HONORING LOCAL BUSINESS

The Thorsby & District Chamber of Commerce hosted their 3rd Annual Christmas Gala on November 23. Another beautiful event with over 180 people in attendance.

Since we began the Gala in November of 2022, each year we have honored two local businesses who have been long time supporters and members of our Chamber of Commerce and our community. This year the Chamber chose Mel Ruff Enterprises (the late Mel Ruff) and Thorsby Village Supermarket (the Elkadri Family).

Here is a bit of background sent to us on each of this year's deserving recipients.

Mel Ruff Enterprises

"Mel was born and raised on a dairy farm beside Thorsby. When Mel was in his early teems his dad died and the family gave up dairy farming. Mel worked at the Tire Shop then tried going to the oil rigs but he wanted to be his own boss so he bought a gravel truck and started his own business. He stock piled sand and gravel and decorator rock. He bought a backhoe and a bobcat to reload from his own piles. He then added landscaping jobs to his list. Since he was an early riser he pushed snow for a lot of the businesses in town. He liked that job because he got free coffee and fresh homemade cookies. But he also did it for others too, some people got their driveway cleared because Mel knew it was a challenge for them. Mel also helped when the old grocery store on Hankin Street was burning down. The fire department asked him to use his backhoe to pull down some walls so they could get at the fire before all of Hankin Street burnt down. He did. He closed himself inside the backhoe, drove into the fire and pulled down the walls. He came out OK but the tires on the backhoe didn't survive"

Thorsby Village Supermarket

"For 28 years, Faysal and Iman dedicated their lives to Thorsby through their grocery store, Family Foods. More than a business, it became a welcoming space where the community came together. Now, as they are honoured for their contributions at this year's Christmas Gala, we celebrate their remarkable story of service and love for the town they've called home since 1996. Faysal purchased the store with his cousin before taking over entirely in 1999. Together with his wife, Iman, the two worked tirelessly to serve Thorsby while raising their four children-Ghanem, Yousra, Laila, and Mohamed. The children grew up immersed in small-town life, attending playschool with Mrs. Powlik, making lifelong friends, and participating in sports and community events like the Thorsby Parade and Christmas in the Village. In 2017, Faysal passed the torch to his eldest son, Ghanem, who continued to run Family Foods with the same dedication and care. Ghanem did an outstanding job, building on his father's legacy and ensuring the store remained a cornerstone of the community. Reflecting on their journey, Faysal shared, "Thorsby has given us more than we could ever give back. It's been an honour to serve this town and watch our children grow up here."





TIPS From TOPS!

TAKE OFF POUNDS SENSIBLY

THE TOPS TEN **Tips for Healthy Dining Out**

- 1. **Don't drink your calories.** A large size (32 oz) non diet soda is more than 300 calories. Mixed alcoholic drinks can be even higher in calories. Best choices are water, diet soda, unsweetened tea, coffee, light beer or a small glass of wine. Calories saved by choosing a small glass of wine instead of a margarita = 250 calories.
- 2. Prioritize your indulgences. Decide which item you really want and stick with just that. If you're craving the huge burger, skip the appetizer and dessert, choose healthy side and enjoy your burger until you're full. Calories saved by skipping the appetizer chips (half basket) = 300 calories
- 3. Ask for sandwiches to be made without mayonnaise-based sauces. Just 1 tablespoon adds 100 calories and 11 grams of unneeded fat. Calories saved by a sandwich made without 2 tablespoons mayonnaise = 200 calories.
- 4. Portions are key! Many restaurants' meals provide enough food for two to three people. Split the meal with a friend or take half home. It saves calories and money. Calories saved by splitting the typical casual dining meal = 700 calories
- 5. **Have a plan.** Look at the restaurant's nutrition information online prior to going out and decide what you are going to order before sitting down with the menu full of tempting choices.
- 6. **Decode the menu.** Avoid any dishes described with the words fried, batter dipped, creamy, cream sauce, scalloped, au gratin, crispy, butter sauce, cheesy or alfredo. These words generally indicate that the meal is higher in fat and calories. Calories saved by ordering the pasta with marinara sauce instead of alfredo sauce = 750 calories.
- 7. At pizza restaurants, choose a thin crust with **lower calorie toppings** such as Canadian bacon, chicken, pineapple or vegetables. Calories saved by choosing two slices (large) thin crust pizza instead of hand tossed =120 calories. Calories saved by choosing two slices of all veggie pizza instead of meat = 400 calories.

- 8. At Mexican restaurants, go easy on the cheese, sour cream and fried tortilla chips. Add plenty of salsa - it's low in calories and counts as a vegetable serving. Calories saved by 2 tablespoons of salsa instead of sour cream = 45 calories.
- 9. Dessert anyone? Share one dessert per table. Take a bite or two and pass it on.
- 10.Don't go out to eat when you're starving. Before leaving, eat a small snack like an apple; it will take the edge off your hunger. You will be less likely to overeat at the restaurant.

NURSE PRACTITIONERS EXPAND PRIMARY CARE ACCESS

Alberta News, November 20, 2024

The Alberta government's Nurse Practitioner Primary Care program is showing early signs of success, with 33 nurse practitioners already practising independently in communities across the province.

Alberta's government is committed to strengthening Alberta's primary health care system, recognizing that innovative approaches are essential to improving access. To further this commitment, the Nurse Practitioner Primary Care Program was launched in April, allowing nurse practitioners to practise comprehensive patient care autonomously, either by operating their own practices or working independently within existing primary care settings.

Since being announced, the program has garnered a promising response. A total of 67 applications have been submitted, with 56 approved. Of those, 33 nurse practitioners are now practising autonomously in communities throughout Alberta, including in rural locations such as Beaverlodge, Coaldale, Cold Lake, Consort, Morley, Picture Butte, Three Hills, Two Hills, Vegreville and Vermilion.

"I am thrilled about the interest in this program, as nurse practitioners are a key part of the solution to provide Albertans with greater access to the primary health care services they need." Adriana LaGrange, Minister of Health

To participate in the program, nurse practitioners are required to commit to providing a set number of hours of medically necessary primary care services, maintain a panel size of at least 900 patients, offer after-hours access on weekends, evenings or holidays, and accept walk-in appointments until a panel size reaches 900 patients.

With 33 nurse practitioners practising independently, about 30,000 more Albertans will have access to the primary health care they need. Once the remaining 23 approved applicants begin practising, primary health care access will expand to almost 21,000 more Albertans.

The Nurse Practitioner Primary Care program not only expands access to primary care services across the province but also enables nurse practitioners to practise to their full scope, providing another vital access point for Albertans to receive timely, high-quality care when and where they need it most.

Quick facts

- Through the Nurse Practitioner Primary Care Program, nurse practitioners receive about 80 per cent of the compensation that fee-for-service family physicians earn for providing comprehensive primary care.
 - Compensation for nurse practitioners is determined based on panel size (the number of patients under their care) and the number of patient care hours provided.
- Nurse practitioners have completed graduate studies and are regulated by the College of Registered Nurses of Alberta.
- For the second consecutive year, a record number of registrants renewed their permits with the College of Registered Nurses of Alberta (CRNA) to continue practising nursing in Alberta.
 - There were more than 44,798 registrants and a 15 per cent increase in nurse practitioners.
- Data from the Nurse Practitioner Primary Care Program show:
 - Nine applicants plan to work on First Nations reserves or Metis Settlements.
 - Parts of the province where nurse practitioners are practising: Calgary (12), Edmonton (five), central (six), north (three) and south (seven).
- Participating nurse practitioners who practise in eligible communities for the Rural, Remote and Northern Program will be provided funding as an incentive to practise in rural or remote areas.
- Participating nurse practitioners are also eligible for the Panel Management Support Program, which helps offset costs for physicians and nurse practitioners to provide comprehensive care as their patient panels grow.


