GRAND OPENING ARENA PHASE 2

On Friday November 1, 2024, I attended the grand opening of Warburg & District Memorial Arena's \$2,650,000 phase 2 project. This project included a new ice plant for the arena which was nearing its life cycle and for the curling rink which would be obsolete in 2030. It also included the zamboni / control rooms and upgrades to the headers.

This true community project could not have happened without the partnership and funding from the Government of Alberta, Leduc County, Village of Warburg, Capital Power, and Fortis. The numerous hours of the Warburg Hockey & Skating Arena Club, the Warburg Curling Club and the Pioneer Ag Society volunteers were also huge contributors to this project. Numerous other businesses and contractors also made this projects a success including local contractor Apecs.

"We applied for the CFEP Grant June of 2022, many thanks to Leduc County and the Village of Warburg for their committed support through the recreation cost sharing with the County's portion being 74% and the Village's portion 26% of the balance" says Chris Pankewitz, CAO for the Village of Warburg and volunteer board member for the Warburg Hockey & Skating Arena

Club, the Warburg Curling Club and the Pioneer Ag Society.

The Arena board is already looking at moving forward with Phase 3 which would be the front end of the arena, moving the concession downstairs and adding a gym room. CAO, Christ Pankewitz anticipates they will be requesting funding for 2026/2027.





RARE VISITOR COMES TO THORSBY

Last Thursday, a very unusual visitor showed up at a bird feeder near Thorsby.

She is a female summer tanager, and should be hanging out in the Southern U.S.

This is the twelfth confirmed sighting of this kind of bird in our province, and only the third seen at this time of year.

She arrived cold and hungry, and has been busy building up strength munching on black oil sunflower seeds, a highly nutritious food for a wide variety of birds.

She is a "vagabond", a bird who has wandered far away from her usual home. She may stay up to two weeks before continuing her journey.

The bird's photo and probable identification was posted on the Alberta Bird Facebook page, and generated a lot of interest.

The Alberta Bird Record Committee confirmed the sighting, and has kindly helped manage the considerable interest this little lady has generated.

So far, four small groups of birdwatchers have visited, bearing gifts of suet, dried mealworm, and donations for the Christmas Elves. The entire experience has been remarkable.

Some things you might want to know if an unusual bird shows up in your yard:

- The "Merlin" app can help you identify an unfamiliar bird by song or by image.
- A wandering bird does not necessarily need rescuing.
 Unless it is visibly distressed, showing signs of illness
 or injury, safe access to good food and water are
 usually enough to support the visitor.
- Working with the birding community can be a very rewarding experience, ensuring that your privacy is respected while allowing true enthusiasts to experience a once in a lifetime thrill.

LEDUC COUNTY **HISTORY**

In 1991 the County of Leduc No. 25 under the direction of History Book Committee -Marjorie Bilar, Edward Chubocha, Robert MacDonald and Phyllis Schnick published "County of Leduc No. 25 History - A Pictoral and Anecdotal Collection" by Katheryn McNalley. Thank you to Leduc County for granting me permission to quote excerpts to share with our Leduc County residents. Here is another excerpt:

To Serve your Country

excerpts from pages 66--70 "County of Leduc No. 25 History"

Many North Americans were dealt a dreadful blow with the outbreak of World War II. World War I was known as the war to end all wars and had been trusted to live up to its promise. However, Albertans reacted to the new call to service with typical responsibility, and the final tabulation showed that 78,000 men and 4,500 women had served.

This devastating world conflict profoundly affected the entire population, but none more so than the active participants.

In response to a plebiscite in 1942, Liberal Prime Minister Mackenzie King repealed his party's solemn promise that there would be no conscription. Conscripts however, were

Carl Kropp and his road maintenance crew (about a dozen strong) invaded the local harvest fields on Saturday shortly after noon, and showed that the great majority of them at least have not forgotten the technique of "stooking." plenty of material on hand, there was no let-up in their activity until "the retreat" was sounded at about 7:00 p.m., after which refreshments were served.

Bob Bannerman, on whose farm the actiontook place, wishes to go on record as more than satisfied with the amount of work done (about 4 acres were stooked), and the spirit of co-operation shown by the men in helping to solve the labor shortage in harvesting operations.

The evening ended with one of the roadmakers staging a broncotaming exhibition.

not to be sent overseas. By 1944 it became evident that replacement troops were needed in Europe, and Mackenzie King again changed his stance. The first conscripts were sent in action that year.

Conscription led to severe labor shortages on the home front. The unemployment rate in Canada dropped from 11.4 percent in 1939 to 1.6 percent in 1945. This translated to manpower shortages in the agricultural industry and directly affected the County of Leduc area. Provision was made in the conscription process designating certain family members to remain at home to operate the farm. Farms were still dismally short of help and women were pressed into service.
