

Community Information Night - Celebrate Breton & Chili Cook Off - Tuesday September 24

This will be a time for community members to plan their fall activities, volunteer commitments and know of all the services available in and around our community, along with learning about the great businesses we have in our area.

This evening is designed to do the following:

- * To give your agency / organization the opportunity to let the community know who you are and what services and/or purpose you give to the community and surrounding area.
- * If you hold a registration night for your group this could be done at the same time.
- * If your agency is in need of recruiting new members or volunteers this would be a time for community members to see what groups are operating and decide where they would like to commit some of their time.
- * Promote your business or services that you provide to the area. Use it for staff recruitment.

Breton FCSS will be coordinating this evening. We are adding a twist to this year's event and inviting any groups / businesses that would like to be a part of a Chili Cook Off. The Cook Off will be organized by the Breton Agricultural Society.

Breton Community Chili Cook Off

- * All entries must be pre-assembled, cooked and kept in a slow cooker, hot and ready to serve. We encourage a variety - meatless, spicy, white, or surprise ingredient. Please have a list of ingredients displayed (for food allergies)
- * All ingredients must come from approved food sources, so it's absolutely safe for public consumption (No roadkill)!
- * Each team is responsible for all cooking utensils, extension cords, power bar, set up and clean up. Please keep chili tightly covered when not serving. Any remaining chili must be taken home by the group entering.
- * You may provide additional items to accompany your chili (ie - cheese, tortilla chips, sour cream).
- * Bowls, and spoons will be provided. Additional meal items such as veggie tray, dessert and refreshments will be provided by the Breton Agricultural Society and Breton FCSS.
- * Teams are encouraged, urged and otherwise motivated to decorate their area and themselves. This will encourage residents (judges) to visit your booth and learn about your organization / business. You will be given a 6ft table for your organization's information for the information night and a second table for your chili entry display.
- * Each contestant will be assigned a contestant number. Serving will be from 4:30 - 7:00 pm
- * Judges will be the citizens that visit and sample your chili. The public will each be given 3 tickets to vote for their favorite chili. The team with the most tickets wins. It's up to you to entice them to try your chili and cast their vote for you. The more chili you have, the more votes you can get - but a minimum of 2 gallons is required.
- * The winning entries will be announced at 7:30 pm. The winning entries will be presented with a big bragging-rights and awards. The decision of the judges is final.







From Africa to Alberta

The Impey Family's Transcontinental Journey

Part 6: The Agony of War Strike Again

As mentioned in the previous article, things were starting to look up for the Impey family. They had finally acquired property, in return for building a house and carrying out other required improvements, Mr. Grant transferred the house and surrounding 1000 acres to George and Ida from his land grant of 10,000 acres. We pick up the story in 1912 with the Impey's settling on their new farm, located just north of the equator, at Eldama Ravine, British East Africa, named Ettrick.

Life went on for the next couple of years. Crops were planted and harvested; an orchard of fruit trees were started, plus a garden. George and his son Alan continued to freight with their oxen and large wagons from Londiani to Eldoret. In 1913, Alan took the family on an extended safari, travelling with their wagons to Lake Naivasha and the Nandi border, hunting antelope and water buffalo, where they made large quantities of beltong (dried jerky).


August 1914 changed the lives of the Impey family and thousands of other families, when Great Britain declared war on Germany, after Germany invaded neutral Belgium. Much of the world was plunged into conflict with the start of WWI. Many thought it would be over by Christmas, but it would be over four years before Germany would surrender on November 11, 1918. When we think of WWI, our mind goes to muddy bombed out battlefields and the trenches of France and Belgium. However, much of the world beyond Europe was pulled into the conflict. Colonial Africa was no exception. The continent of Africa had been colonized by several European nations now embroiled in the war. Although thousands of miles away from Europe, British East Africa bordered German East Africa.

George and Alan were hauling freight, when they received news that war had been declared. Once back at Eldoret, Alan came by the farm to tell his mother he was volunteering for border defense between British East Africa and German East Africa. Ida writes in her memoir ... ***"next morning early he said goodbye, mounted and rode off. Turning just once as he galloped up the road to wave his hand. I can still see him."*** On September 23, 1914, Allan Impey along with several other soldiers were killed at Ingito Hill. George's wagon and oxen had also been commandeered by the military

to haul military supplies. He was put in charge of a convoy of wagons travelling to Nairobi, and on arrival enlisted as Chief Transport Officer. This left Ida, her two daughters and four younger sons to run the farm. Ida writes... ***"Life had to go on, I first had to gather up my courage and carry on."***

Late in 1914 George came home on leave, when he returned his son James accompanied him and enlisted. Not quite seventeen, James was assigned to help transport supplies. William and Pringle, enlisted in South Africa, William with a Transvaal unit and Pringle with the King's African Rifles, where he served as an interpreter. George fell ill, late in 1916, and was sent to a hospital in Nairobi to recuperate, before being discharged from the army. He returned home in early 1917, thin and suffering from malaria. It would take him several months before the fever left and his health recovered.

Prior to the war's end, their eldest son William was discharged from the army due to health issues. He returned to Johannesburg continuing to work in the mines. Their second son Pringle obtained a farm near Eldoret, but carried on hauling freight. Alan, their third son, had paid the supreme sacrifice early in the war. James, the fourth son would return to Eldoret where he found work on road construction. "The War to End All Wars" was finally over; it was time to pick up where the family had left off four years earlier. Look forward to the next chapter.

Renting from Trudeau is Not the Canadian Dream

As a Member of Parliament, I constantly hear from Canadians who feel that the dream of homeownership is slipping further out of reach. The Trudeau government's latest housing announcement does nothing to change that. Instead of empowering Canadians to own their homes, this plan keeps them renting—literally—from the government.

The idea of converting federal lands into housing might seem promising at first. Selling off unused public land to create homes is something Conservatives have long proposed. But here's where the Liberals' plan goes off the rails: instead of selling the land to Canadians, they want to lease it to developers, ensuring that Canadians remain tenants, not homeowners. This approach does nothing to address the underlying issues that have made housing so unaffordable in our country.

Under this plan, Canadians won't build equity, and they won't gain the security that comes with owning both their home and the land it sits on. Instead, they'll be stuck in a cycle of rent, at the mercy of government-controlled leases that could change at any time. 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FIRST YEAR OF RURAL COMMUNITY NURSING PROGRAM BEGINS

DRAYTON VALLEY – Nine students from the Drayton Valley area are set to start their studies and gain hands-on training on their way to obtaining a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree — all without having to leave their home community.

Offered for the first time in Drayton Valley this year, the rural community nursing program builds on the successes Alberta Health Services (AHS) and University of Calgary (UCalgary) have experienced in Wainwright since jointly launching the program there in 2021.

"I am thrilled to see this program launch in Drayton Valley," says Andrew Boitchenko, MLA for Drayton Valley-Devon. "This is an excellent opportunity for students interested in a future in healthcare to be able to learn close to home, and a chance for them to experience first-hand all that rural healthcare has to offer."

Kelsey Letendre, a local licensed practical nurse (LPN) at the Drayton Valley Hospital and Care Centre, is among the first cohort of students. She embraces the opportunity to further her education without having to leave for the city.

"Having this program available in smaller, rural communities not only makes the degree much more accessible but gives students the supports of home," says Letendre. "I grew up here. I've been working here for 10 years. Knowing I have the support of my family, coworkers and manager at the hospital all right here with me has made it easier to take this next step in my career. I'm looking forward to growing as a nurse and continuing to care for my community for years to come."

For AHS, the opportunity to collaborate with partners to grow local talent supports not only students but the future of rural healthcare, as well.

"We do face challenges in recruiting nursing staff to rural sites," says Janice Stewart, Chief Zone Officer with AHS Central Zone. "By creating opportunities to educate registered nurses in their home communities, we are building capacity for a local, more sustainable workforce into the future. That is good news for our rural hospitals, and for patients and families in the community."

The program was developed as a way of reducing barriers to learning, recruiting students to healthcare careers, and encouraging graduates to stay in their home communities.

Students of the Drayton Valley program will take part in

both in-person and virtual learning opportunities, gaining valuable skills and hands-on experience from instructors and seasoned nurses. New educational spaces have been established in collaboration with the Town of Drayton Valley, which has been a key partner in getting the program launched in the community.

"Having supportive community partners is integral to our ability to provide an excellent academic and clinical experience for students," says Dr. Catherine Laing, Dean of the UCalgary Faculty of Nursing. "We are grateful to work with partners who have an important stake in ensuring we are meeting the healthcare needs of our communities across Alberta."

For the Town of Drayton Valley, supporting the program aligns with its ongoing work to support local healthcare.

"We are absolutely thrilled to welcome the first cohort of nursing students to Drayton Valley as part of this groundbreaking rural community nursing program," says Mayor Nancy Dodds. "This is an incredible opportunity for our local students to pursue their passion for healthcare right here in Drayton Valley. Not only does this program make a nursing degree more accessible, but it also strengthens our commitment to building a sustainable healthcare workforce in rural Alberta. We are excited to support these students on their journey and to see the positive impact they will have on our community for years to come."

The Drayton Valley program will run for two cohorts of students, with intakes this year and next, with the goal of preparing 18 nursing graduates. Students will have the option to complete their final preceptorships in a compressed timeline to graduate in 2027 or can opt for a more traditional program timeline, which would see them graduate in 2028.


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
