamlet has a current population of 66 residents.

St. Francis - Originally known as Pokehasset, this small community was renamed by the post office during the mid-'40's. This pretty, western community currently houses 12 residents.


Sunnybrook - The sun glinting on a sparkling brook, a descriptive name. This Highway-39 institution was once the headquarters for the Municipal District of Pioneer, and is now home to 66 residents.

Telfordville - Telfordville agricultural fairs were attended by residents from far and wide in the County of Leduc. The picture-perfect setting of this small settlement contributed to the success of these fun occasions. Telfordville, named for local resident and MLA, R.T. Telford, is now home to 13 residents.

Our towns - big or small, old or new - continue to play a vital role in rural community life. Small-town Alberta offers a wholesome lifestyle and upbringing for children. Sadly, the trend toward centralization in industry, educational, recreational, health and retail facilities has jeopardized the survival of these small centres. Recognition of this trend has resulted in a commendable focus on retaining their viability through decentralization and innovation. Councils and residents are working hand in hand to revitalize and repopulate each town, village and hamlet. More power to them - let's go to town!



FEDERAL GOVERNMENT CUTS FUNDING FOR ALBERTA WORKERS

Alberta News, August 7, 2024

Minister of Jobs, Economy and Trade Matt Jones issued the following statement on the Canada-Alberta Job Grant:

"As a result of Ottawa's unexpected and unreasonable decision to cut \$70.8 million in Labour Market Transfer Agreement (LMTA) funding for Alberta, our government has been forced to put an indefinite hold on the Canada-Alberta Job Grant program for the remainder of the 2024-25 fiscal year.

"Despite several letters to the federal government, including Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and Minister of Employment, Workforce Development and Official Languages Randy Boissonnault urging reason, the federal government has proceeded with their LMTA cut for Alberta's workers.

"As a result of this cut, Alberta's employers will be short roughly \$10 million in skills and training funding for 2024-25. This means approximately 1,000 businesses, and the training for up to 4,000 Albertan employees, will be impacted.

"LMTAs support important workforce development programs that help Albertans get the training they need to find and keep good jobs. This includes the Canada-Alberta Job Grant program, which provided nearly \$27 million in 2023-24 to Alberta employers so new workers could be properly trained. This funding also supported existing employees in gaining job-related skills, with small- and medium-sized businesses receiving approximately 80 per cent of the overall funding.

"This cut to funding has serious, far-reaching consequences for workers and comes at a time when Alberta continues to face critical skills shortages in several industries, including construction, health care and education. The Canada-Alberta Job Grant program has helped thousands of Albertans close skills gaps, further strengthening Alberta's labour market and growing our economy.

"Our government understands the impact a strong and skilled labour force has on the success of Alberta's economy. Alberta's government is working hard to develop and implement new employer-led training programs that will provide Albertans with similar opportunities to learn job-related skills.

"While we are disappointed with the federal government's decision to cut LMTA funding, we remain committed to addressing labour shortages and skilledtraining gaps through innovative programs that meet the needs of employers, training providers and industry, both now and in the future."


