## **Secret Santa for Seniors**

With Christmas just around the corner Breton FCSS will be coordinating a Secret Santa for Seniors. This program is for seniors that live in the Village of Breton or Brazeau County east of the North Saskatchewan River. There are two parts to this program.

- \* Seniors that are going to be alone for the holidays can phone in or stop by the Breton FCSS office and complete a profile. Information collected will be your name, address, phone number, Things you like to do, treats you like, items that you would like to have on your Christmas List. Seniors can also be registered by community members or agencies. This information along with just their first name will be placed on a Christmas Tag. Registrations must be received by December 5.
- \* Community members can view the Christmas tags at the Village of Breton Office and select a senior to shop for. Once they have completed their shopping, they will return the items to the FCSS office. Additional items will be added to your gift, wrapped and delivered by Volunteers. Shopping must be completed by December 19th. If you are unable to come into the office to make a selection, please call or email <a href="mailto:fcss@breton.ca">fcss@breton.ca</a> and we can assist you with the selection
- \* If you love to wrap Christmas gifts, we are looking for VOLUNTEERS on December 18, & 19.
- \* Deliveries will be made on December 23. We are looking for VOLUNTEERS to do deliveries

If possible, we encourage purchases to be made in Breton and Drayton Valley to support our local businesses.

### NEW – Secret Santa for Youth

We have decided to expand our Secret Santa Program to include the youth of our community. This will run the same way as the Senior's program (see above). Youth that are from families that are experiencing some financial hardship this year, can complete a "Christmas Wish List". Tags will be placed on a separate Secret Santa Tree in the Village office. The tags will only include their gender and age. Once a tag is selected you will

receive information on the child's "Christmas Wishes." You shop for the individual and return the unwrapped gifts to our office to be wrapped and delivered to the youth. All recipients remain confidential for both the youth and senior program.

Both the Secret Santa Tree for seniors and the Youth Giving Tree will be available to choose from starting on December 2nd and gifts need to be returned by December 16th.



The Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Services Mike Ellis issued a statement on the upcoming Alberta Emergency Alert test.

"On Nov. 20, Alberta will be participating in a test of the National Public Alerting System. At 1:55 p.m., an Alberta Emergency Alert test will be issued across multiple channels including television, radio, wireless devices, websites, social media, the Alberta Emergency Alert mobile app and directly to compatible cellphones across the province.

"Nobody likes an alert disruption, but tests such as these allow us to fix system issues. These tests, which are typically conducted every May and November, help ensure the system works properly so Albertans can receive lifesaving information during an actual emergency, including tornadoes, wildfires, floods and Amber Alerts.

"To stay informed, I encourage all Albertans to download the Alberta Emergency Alert app, which delivers these warnings directly to your phone. To receive an alert on your mobile phone, it must be compatible with the system, connected to an LTE 4G network or higher, or connected to Wi-Fi with the Alberta Emergency Alert app installed. If your device is set to silent, it will display the alert but may not play the notification sound.



# NEW KEYSTONE SCHOOL IN BRETON

In my article last week I missed that on October 15, 2024 it was officially announced that Breton High School would be transforming into a K-12 facility and will be named "Breton Keystone School". Further to my estimated time lines it seems the "three or so years anticipated" is incorrect information, my apologies. For now I have no official anticipated time lines but I have contacted Wild Rose School Division and they informed me that time line information and a few more details on this project will be published once a contractor has been chosen which is anticipated to be available in January 2025.

What I do have for you is official Breton Keystone Modernization FAQ from the Wild Rose School division that had been shared with parents for those of you that haven't seen it. Thank you to the Wild Rose School Division for sharing it!

What is the bathroom setup at the new Breton school? There will be new bathrooms installed as part of the project. Two main sets of bathrooms will be on different ends of the building. One will be for elementary and one for high school. As well there will be staff washrooms, an accessible washroom (with a shower) and bathrooms in the gym change rooms.

What are the gym plans for the new school? Will it be upgraded? Will it accommodate the whole school for assemblies? Will it have seating? The gym is getting a complete makeover, with a new floor, new basketball, volleyball and badminton standards and new gym lines. We are adding a dividing curtain (electric, rolls up to the roof) in the middle so that the space can be divided into two for instructional purposes, but retract for sports. The workout area remains in the mezzanine above the gym and gets a little bit larger! New bleachers and a new AV system are designed for in the plans, however the bleachers themselves are not included in the project. We are also reconfiguring the change rooms to add a second storage room to accommodate the gym equipment from the elementary school.

Where will student and staff parking be? Will they pave the current gravel lot? The parking lot is being reconfigured to have 60 stalls to accommodate staff, students and visitors. There will be a single entrance/exit to the parking lot and the tree island in the middle will be removed.

Will each division have their own entry doors? We will have a door where the bus lane is with a big boot room that will likely be an elementary door and we are reconfiguring the gym entrance to likely be a high school door. The final decision on the doors will be made by the school administration. The main entrance remains where it is. There is a door on the elementary end that will be close to

the playground, so that will be nice for recess access.

How many classrooms will the new school have, and will it accommodate the playschool? The school has 13 classrooms PLUS: Foods Lab (with a servery), Music Room, Science Lab, Gym, Library/Learning Commons, Cosmetology Lab/Art room, Woods/Welding Lab (separated), Fitness Mezzanine. One of the classrooms is designed as a Kindergarten/Pre-K classroom and is very close to the elementary bathrooms.

What about a playground? A playground is funded as part of the project by the Alberta Government. Previous projects were funded at \$250,000. We are excited to add a play structure to the space!

Will the exterior of the school be upgraded - or will you match the existing tin? The school will get new exterior cladding. The current clearstory (glass skylights) in the gathering space inside the main entrance will be removed. However, there will be a new and bigger clearstory added in this space. The sloping glass above the gym entrance will still be in place but will become vertical glass instead. They are being redone to be more modern, energy efficient, but maintain or add natural light.

Will the new school be bigger than the existing BHS? The school will have exactly the same footprint as the current school as the exterior walls are remaining. Provisions will be installed during the modernization to accommodate for the addition of two portable classrooms for future growth.

Will there be any transportation fees for the transfer bus? Wild Rose School Division does not charge any transportation fees for any of our services, and the transfer bus to Warburg will be available to all Breton students. Students who are already registered to a rural bus will automatically be assigned to a transfer bus. For students who are not already registered to a rural bus, we will open a new "transfer bus" registration form beginning December 9, 2024. We encourage these parents to register their students for the transfer bus, even if you will only access this service in rare circumstances.

How will students be assigned to the transfer buses? Route buses will be assigned to specific transfer buses. Town students will be assigned where there is seat availability. We will do our best to make sure there are students of the same grade riding together on buses.

What will the school schedule be like? Will all students have the same lunch break? How will the gym be shared between elementary and high school students? These decisions will be made by the school administration with input from school staff and school council as we bring the two schools together. These discussions will begin during the 2025-26 school year.

Will there be one office for both elementary and high school students? There will be one main office, but with spots for two administrative support staff, two offices, a sick room and staff room. The office remains in the same location as it currently is, but the space and interior walls are being reconfigured.



# ALBERTA ACTIVATES CONTINGENCY MAIL DELIVERY PLAN

Alberta News, November 15, 2024

Alberta's government has a plan to ensure critical government mail continues to be delivered during the service interruption at Canada Post.

In response to the service disruption at Canada Post, Alberta's government is taking steps to ensure critical mail between Albertans and the government continues to flow.

Starting Tuesday, Nov. 19, mail can be accepted from Albertans at designated Alberta government offices across the province to ensure it reaches the proper destination. No stamps are required. The full list of designated buildings is available on www.Alberta.ca.

Albertans who receive mail from the provincial government will receive a notification by email or phone indicating where and when they can pick-up/drop-off their mail. Alberta's government will never ask for personal information over the phone or for anyone to click on a link in an email. Non-critical mail will be held by the originating department until Canada Post mail service resumes.

Some departments are participating in a Canada Post program to deliver social-economic cheques once a month during the disruption. Many departments that issue cheques also offer direct deposit. For more information, or to inquire about signing up for direct deposit, Albertans should contact the government department that issues the payment.

Additional information will be posted online as it becomes available.

## **Quick facts**

- Only critical mail can be delivered to the general public during a work interruption. Non-critical or promotional mail should not be sent during this time.
- Ministries must arrange for staff serving the public to accept and forward critical mail from Albertans to the appropriate government recipients.
- Critical mail is material that must reach its intended recipient to avoid health, safety, financial or other significant harm to Albertans, significant risk or loss to government, or legislative non-compliance and that cannot be delivered expediently by courier, fax, electronic or other means.
- Canada Post employees will deliver federal and provincial government socio-economic cheques one day per month during a work interruption.
- Additional information will be posted on Alberta.ca as it becomes available.

In the August 20 agenda of the Brazeau County Agenda package (pp. 97 - 105) is a councillor report about attendance at the Calgary stampede last July. The following is this observer's evaluation.

Nowhere is it mentioned why it was necessary to send people to the Stampede in the first place, nor why all three were paid for as opposed to sending only one. What kind of information sessions were conducted that relate to local government?

There is a great deal of "name dropping." Again, how will the county benefit? Readers are well informed as to what was eaten and the use of Uber. Some of the ideas discussed with noted others were concerns (perhaps) of the provincial or federal government, not local issues.

Meeting with provincial ministers was mentioned. Does one need to attend the Stampede to meet these people? The same regarding day home for kids? How does a description of the (1908) Normal School relate to county business?

The idea of a hydrogen hub was mentioned. Perhaps a definition/description of such would be useful. Perhaps the public should have a say in its possible placement in Brazeau. For example, is it environmentally safe regarding our air, H20 and land? We don't need another industry dump.

The writer of the report states it cost the county \$2410.10 for this excursion for his expenses. It seems (to this writer) that events of this kind should be paid for by those that attend (not the taxpayer); this appears to be a paid holiday.

Perhaps residents should read the article and decide for themselves the value to the county of such activities.

Three councillors attended. Even though reports are not required for in-province conferences, taxpayers would also be interested in the reports of the other two councillors and who they conferred with in their networking and how the information they gleaned is valuable to the county.
