

#### Counselling Subsidies Breton and Area FCSS is pleased to offer Counselling Subsidies.

A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

- Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills;
- Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;
- Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting;
- · Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment;
- · Reduce stress with life balance; and/or
- · Learn new skills and behaviors

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees range from \$15 per session to \$50 per session. The maximum number of sessions available is seven for individuals and nine for couples or families. Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc. We know that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. These sessions can be arranged to be in person in the Karunia offices in Leduc, over the phone in your own safe environment or virtually on your computer.





- Slow down speed really does kill, don't pass on solid lines, don't run stop signs. Drive within the traffic safety laws. They are not merely suggestions.
- Please pull over and yield right of way for all emergency response vehicles.
- When passing a scene please slow down to 60 kph or less! Our membership is repeatedly put at risk because of people driving too fast or carelessly for members to do their jobs safely.
- Put your camera phone away! This one is for everyone within our community. It is not your job to show pictures with sensitive information on social media. You cause more worry and panic and none of us want to see an accident scene on social media that may cause hurt to other people. Let's care for one another and not be the paparazzi.

## BRAZEAU COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

#### October 15, Regular Council Meeting

#### Improvements to TWP 492

Council directed staff to proceed with immediate maintenance improvements to Township Road 492, including the installation of warning signs, culvert maintenance and brushing. Council will also consider intersection alignment changes (to Range Roads 80 and 81) at 2025 capital budget discussions. Staff will bring back an amended Speed Limit Bylaw with a speed reduction to 60 km/h between Range Roads 80 and 81 for Council's consideration.

#### Western Economic Corridor Update

Consultant Brian Senio gave Council an update on government relations work related to advancing the objectives of the Western Economic Corridor initiative. He also provided suggestions to promote Brazeau County and to lobby the government to help address County priorities, including improvements to Highway 621.

#### **Oil Collection**

Council directed staff to bring a proposal for the Lindale site, including a sea can, for the collection of

used oil, oil filters, antifreeze, and empty oil containers to the 2025 budget presentations.


This was based on a motion from the Agricultural Service Board to ask Council to consider a collection site.

#### Changes to Agriculture Financial Services Corporation's (AFSC) AgriStability program will reduce paperwork and lower costs for producers.

These changes to the AgriStability program will better respond to each producer's unique situation, making the program more predictable, timely and simpler to access, which is what producers have been asking for." RJ Sigurdson, Minister of Agriculture and Irrigation

AgriStability is an individual, whole-farm, marginbased program that helps producers who experience margin declines greater than 30 per cent due to production loss, adverse market conditions and increased costs. In 2023, AgriStability also increased compensation for margin declines exceeding 30 per cent, offering 80 cents per dollar of decline, up from the previous rate of 70 cents.

Producers rely on business risk management programs to offset the financial impact of many challenges. AgriStability provides income stabilization protection to help producers manage large margin declines that threaten their farm's viability.

"Farmers can often face uncertainty, and programs like AgriStability help them to protect their operations. To make things a little bit easier, we've made changes to the AgriStability program that will reduce paperwork, so our farmers can get the support they need, faster, and continue producing top-quality products." Lawrence MacAulay, federal Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food

Risk management is critical in farming and each

producer needs to examine their situation and the tools available before making decisions. AFSC has a robust suite of lending, business risk management and insurance options that producers can access.


