BRETON YOUTH CENTRE

It takes a Village to raise a child is the age-old wisdom behind the development of the Breton Youth Center. The BYC started in 2022 in response to youth voices saying they needed something to do outside of school and organized sports. There was a desire to have a 'third place' where youth can enjoy fun, free activities with adult supervisors. Across the province youth are experiencing increased anxiety, stress and social isolation, our small community is not an exception.

In response to the research and youth voice, the Brazeau Healthy Communities Coalition (HCC) struck a subcommittee to work on the development of the BYC. HCC is a non-for-profit group of service providers, municipalities, agencies and community members working together to build healthier communities. The BYC goal was to provide a safe, supportive place where youth can experience new opportunities, overcome barriers, build positive relationships, and develop confidence and skills for life. The BYC welcomes ALL youth grades 6-12 within Breton and the surrounding area. The BYC is a public space and therefore 100% inclusive and safe for everyone.

The subcommittee worked in partnership with the Village of Breton and Breton FCSS to secure a space downstairs at the Carolyn Strand Civic Center. Youth from Breton High School cleaned, painted and repaired the space alongside adult mentors. Through generous community donations and grants from Weyerhaeuser and Pembina Pipeline, the BYC has become a beautiful space where youth can feel safe and welcomed. The space boasts a small pool table, ping pong, air hockey, foosball and numerous family friendly board games. The space also accommodates a sensory room, kitchen area and flexible common space for arts & crafts, movies and performances. The BYC is equipped with a karaoke machine, sensory sound machines, speakers, a popcorn machine and so much more!

The BYC opened their doors in May of 2023 with a few events a month. All the activities at the BYC are provided

by screened volunteers or community service providers. Service providers may offer activities that touch on mental wellness such as mindfulness, stress and emotion management and healthy relationships. The BYC volunteers offer opportunities for positive social interaction, a creative outlet and adult mentorship. Volunteers design their own activity based on their gifts and time they have to offer. Currently we offer activities 3-4 times a week such as Drama Club, Taco Thursdays, Music, Bible and Pizza Fridays, Family Resource Network crafting days, Indigenous teachings, and special events 1-2 times a month on Saturdays. This month's special event is "Name That Tune"!

We want to thank everyone for their support in making the BYC a reality. Thank you to all our partners, funders and especially our youth for trusting us by expressing what you want. Keep talking, we are listening!

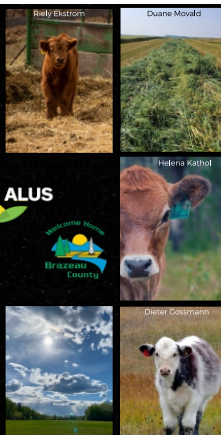

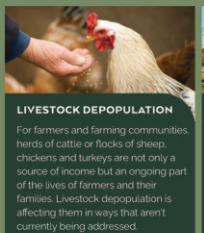

COMPETITIVE COMPENSATION FOR RESIDENT PHYSICIANS

Alberta News October 9, 2024

A new compensation agreement for resident physicians has been reached, which will help to retain and recruit more physicians throughout Alberta.

Alberta's government, in partnership with Alberta Health Services (AHS), the University of Alberta, University of Calgary and the Professional Association of Resident Physicians of Alberta has reached a four-year agreement that provides competitive and fair-market compensation for physicians in training.

The negotiated agreement provides wage increases of three per cent in each of the first two years, and two per cent in each of the last two years. It also includes market adjustments that put Alberta on par with other western Canadian medical schools.

Ensuring resident physicians receive competitive, fair-market compensation while they train and provide services across the province will help stabilize and strengthen acute health care today while bringing medical students and ultimately more physicians to the province to support the province's future health needs.

"Alberta's government is grateful for all the hard work resident physicians put in as they complete their training. We are pleased to see that a new agreement has been reached and look forward to more physicians calling Alberta home." Adriana LaGrange, Minister of Health

Rural and Remote Family Medicine Resident Physician Bursary Pilot Program

The agreement builds on actions Alberta's government is taking to make the province a more attractive place for medical students and resident physicians to study and practise. On Oct. 3, Alberta's government announced measures to improve health care in rural and remote communities through the new Rural and Remote Family Medicine Resident Physician Bursary Pilot Program. The bursary program is part of the province's Rural Health Action Plan.

The pilot program will provide up to \$8 million annually for the next two years to medical students in their final year of an undergraduate medical program when they are matched with a family medicine residency program at the University of Alberta or University of Calgary, or to residents currently completing a family medicine residency at either university regardless of their year of study. In return, bursary recipients will commit to delivering comprehensive patient care in eligible communities for three years after completing their residency.

"With this agreement, Alberta strengthens its position as an attractive destination for resident physicians across Canada. By enhancing compensation, training and working conditions, we ensure Alberta recruits and retains the brightest medical talent to serve our communities and shape the future of health care." Quick facts

- Resident physicians have graduated medical school but are completing post-graduate training in a residency program to obtain their licence to practise. With residency programs requiring an additional two to seven years of post-graduate training, most resident physicians spend more than 10 years training to become fully licensed physicians and surgeons.
- The Professional Association of Resident Physicians of Alberta represents more than 1,660 resident physicians in Alberta.
- The current agreement between AHS, the University of Alberta, University of Calgary and the association ended on June 30, 2024.
- The resident physician agreement is funded by Alberta Health through a grant to AHS and the universities.

CYBERSECURITY AWARENESS MONTH

Alberta News, October 7, 2024

Minister of Technology and Innovation Nate Glubish issued the following statement marking Cybersecurity Awareness Month:

"October is Cybersecurity Awareness Month, a timely reminder for us to take stock of our online habits. It is also a great time to learn about evolving cyber threats so you can protect yourself and your information.

"Digital services, cloud and mobile technologies are part of our everyday life, be it for personal or professional use. With this comes the potential for cyberattacks. Last year, we successfully blocked an average of 129 million potentially malicious attempts every day to connect to the Government of Alberta's network.

"That's why Alberta's government takes cybersecurity very seriously. We place the highest importance on protection, vigilance, response and deterrence against attacks on our digital ecosystem. We also take a multifaceted approach to security, applying best practice and standards to identify, detect and treat cyber threats, as well as to respond and recover from cybersecurity incidents.

"As leaders in the public sector cybersecurity community, we continuously adjust our approach by working with federal, provincial and territorial counterparts to adopt new tactics and explore new tools to counter ever-evolving online threats. This includes creating and growing the CyberAlberta Community of Interest – a group of more than 600 cybersecurity experts from public, private and non-profit organizations who work collaboratively on many initiatives to strengthen Alberta's cybersecurity defences.

"Cybersecurity Awareness Month is also a good reminder for every Albertan about the risks that exist online and the importance of taking appropriate action to protect your information. This could include using strong passwords, keeping your software updated and being cautious about clicking on links or opening attachments from unknown senders. Regularly backing up your important data is also a good way to protect yourself in case of a cyberattack. Just as we lock our doors and windows to protect our homes, we need to take steps to protect our digital lives.

"Trust is at the heart of everything cyber-related. Whether applying for a health-care card, driver's licence

or income support payments, Albertans need to know they are protected by digital infrastructure that is strong and secure whenever they interact with us online. Our soon-to-be-released Cybersecurity Strategy will continue to ensure your provincial programs and services are protected into the future.

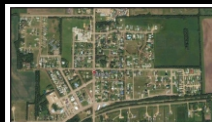

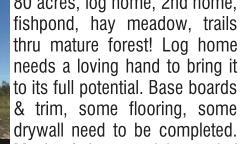
