



EVERY FAMILY SHARES A STORY

From Africa to Alberta

The Impey Family's Transcontinental Journey

Part 8: The Long Journey

We left off the last chapter with the sale of the Impey farm at Eldama Ravine. In August 1922, the 15,000km long trek from Africa to Alberta began for George and Ida Impey, along with their daughters Effie and Enid and three youngest sons George Hugh and Dick. The three older sons William, Pringle and James, who had all married, would remain in Africa, at least for the time being.

Numerous trunks and crates were packed up: including treasured personal possessions, George's carpentry tools, and numerous sets of horns from their hunts in Africa. Whether they realized it or not...I suspect... George and Ida knew they would not be returning to Kenya; this was to be their last great journey. George would go ahead to Nairobi to finalize the paperwork for the sale of the farm. With their possessions packed and final goodbyes said, Ida and the children climbed into a wagon that would take them to Londani to catch the train for Nairobi where they met George.

From Nairobi, they travelled by train to the coastal port of Mombasa, where they had to wait a week for the ship coming up from South Africa. Once the ship arrived, cargo and passengers were loaded. Dick writes they set sail during afternoon tea. Within a couple hours of sailing, the ship was hit by a monsoon rain storm in the Indian Ocean that would last seven days. The ship's Captain ordered the hatches battened down, and all passengers confined below deck, until the storm subsided. It goes without saying that many of the passengers suffered from seasickness during the storm.

Once the weather cleared the passengers participated in deck games and the trip was quite pleasant. After many days at sea, they sighted land as they passed the Horn of Africa and entered the Gulf of Aden. While anchored off shore the native Arabs came out on their small boats peddling local made goods. The ship continued up the Red Sea and entered the Suez Canal, where progress slowed as they had to wait for ships passing through the canal from the other direction. Once through the Suez Canal, they entered the Mediterranean Sea where the weather was warm and the water calm. The family enjoyed passing the time with games as the ship made its way past Sicily, the toe of Italy and Corsica, docking at Marseilles, France.

Both Ida and Effie had been in poor health on the voyage; it was recommended that if they continued by ship to England, they could encounter very rough seas through the Bay of Biscay and the Atlantic Ocean. It was decided to take the train from Marseilles to Paris and the French coast at Calais. Here they booked passage on a small boat to take them across the English Channel to Dover. Dick Impey writes... "Then taking the train on to London through the big fruit orchards in Kent, ...it was nice to see so many green trees after all that water."

The Impey family had to wait two weeks in London until their luggage arrived by ship. While in London, George made travel arrangements to Canada, and the family took time to go sightseeing and shopping. They had booked passage on a ship leaving Liverpool; however, the ship was diverted and they were rescheduled to sail on the S.S. Victorian from Greenock, Scotland. The S.S. Victorian took about six days to cross the Atlantic Ocean. While on the ocean crossing the Impey's meet a young girl by the name of Alice Ashby who was travelling to Regina, Saskatchewan for a job. Alice had a tea pot and some cups; she would make tea for Ida and serve it in Ida's cabin. Remember the name Alice, as she will reappear next time.

The boat docked in Quebec City where the Impeys cleared customs and boarded the CPR train for the last leg of their journey. Travelling by CPR colonist car, they travelled westward to Montreal and Winnipeg and to their final destination Edmonton.

Dick Impey, who was about fourteen at the time of the journey, later wrote in detail his memories of the trip. While Ida, in her writing, describes life in Africa in much greater detail than the trip to Canada, she does write. "In October 1922 after a tiring but uneventful journey, we landed in Canada and reached Edmonton on the 10 October." Now isn't that the understatement of the year! The trip was most likely very tiring ...but uneventful ... I don't think so. We will pick up the story next time as the Impey's file on a homestead and move to Wenham Valley.



ALBERTA OPPOSES FEDERAL GOVERNMENT PLANS

Alberta News, September 12, 2024

Premier Danielle Smith issued the following statement on the federal government's asylum claimants relocation plan:

"Alberta's government is opposed to the federal government's plan to relocate tens of thousands of asylum claimants to Alberta, especially without any financial assistance to support the province in doing so.

"Alberta has always welcomed newcomers who possess our shared values – and we will continue to do so.

"However, last year alone, an all-time record of over 200,000 people moved to Alberta. That's like adding two new Red Deer-sized cities in just one year.

"Although Alberta represents only 11.8 per cent of the Canadian population, we are currently supporting approximately 22 per cent (over 70,000) of Ukrainian evacuees who arrived in Canada.

"Section 95 of the constitution is clear – immigration is an area of shared authority between the federal government and the provinces. Yet, the Trudeau government's unrestrained open border policies permitting well over a million newcomers each year into Canada is causing significant challenges, and it's simply not sustainable.

"Excessive levels of immigration to this province are increasing the cost of living and strains public services for everyone.

"We are informing the Government of Canada that until further notice, Alberta is not open to having these additional asylum seekers settled in our province.

"We simply cannot afford it."

Know warning signs of potential suicidal thoughts, plans

EDMONTON – September 10 was World Suicide Prevention Day, and Alberta Health Services (AHS) reminds Albertans that recognizing the risk factors and potential signs of suicidal thoughts is important and can be helpful in preventing death by suicide.

In adults, warning signs of potential suicidal thoughts or plans include:

- Talking or writing about wanting to die or to hurt or kill themselves or someone else.
- Saying they feel hopeless, trapped, without purpose, in pain, or like they're a burden to others.
- Looking for ways to harm themselves. For example, they might buy a gun or stockpile medicines.
- · Increasing their use of alcohol or drugs.
- Withdrawing from family, friends and activities.
- Seeming angry, grumpy, anxious or depressed.
- Eating or sleeping less or more than usual.
- Doing risky things, such as driving too fast.
- · Giving away their belongings.

People can also be more at risk of suicide when they experience barriers accessing social and health services, mental illness, traumatic life events, family violence, discrimination or have a diagnosis of a serious physical illness. Talking about suicide is one of the most effective means of reducing stigma and supporting those in need.

Albertans are encouraged to use the REACH Pathway to help remember what you can do to support someone who is struggling:

- Recognize when someone is struggling.
- Engage in conversation and listen with empathy.
- Ask directly about suicidal thoughts and feelings.
- Connect to support and resources.
- Heal yourself by taking care of your own mental health.

Together, we can help prevent suicide by showing understanding and compassion and by encouraging people experiencing mental health challenges to reach out for support.



According to the Urban Dictionary, Assumicide means, "When your assumptions lead to dire consequences that could lead to your potential demise, you commit assumicide."

I think of it this way. It is the way that we murder people in our hearts.

ARE YOU GUILTY OF ASSUMICIDE?

We are conditioned by the media and by society as a whole, to be suspicious. We are offended or hurt so easily. We look for evidence that someone did us wrong. It is amazing how often we jump to conclusions that are truly unfounded, at times based on the smallest signs of evidence.

Examples: He didn't call me back so he must not want to talk to me. They never hire people like me.

Look at the way she moves, she really thinks she is better than everyone else. You cannot trust someone who dresses like that. Never trust anyone that is not like "us."

When the person who is financially struggling gives to a need, they are seen as a martyr. If someone who is financially wealthy gives, we may think that they are doing it for notoriety. Few things hurt more than being wrongfully accused, misjudged, or betrayed. There are those who will choose to misunderstand, no matter what we say or do.

Fact is, if we are a victim of assumicide, our best defense is an honest, non-defensive response.

However, we cannot control how people respond to us. What we can control is how we choose to react.

Warren Wiersbe said, "If you live to please people, misunderstandings will depress you; but if you live to please God, you can face misunderstandings with faith and courage."

It is not easy to always respond with a smile, but it sure is healthy!


