Winner Shirley Dool and 20 of her friends and family were treated to a delicious Ukrainian feast of perogies, sausage, cabbage rolls, perishke (cheese buns), and nalesniki (cheese crepes) by Stawnichy's Mundare Sausage, pies for dessert from Fife N Dekel and samples from Rig Hand Distillery. Stella Stevens and Dan Davidson from CFCW attended and Dan entertained everyone with a few songs. Reps from Meridian Manufacturing and AFSC were also in attendance with prizes for the lucky winner.

"Being a farmer isn't an easy job. It takes heart and hard work. We, at AFSC, want to thank Alberta's farmers for their drive, dedication and determination while giving them a much-needed break during harvest."

"The second entry spoke of my mom, Elsie Eklund. Mom loved to bring out lunches to the fields at harvest time. It reminded her of the days when my dad ran threshing crews. She had a little blue car with a white vinyl top, and you could see her pulling into the field, parking close to where we were working. She would pop open her trunk and we would stop to eat as we got to her. The lunches did not consist of sandwiches and cookies! It would be a hot meal of her famous fried chicken, or homemade hamburgers, or beef stew. There would be fried potatoes or potato salad and cake or muffins. She always had a mason jar of hot black coffee, wrapped in newspaper and a towel to keep it warm, and another mason jar of Kool-Aid. Mom would do this for us up into her early 90's. We sure do miss those meals in the fields."



LOWERING COSTS FOR MUNICIPALITIES

Alberta News, September 26, 2024

Alberta is lowering the cost of borrowing for municipalities, enabling them to invest more in services and infrastructure.

Municipalities play an important role in shaping Alberta's vibrant communities and contributing to a stronger province. The province will now lend money to local authorities, which include municipalities, airports, counties and irrigation districts, at a lower rate.

These entities will now pay the same interest rate as the province on money borrowed for infrastructure and other capital projects. The change is expected to save municipalities about \$7 million in 2025-26 and about \$12 million in 2026-27.

In a time of high interest rates, Alberta's government is reducing the budgetary pressures faced by local governments and frees up funds for purposes other than servicing debt.

With Alberta's balancing of the budget, the province has been able to reduce outstanding debt by more than \$19 billion. With continued strong results, Alberta's borrowing costs are expected to remain low.

The Loans to Local Authorities program allows even the smallest municipalities in Alberta to benefit from the province's fiscal strength and well-established access to global capital markets. The province lends money to local authorities to help finance their capital projects, such as roads and upgrades to local water, sewer, gas and electric services.

"Alberta has lowered our cost of borrowing, and now we are passing that savings on to municipalities. They are our partners in providing services to Albertans, and by working together we can ensure that investments can be made with a minimum cost to service debt." "Our government provides billions of dollars in support to municipalities, ranging from grants to capital funding. Lowering the cost of borrowing for municipalities is just one more way we are ensuring that municipalities, counties, airports and irrigation districts can invest in their citizens." Background

- The Loans to Local Authorities program was set up to ensure that all municipalities and qualifying local authorities in Alberta have access to funds at the lowest possible cost.
- Interest rates charged on new loans to local authorities were revised to better reflect the cost of

credit for municipal borrowers that raise debt financing in the capital markets.


- The current loan pricing model under the Loans to Local Authorities program came into effect in December 2021.
- Prior to the change, lending rates were equal to the province's estimated cost of borrowing for debt with the same terms.
 The change will take

effect in Budget 2025.

BILL C-59 CHANGES HURT CANADIANS: MINISTER SCHULZ

Minister of Environment and Protected Areas Rebecca Schulz issued the following statement on Alberta's opposition to Bill C-59 as the federal government continues to ignore the concerns of Canadians:

"After extensive analysis and discussions with businesses across Alberta, there can be no mistake: the federal government's changes to the Competition Act are undemocratic, extreme and will hurt hardworking businesses and families. This is a gag order on freedom of speech, period. These ideological rules will threaten investments, jobs and decades of environmental progress in our province.

"Let's be clear: This isn't about 'truth in advertising.' That's a smokescreen. Instead, this creates a new double standard, providing a path for anti-energy and antibusiness groups to silence those working to reduce emissions while growing the economy.

"These amendments include extremely harsh penalties for businesses that make environmental claims but no penalties for radical groups that make false accusations, almost encouraging activists to file misleading claims.

"Ottawa has officially created an echo chamber where their anti-energy and anti-development views are never opposed or challenged. Eco-radical activists can now spread disinformation without any counter from industry and experts on the ground.

"The amendments made to Canada's Competition Act are vague and punitive. These amendments hold companies to international standards that don't even exist, and which the Competition Bureau is not qualified to dictate or assess.

"Businesses want to communicate truthfully and honestly about their environmental goals. Instead, they're being silenced. Ultimately, there is a cost to embedding virtuesignalling into law and Canadians will pay the price once again. All while Canada's real problems—affordability, housing and a dwindling economy—go unaddressed by a federal government whose expiry date is long past due.

"We have submitted this feedback to the federal government today. They need to scrap these changes, but we will not wait idly for common sense to prevail.

"We will continue to defend our provincial jurisdiction as we explore every legal option at our disposal to defend our rights and protect our industries from job-killing federal overreach."

Easy Pumpkin Pie Recipe

Ingredients

- All-Purpose flour, for work surface
- 1/2 recipe Basic Pie Dough, or 1 store-bought pie
- 1/2 tsp. ground ginger
- 3/4 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp. ground nutmeg
- 1/8 tsp. ground cloves
- 1/2 tsp. kosher salt
- 1/3 c. plus 3 tablespoons granulated sugar, divided
- 2 large eggs, at room temperature, beaten
- 1/3 c. maple syrup
- 2 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1 (15-ounce) can pumpkin purée (about 1 1/2 cups)
- 2/3 c. half and half

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°F with rack in the bottom position. Line a rimmed baking sheet with foil. On a lightly floured surface roll out dough to an 12-inch circle. Fit pie in a 9-inch pie plate. Trim overhang to 1-inch, fold edges under, and crimp. Freeze 20 minutes.
- 2. Line pie shell with aluminum foil or parchment paper, and fill with pie weights, dry beans, or rice pressing all the way to the edge. Bake on prepared baking sheet, 25 minutes. Carefully remove foil and pie weights and prick bottom of pie shell several times with a fork. Bake until edges are lightly golden brown and bottom of pastry is dry, 7 to 10 minutes. Cool completely on a wire rack, about 45 minutes; reserve baking sheet.
- 3. Whisk together ginger, cinnamon, nutmeg, cloves, salt, and 1/3 cup of sugar in a bowl. Add eggs, maple syrup, vanilla, pumpkin, and half and half, and whisk just until combined. Pour into parbaked pie crust. Bake on prepared baking sheet until puffed and set around the edges (center will still jiggle slightly), 45 to 50 minutes (Shield the crust with foil after 25 minutes if needed to prevent over browning, if necessary.) Cool completely on a wire rack, about 2 hours. Chill until cold, at least 2 hours or up to overnight.
- 4. When ready to serve, tightly wrap crust with foil. Sprinkle top of pie with remaining 3 tablespoons sugar, leaving a ½-inch border around the foilcovered edge. Use a kitchen torch to brûlée the top of the pie, avoiding the crust.

Smokey Pumpkin Deviled Eggs

Ingredients

- 12 hard-cooked eggs
- 5 Tbsp. canned pure pumpkin

- 3 Tbsp. mayonnaise
- 1 Tbsp. Dijon mustard
- 2 tsp. prepared horseradish
- 1 tsp. smoked paprika
- · Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 6 small cornichons

Directions

- 1. Peel eggs and cut in half lengthwise. Remove yolks and set whites aside.
- 2. Process yolks, pumpkin, mayonnaise, mustard, horseradish, and paprika in a food processor until smooth, about 30 seconds. Season with salt and pepper.
- 3. Transfer yolk mixture to a large zip-top bag. Cut a 3/4-inch hole in one corner of bag. Pipe filling into well of each egg white. Smooth yolk mixture with a damp finger. Make ridges on yolks with a fork.
- 4. Cut cornichon in half lengthwise, then crosswise, creating 24 pieces. Place 1 cornichon at one end of each yolk, creating a stem. Cover with a damp paper towel and chill up to 2 hours (if desired).

Harvest Pumpkin Soup

Ingredients

- 2 Tbsp. unsalted butter
- 1 large potato, peeled and chopped
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 4 1/2 c. chicken broth
- 1 (15-ounce) can pure pumpkin
- Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper
- 1/4 tsp. ground nutmeg
- 1/2 pt. heavy cream (16 tablespoons)

Directions

- 1. In a large pot over medium heat, melt butter. Add potato and onion and cook, stirring occasionally, until onion is translucent, about 8 minutes. Add chicken broth and bring to a boil. Cover, reduce heat to low, and cook until potato is tender, 10 to 12 minutes.
- 2. Stir in pumpkin. Using an immersion blender, purée mixture until smooth. (Or, use a blender to purée mixture in batches, then return to pot.) Stir in 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/8 teaspoon pepper, and nutmeg. Increase heat to medium-high and bring mixture to a boil. Cover, reduce heat to low, and cook for 10 minutes. Stir in cream and heat thoroughly. Season with salt and pepper, if desired. Serve hot.


