CALMAR COLLEGIATE SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Black Gold School Division, December 16, 2024

Progress is underway at Calmar Collegiate Secondary School as construction moves full steam ahead toward its Fall 2025 opening, and with programming plans nearly finalized, the school is on track to become a hub for hands-on learning and career preparation for students to thrive in Alberta's booming trades sector.

Current developments include the installation of the main structural beam and the construction of a connecting piece from the new addition to the main school. Once this connection is complete the preengineered building will be added and then the concrete floors will be poured. Work on the interior of the addition, classrooms, offices, and washrooms will follow. The aim is to have the building ready by the spring, with equipment installation beginning soon thereafter.

The Collegiate school will house innovative programming tailored for students in Grades 10-12, focusing on three skilled trades – carpentry, electrical, and pipe trades:

- Grade 10 students will be introduced to the three trades, and will participate in off-site visits to shops throughout the year to gain real-world insights, to complement their core academic studies.
- Grade 11 will feature hands-on learning in a trimester system, which will give students the

opportunity to more deeply explore the three trades while working together.

 Grade 12 students can enroll in pre-apprenticeship programs, which offer 12 weeks of full-day technical training to prepare them for First Period apprenticeship exams.

Once they graduate, students can enter the workforce and continue their journey from apprenticeship to journeyperson.

Students will learn from industry professionals alongside certified teachers, thanks to the Black Gold School Division's strong partnerships with Northern Lakes College, the Building Trades of Alberta, and the Educational Partnership Foundation.

Kathryn (Klymko) Pankewitz

February 24, 1927 – December 7, 2024



Kathryn (Kay) passed away peacefully on December 7th, 2024, after living a full and healthy life. Born on February 24th, 1927, in Mlyny, Poland, first daughter of her parents, Peter and Mary Klymko, she was one year old when her father, Peter, emigrated by himself to Canada in search of a new life for his family in the farming

communities of the prairies in western Canada. After four years of saving every penny, Peter had earned enough money to bring his wife, Mary, and daughter, Kay, to Canada aboard the ship Montcalm, landing in Montreal in 1931, and then across Canada by rail. Peter and Mary worked at various farms in the Calmar area, and a second daughter, Jeannette was born in 1936. Finally in 1940, they had saved enough to buy their own farm, just east of Sunnybrook, and in 1942, a third daughter, Elizabeth arrived. This farm has remained in the family today.

Kay and her sisters worked hard along with their parents supporting the farm. Kay attended school up to grade 9.

In 1946, Kay married John Pankewitz. They settled in Sunnybrook where she worked with John in their garage known as the Sunnybrook Service Station and supported John in Panky's Sand and Gravel.

Kay and John were blessed with four children: Reginald (Linda), Sylvia (Pierre Crevolin) Judy, Danny (Chris); seven grandchildren: Jeffrey, Chad, Michelle (Spencer), Patrick (Maggie), Catrina (Lee), Tyler (Megan) and Tiffany (Jesse); and fourteen great grandchildren: Noella, Isaac, Max, Owen, Miles, Reid, Xavier, Greta, Jax, Tayze, Blaze, Breely, Kace, and Whitley.

Kay was predeceased by John in 1994, and brother-in-law Glen Smith in 2022. She is survived by all of her children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren, sister Jeanette, sister Elizabeth (George Ostapchuk), numerous nieces and nephews, and cousin Katarzyna Kowala in Poland.

Kay lived a healthy life. She was an awesome cook, known for her cabbage rolls, mashed potatoes, head cheese and her renowned poppyseed chiffon cake. She was a hard working lady and loved spending time outside with a large garden, plenty of potatoes, carrots, and peas. She loved her roses, dahlias and other flowers.

In her last few weeks, Kay fell ill and was not able to live on her own. She realized she would lose her hard-fought independence, and her family is comforted to know that she left this life on her own terms.

Expressions of gratitude and love are graciously extended to the staff and residents of the Cloverleaf Manor who were always checking in and helping to make Kay's final days pleasant. The family would also like to thank the doctors and nurses at the Devon Hospital for their care of Kay during her short time in the hospital.

A private family gathering celebrating Kay's life will be held at a later date.





Resuming operations: Important information for customers

Canada Post will restart operations on Tuesday, December 17 and begin the process of safely ramping up and stabilizing operations across the country. With our large, integrated network of processing plants, depots and post offices, stabilizing operations will take time and we ask for your patience as we do this safely.

We will start by working through the mail and parcels trapped in the system since the strike began on November 15. New commercial volumes will not be accepted into the network until Thursday, December 19. This means we will not pick up or accept mail or parcels at our plants or depots for the first 48 hours. These first two days will give us the time we need to safely reopen facilities, restart machines and vehicles that have been idle for weeks, and begin working through the volumes in our network.

As new volumes are accepted, mail and parcels will be secured and delivered on a first-in, first-out basis. Customers should expect delivery delays through the remainder of 2024 and into January 2025.

What this means for customers

To help customers better plan and prepare, here is some information on what they can expect in the days ahead:

Parcels

- Customers should expect delays and restrictions as we stabilize our operations, including for pickups, drop-offs and delivery.
- Scheduled pickups will start on December 19, but it will take several days to process items. We will make a best effort to collect all items at the time of the pickup; if that is not possible due to volumes or equipment availability, we will return to pick up the remaining items either the same day or next day.
- On-demand pickups will not be available until Monday, December 23.

On-time service guarantees

- Service guarantees are suspended as the company ramps up operations.
- Once the network is stabilized, we will notify customers when on-time service guarantees are reinstated.

Return labels and call-for items

 All return labels created on or after October 15 will remain valid for up to 45 days until our operations stabilize.

- We will also restart the clock on all items currently held for customer pick-up at post offices, regardless of whether the office was open or closed during the strike
- Beginning December 17, consumers will have 15 days to pick up their parcel before it is returned to the sender.

Parcel Redirection service

 If customers leveraged Parcel Redirection during the strike, we will do our best to locate and redirect their parcel. However, our ability to fulfill Parcel Redirection requests will be limited until operations stabilize.

International mail and parcels

- Canada Post will work to process a significant accumulation of international mail and parcels currently queued up to enter the postal system.
- Customers should expect delays into 2025.
- The postal system will start accepting new international mail on Monday, December 23.

Neighbourhood Mail


- Date-specific Neighbourhood Mail is not currently available. The service will resume once our operations and volumes have stabilized.
- We will notify customers as soon as we are able to resume date-specific Neighbourhood Mail.
- All other Neighbourhood Mail in our system will be delivered as upon receipt.

Transaction Mail

- Service standards for Transaction Mail will be affected in the short term.
- Transaction Mail trapped in the network by the strike will be processed and delivered on a first-in, first-out basis.
- We will work to move new volume as quickly as possible.
- We'll notify customers when service standards return to normal.



Merry Christmas everyone. It's hard to believe another year has come and gone. Perhaps it is part of growing older, that the world zooms around us at jet speed.

Christmas has a different vibe for our family these days, as a vital piece of our family was lost five years ago in January 2020.

I have been thinking about some past Christmases in my life, and have had a few chuckles. You might get a chuckle as well.

While my Grandma Piel was alive, her house was always the center of family celebrations. I was probably around 3 or 4 at the time, and someone in the family got the idea to play Santa. The masks in those early 50's were not exactly the prettiest, so Santa was more terrifying than jolly. I remember sitting in grandma's rocking chair, rocking away, minding my own business, when I heard a knock on the window. I saw this terrifying bearded face looking directly at me! I let out a scream and ran into grandma's bedroom and hid. It took a lot of convincing to get me out from under the bed.

My folks always had a hired hand, and the one who lived with us the longest was Claus Johnson. One year, when I was eleven or so, he gave me a box of Japanese oranges, of my very own, for a Christmas gift. He knew that I loved these Christmas oranges, and I still do.

My dad was Swedish, and for years our family belonged to the Nordstarjanen Vasa club. Every Christmas, the Vasa had a Christmas concert everyone could participate in. I sang and played my instruments and participated in skits until I had children and grandchildren. Then they carried on with the tradition. My granddaughters have played St Lucia in the pageants and the grandsons dressed as Tom Tom's (elf's) over the years. After the concert we would all dance around the Christmas Tree until Santa came to hand out bags of treats. Then, the tree was moved out of the center of the dance floor, and the adults would dance the Hunger March. The potluck supper followed. Our Vasa disbanded a few years ago and I sure miss it.

The Vasa would also have a lutefisk supper in January. Lutefisk is dried cod, soaked in lye, then soaked again until the lye is out. To cook it, you can boil it, or steam it in the oven. I tried making Lutefisk the first Christmas after my mom passed. I didn't pay attention when she used to cook it, so I guessed how it was done. I boiled it too long, and I got the fishiest pot of glue in the world. Lutefisk is hard to acquire and costs more than lobster, so I tried to eat it, but to no avail. It was disgusting!

Nobody in the family likes Lutefisk except my late mom, me and my son-in-law. Lawrence, my husband, would tell me to go cook it outside because it also has a strong odor. While I was growing up, Lutefisk was our "turkey,"

the special event meal.

Lawrence proposed to me on December 23rd, 1968. He asked my mom and dad permission to marry me. To celebrate our engagement, my mom and dad invited all of Lawrence's family; parents, siblings, uncles and aunts from Thorsby, to their home.

My mom was German, my dad was Swedish and Lawrence's family were Ukrainian. There were many different traditions and food choices that our families were about to meet.

Of course, this being a very, very special occasion, Lutefisk must be served. Mom had cabbage rolls, German style, with hamburger. That was different! Sweet potatoes, swimming in butter and slightly caramelized, but what was a sweet potato? She had turkey and dressing and cranberries, phew, but the best of the best was the Lutefisk!

As this was the piece de resistance, it was presented with smile's and anticipation. Each Ukrainian future inlaw looked at one another then at the fragrant fishy item before them. Mom explained what Lutefisk was, and how you could eat it with melted butter or white sauce and a bit of allspice. Uncle Metro took some first. He had eaten Lutefisk in Norway, while stationed with the army. My future husband took a sniff and just said nope, and in our fifty years of marriage never tried it. Some of the braver ones took a teeny tiny sliver, and then ate something else. Uncle Steve said he liked all fish, and took a good helping. He then proceeded to use every type of sauce, gravy, and finally ketchup to get his fish down. He never had lutefisk again.

Meanwhile, my family enjoyed every morsel and licked our lips. I'm pretty sure first impressions were a bit tainted over this meal.

In conclusion, Merry Christmas!

I hope everyone has a wonderful holiday season, filled with good memories, lots of laughter, few tears and great food. Maybe, if you are Scandinavian, Lutefisk will be in Santa's sack, although you will be able to smell it before it gets under your tree.




