"KEYSTONE IS" CELEBRATE BLACK HISTORY MONTH FEBRUARY 23

Join the Breton Museum on February 23,2025 as we celebrate Black History Month. The Museum is delighted to have Calgary historian and filmmaker Cheryl Foggo and a Collective of Alberta artists return to Breton to present... A Prairie Place-Ancestors Collective Film: "Keystone Is".

The documentary film centers on a group of Black Alberta artists as they visit the community once known as Keystone, now Breton, founded by Black farmers in 1909-1911. The artists are in search of a connection to the land and their history. The Collective discovers the Breton Museum and the story of the founding of the community of Keystone, as well they meet some of the few remaining descendants of the original founding families. Their journey leads them to creative explorations of their experience.

In the fall of 2022 Cheryl Foggo and members of her Collective visited the Breton Museum to meet with the museum about the project. At that time, they were able to meet with Vant and Ethel Hayes, on their farm, along with daughter Christie Hayes and grandson Tristan. They were also able to visit the site of the Ellis Hooks residence along Highway 39. It was a beautiful autumn afternoon and the sunlight filtered through the golden leaves of the aspen trees which are slowly over taking over the old house. The scene was one of tranquility as the sun set that afternoon. Plans were made to return the following year to conduct additional interviews and to film their journey of discovery.

In August of 2023, the Collective returned to the Breton area to continue with their project, along with cinematographer Joel Varjassy capturing their journey on film. Over the course of three days the Collective visited several locations significant to the story of

Keystone. The first stop was at the former Charles and Mathilda King (Sr.) property. The King's home was a small white house, which stood at the NE corner of their homestead, and was known as White House Corner. Even so, there are people in the Breton community that know the location as "White House Corner". Although the original house is only a memory, they were able to visit with the current owner, and yes there is still a White House at the Corner.

They also revisited the Ellis Hooks' property, and this time were able to interview the present owners of the property, grandsons Kit and Glenn Robinson. Kit and Glenn reminisced about the memories they had as young boys visiting their grandparents and the many large family gatherings held there.

On the last day, two charter buses travelled from Edmonton and Calgary, with people interested in the project. The group toured the museum and visited several historical sites, concluding the day at the Funnell Community Centre for a catered dinner. Originally built as the Funnell School, the building was central to the Keystone community, with many of the original families instrumental in the construction of the building in 1912.

Join the Breton Museum at the Breton Faith Covenant Church on February 23, at 2 PM for a screening of the film "Keystone Is", as we celebrate Black History Month and the history of our community. Cheryl Foggo and members of her Collective will be in attendance to introduce the film and answer questions about the project.

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
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RESPONSE TO U.S. TARIFFS DELAY

Alberta News, February 3, 2025

Premier Danielle Smith issued the following statement upon the announcement of a 30-day pause on tariffs on Canadian goods:

"I am greatly heartened to see that U.S. President Donald Trump and the Government of Canada have agreed to a plan to crack down on fentanyl trafficking and other illegal activities at our shared border.

"The appointment of a Canadian fentanyl czar with authority to coordinate a massive joint effort with the United States to target fentanyl traffickers is something Alberta has been calling for since it became clear in our discussions with U.S. elected representatives and administration officials that this would be a critical part of reaching a deal to avoid tariffs.

"Diplomacy has won the day. Let us ensure that continues, as we know there is much more work ahead of us.

"I once again call on our federal government officials and my fellow premiers to de-escalate rhetoric, abandon any non-tariff measures for the time being, and turn our efforts entirely to advocacy and good-faith negotiation. There are so many win-win solutions on trade and security between our two nations. Let us turn this crisis into an opportunity to find them for the benefit of Canadians and Americans.

"To this end, I am preparing to return to Washington, D.C. next week with my fellow premiers to continue our diplomatic efforts and will again return to D.C. later in the month to attend the National Governors' Association conference."
