

BRAZEAU COUNTY PASSES 2025 INTERIM BUDGET

BRAZEAU COUNTY, November 28, 2024 — On November 21, Brazeau County Council passed an interim budget for 2025, with a focus on core services.

The interim budget maintains the years-long freeze on municipal taxes. Fees, which were limited to zero or to minimal levels in previous years, are not set to increase.

The budget also includes \$11.25 million in capital investment in roads, equipment replacement, and other infrastructure.

"Low taxes, low fees, and investment in infrastructure continue to be the focus for Council," says Reeve Bart Guyon. "We have a balanced budget that keeps money in ratepayers' pockets while focusing on priority capital projects."

Infrastructure investments and other initiatives include:

- · Five microsurfacing road maintenance projects
- Base stabilization and cape sealing of internal roads at Northside Acres and Fairway Meadows
- Replacement of fencing and new sorting equipment at the Lindale Rodeo Grounds
- Replacement of Drayton Valley/Brazeau County Fire Services aerial truck
- Investment in efficiency upgrades at the Cynthia solar aquatics plant
- Equipment replacement

Council passes an interim budget in order to proceed on approved operational and capital projects in the period between now and when the County receives final property assessment information, and approval of a final budget in April.



RESPONSE TO FEDERAL-PROVINCIAL MEETING

Alberta News, November 27, 2024

Premier Danielle Smith released the following statement after the meeting between the prime minister and premiers:

"The Council of the Federation had a meeting with Prime Minister Justin Trudeau to discuss an approach to dealing with the 25 per cent tariff on Canadian products threatened by the incoming U.S. administration.

"Although I oppose any tariffs on Canadian or U.S. products, it is my view that President Donald Trump, and the tens of millions of Americans who voted for him, have valid concerns related to illegal migrants and drug smuggling at our shared border. We know that the problem is much more serious at the Mexican-U.S. border, however, that does not diminish the need for the federal government and every province bordering the United States to take immediate steps to crack down heavily on these illegal border activities. Doing so is good for both the United States and Canada.

"I communicated this very clearly to the prime minister, and further indicated that Alberta will be acting urgently and decisively to patrol our own shared border with Montana, with more details to be announced soon in that regard. I also expressed the need for the federal government to aggressively move up compliance with our country's NATO obligations of a two per cent of GDP spend on our military forces which is yet another concrete way to solidify our economic and military alliance with the United States.

"I also ensured the prime minister and premiers understood the supreme importance of recognizing the incoming administration's commitment to energy security, and that Alberta is uniquely positioned in all of the world as the perfect partner to the United States in achieving that objective. It is therefore utter foolishness for the federal government to enact an energy production cap that would result in a massive curtailment of oil to the United States. I urged the Prime Minister to withdraw this energy production cap immediately as a show of commitment to North American energy security and partnership.

"In the coming months, my ministers and I will be working aggressively to reach out to our U.S. allies involved with the incoming U.S. administration and Congressional leadership to work on strengthening our economic and energy partnership and detailing the work that premiers across the country are actively engaged in to strengthen our nation's border security."

In Response to Canada-U.S. Tarif discussion Premier Danielle Smith also released the following statement on November 30 after a meeting between Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and incoming U.S. President Donald Trump.

"It is telling that one of the primary topics of discussion between incoming President Donald Trump and Prime Minister Justin Trudeau was oil and gas pipelines. It once again demonstrates that the path to strong security and economic relationships with the United States is directly tied to our nation's commitment to providing the United States with the oil and gas it requires to achieve its energy security and affordability goals.

"We therefore reiterate our call to the Prime Minister to immediately scrap the Canadian oil and gas production cap and work with Alberta and all provinces to secure the border from illegal drugs and illegal migrants and, critically, to commence work on additional pipeline infrastructure between Canada and the United States."



PUTTING AN END TO THE PHOTO RADAR CASH COW

Alberta News, December 2, 2024

Alberta's government is ending the photo radar cash cow, eliminating areas where photo radar is used to generate revenue with no traffic safety benefit.

Many Albertans have expressed growing frustration with photo radar, questioning its focus on revenue rather than safety. In response to these concerns, Alberta's government paused the introduction of new photo radar equipment and locations on Dec. 1, 2019. Now, after thorough analysis and consultation, Alberta's government is taking bold steps to restore public trust.

Effective April 1, 2025, ticketing on numbered provincial highways will end as photo radar will be restricted to school, playground and construction zones. Intersection safety devices in Alberta will also be restricted to red light enforcement only, ending the 'speed-on-green' ticketing function.

Municipalities will also be able to request that the province approve additional photo radar locations on an exceptional basis, for high collision areas and where other safety measures cannot be implemented effectively. These types of exceptions will be subject to an audit every two years to assess the effectiveness of photo radar at the site in reducing collisions.

"This is great news for Alberta drivers. These changes will once and for all kill the photo radar cash cow in Alberta. Albertans can be confident that photo radar will only be used to improve traffic and roadside worker safety and not to make money." Devin Dreeshen, Minister of Transportation and Economic Corridors

The next step for government is to review every existing photo radar site in the province over the next four months. As part of that review, those that are deemed ineffective, or outside of a school, playground, or construction zone, will be removed. This is expected to reduce the current 2,200 approved sites by 70 per cent, which would also better align the amount of photo radar with other provinces. Currently, there are about 70 per cent more photo radar sites used in 24 Alberta municipalities than the next highest province. Allowing these changes to be implemented over the next four months provides municipalities time to transition, update equipment and adjust contracts with vendors.

"It is vital we maintain safety where it matters most—around our schools, playgrounds and construction zones. These are areas where enforcement can genuinely protect lives, not just generate revenue. With this new policy change, we'll see more officers back in neighbourhoods and that visibility will help tackle the growing issues of crime and disorder – a top priority for Edmontonians and Albertans." "The Minister's announcement will ensure that the use of photo radar is focused on enhancing traffic safety on high-risk roadways. RMA looks forward to learning how current photo radar sites will be assessed and is optimistic that this will result in an approach that supports safer roads without unfairly penalizing drivers." Municipalities will be encouraged to use traffic-calming measures to improve traffic safety, including speed warning signs, speed tables (large flat speed bump), public education campaigns and other tools designed to improve traffic safety. The province will also help make roads safer by providing municipalities with support to reengineer roads and intersections that have been proven to be unsafe.

- Alberta first introduced photo radar in 1987.
- All photo radar sites were removed from ring roads in Calgary and Edmonton on December 1, 2023.
- The government engaged with municipalities in June and August 2024 about photo radar and specifically to discuss solutions to eliminate 'fishing holes.'

JACK SEMPLE

@ EPAC November 29, 2024

Electrified, note-bending guitar riffs, cranked and distorted, amplified by EPAC's theatre sound system were music to the ears of a thunderstruck EPAC audience. Regina based multi-genre guitar virtuoso quitarist Jack Semple's fireworks earned the most ardent ovation of the Friday evening. Semple's Gordon Lightfoot tribute at the Eleanor Pickup Arts Centre featured Lightfoot's best. They were performed in versions touchingly familiar, was evocative of the era, yet sounded fresh and vital.

A Lightfoot concert inspired 11 year-old Semple to a 55 year playing career and this tribute tour. "My brother Jim took me to the Gordon Lightfoot concert. It was the first live music I'd ever heard, the first guitar I'd ever seen played and the first time I saw Lightfoot play. I was spellbound by his performance, his songwriting and the attention the audience was paying to him! That was my bar to meet! So, I started playing guitar and became enamoured by it. At 67 I'm still practicing and learning."

Fans of Lightfoot's ever present 12-string may wonder into which of his works an Eddy Van Halen level solo fits. (Lightfoot's 1967 Gibson B45-12 Sunburst "Sundown" acoustic recently sold at auction for \$490,000 C\$) The Grammy-nominated "The Wreck of the Edmund Fitzgerald" is the only reason Semple carries an electric guitar on the tour. A single from 1976's "Summertime Dream" album, it was the No. 1 single on Canada's RPM chart and Billboard's No. 2. in the U.S. The lyrics recall the fate of a "good ship and true" that "was a bone to be chewed, when the gales of November came early".

The ore carrier Edmund Fitzgerald sank into a stormy Lake Superior on November 10, 1975, with the loss of 29 seamen. The song was written and recorded shortly after. Terry Clements' electric guitar's extended atmospherics and PW Charles' pedal steel bell-like tones played over Lightfoot's 12-string on the recording. Semple recalled that they created "the most magical sounds I've ever heard. I use a Fender Stratocaster for playing "The Wreck of the Edmund Fitzgerald" onstage. It's probably the only Lightfoot song with distortion! It's the song I wait for all night because I get to rock out on my Stratocaster." And so he did. His extended solo was emotional, inventive and technical. The ovation was long and loud.

Semple kept his Stratocaster hot for the next song: a funky jazz version of "Oh Linda" (Lightfoot! 1966). A local "Linda", responding to the propulsive beat, took up the challenge from the stage asking for a "sexy dance" for which she also received a spirited ovation. Sadly, this reporter had a blocked view.

The extra 6-string Larrivee #09 on stage was played by Semple's 35 year side-man, Dave Chabot, Semple praised his friend's musicianship: "He learned all of Red

Shea's brilliant extra guitar parts for this tribute. They're in the style of Cat Stevens [Yusuf/Cat Stevens], and Jim Croce. Those beautiful sixths moving along and fingerpicking. He learned them all."

Eighteen songs comprised the setlist. Audience favourites also included "Early Morning Rain" (Lightfoot! 1966), "If You Could Read My Mind" (Sit Down Young Stranger 1970), and "For Lovin' Me" (Lightfoot! 1966). Semple explained his choices: "The era of Lightfoot's songs between 1966 and 1976 are my favourites. Those were formative years for me. I was born in 1957. Any

music that you're in love with in that age range stavs with you. They are all brilliant, they are all high *level* compositions!"

The standing ovation and cheers as Semple and Chabot returned for the encore attest to the brilliance on stage as well. Their heart felt tribute, accomplished playing, and genreblending versions of Lightfoot classics made for a great evening of entertainment.
