



ELECTRIC VEHICLE TAX BEGINS

Alberta News, February 6, 2025

Alberta's new tax on electric vehicles starts next week.

Starting Thursday, Feb. 13, Albertans will be charged a \$200 tax when they register their electric vehicles. This amount is in line with what drivers of a typical internal combustion engine vehicle would be expected to pay each year in fuel tax.

"This is a fair way for all drivers to contribute to public services, and to help keep roads and highways safe and smooth. Alberta is joining a growing number of places across North America introducing this tax so that drivers of both electric and gas vehicles are treated the same." Nate Horner, President of Treasury Board and Minister of Finance

The tax will be collected by registry agents, and online via MyAlberta eService, when the vehicles are registered and each year when the owners renew their registrations. Electric motorcycles and electric off-highway vehicles, such as ATVs, are exempt, as are hybrid vehicles.

"Owners of electric vehicles use the same roads as other Albertan drivers. It's only fair they contribute to public services including those that ensure the continued safety and upkeep of Alberta's roads. I'm pleased that Alberta registries have stepped up and made it easier for Albertans to comply by providing convenient locations to pay." Dale Nally, Minister of Service Alberta and Red Tape Reduction

These amendments were announced in Budget 2024 and passed in the Alberta Legislature last fall as part of the Financial Statutes Amendment Act. The legislative amendments also include other provisions, including rules for refunds and exemptions for the federal government, diplomats, and First Nations bands and individuals with a registered address on reserve.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We are reaching out to keep you informed on the latest updates regarding possible labour action from the Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE) Local 3484.

On Sunday, February 9th and Monday, February 10th, CUPE Local 3484 held a supervised strike vote. The union's membership has voted **in favour** of strike action.

What This Means

The union must provide the Black Gold School Division (BGSD) **72 hours' notice** if they plan to initiate job action. **We have not received notice of strike action at this time.** BGSD and CUPE Local 3484 continue to retain the February 25th date for bargaining, which does not prevent the Union from initiating strike action at any time. BGSD is committed to resolving this matter at the bargaining table.

As mentioned in our February 3rd and 5th letters, **schools will remain open** should a strike commence. BGSD anticipates that most of our students will still be able to attend classes, and continues to develop contingency plans to ensure that students have a safe and vibrant learning environment.

BGSD believes that support staff play an important role in our schools, values their tremendous contributions, and appreciates their vital role in supporting our students' education. Without them, student supports would look different, and our schools would experience additional challenges. As we move forward, BGSD will continue to strive to meet the needs of our students through ongoing contingency planning to support our schools.

However, BGSD recognizes that it may not be possible to continue all of our programming at current levels should support staff be absent. Many students in the Division who have specialized learning needs may need to have their current learning support structures revised.

You will be contacted if program changes directly affect your child, and what specific changes are being made to meet their learning needs.

School Program Impact

BGSD is planning to support extracurricular programming and some school field trips. Please be patient as supervision might need to be modified, or require changes to program offerings. BGSD will contact parents of impacted students as soon as we are aware of specifics related to the job action.

We deeply appreciate your continued patience and support. We will continue to share updates with you via SchoolMessenger and the Black Gold School Division's website, https://www.blackgold.ca, as it becomes available.

CUPE NATIONAL ATTACKS: JOINT STATEMENT

Alberta News February 11, 2025

Minister of Finance and President of Treasury Board Nate Horner and Minister of Education Demetrios Nicolaides issued the following statement on CUPE National attacks on public bargaining:

"CUPE National union with Ontario-based leadership is interfering in what should be local negotiations between school boards and CUPE locals, and in other areas using tactics of fear and intimidation to prevent deals from being signed.

"In Medicine Hat, following an agreement between the Medicine Hat Public School Division and CUPE local 829, the national leadership of CUPE effectively deregistered the local to prevent a ratification vote.

"In Sturgeon School Division, the Alberta Labour Relations Board had to issue an injunction to prevent union activists from blocking school buses.

"In Edmonton, after nurses were contracted to administer insulin and other medications to medically fragile children, CUPE pressured the nursing agency to withdraw service, forcing those students to stay home.

"This pattern of behaviour is disturbing and shows that education support workers who do not yet have a deal will not be permitted to vote on one, under fear of deregistration by union leaders in Ontario.

"At the end of the day the antics and disturbing action taken by union leaders in Ontario is causing extremely detrimental effects to learning outcomes for Alberta students.

"Alberta's government and school boards have shown up to the table to find a path forward, but CUPE National leaders clearly have ulterior motives that are not in the best interests of their members or Alberta students.

"Alberta's government calls upon CUPE to allow local bargaining to take place and stop these tactics of fear and intimidation so that kids can be back in school getting the care and education they deserve."

Premier Danielle Smith issued the following statement in response to allegations around AHS procurement and contracting processes:

"I have read various media stories containing allegations regarding the procurement and contracting processes of AHS. They are troubling allegations and they should be reviewed as quickly as possible.

"To that end, I will be writing Auditor General Doug Wylie to ask for an expedited review and his findings on this issue. I have also directed my officials to ensure that any request for information from Mr. Wylie or his office is dealt with on a fully transparent and expedited basis. We need to get to the bottom of this issue quickly to identify any potential wrongdoing, correct it, and address it appropriately.

"I have also asked that AHS's internal review be completed as quickly as possible and delivered directly to me so we can study the results and make improvements or adjustments to these processes. Until these findings are delivered. AHS has paused the contracting for the surgical facilities under review.

"As Premier, I was not involved in any wrongdoing. Any insinuation to the contrary is false, baseless and defamatory.

"It's no secret I have been unhappy with the level and quality of service delivered by AHS and in the inability of AHS to deliver quality and timely healthcare to Albertans. I will continue to relentlessly push forward to make improvements. Although that has required difficult decisions and major change, I do not accept the current results. There is a widespread and deep-seated resistance to change that we must overcome.

"That's my goal: better healthcare for all."



POWERSCHOOL CYBERSECURITY INCIDENT

Alberta News, February 12, 2025

The Commissioner notes the work her office is doing and suggests possible courses of action for those affected

The Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner (OIPC) of Alberta has received 31 breach notices to date from Alberta educational institutions about unauthorized access to personal information of students attending those educational institutions, which were using the PowerSchool platform. In some cases, the personal information of educators was also mentioned in the breach notices.

PowerSchool is a cloud-based platform used by students, educators and educational institutions around the globe. According to a notice posted on PowerSchool's website, there was an unauthorized exfiltration of personal information through one of its community-focused customer support portals.

According to one breach notice received by the OIPC, the personal information of students that was accessed included names, phone numbers, dates of birth, genders, grades, school-issued email addresses, Alberta student ID numbers, and schoolissued ID numbers. The health-related information consisted of information about allergies, medication and medical conditions, as well as personal health number, physician contact information and guardian information.

"I take the privacy rights of Albertans, and in particular children, very seriously," said Information and Privacy Commissioner Diane McLeod. "We are in the beginning stages of our review of these breach notices and will be working with the affected educational institutions to mitigate the risks to those affected by the breach. We are reviewing the breach notices as they come in to determine the total number of Albertans affected, but it is clear that it is a significant number, including many students. I am also working with my counterparts throughout Canada to address this breach."

For those Albertans who received a notice about the breach and have questions, please contact the educational institution that provided the notice to you. Information provided to the OIPC indicates that PowerSchool is offering credit monitoring and identity theft protection to individuals affected by the breach. Please contact PowerSchool for information about that offer.

Through the OIPC, the Information and Privacy Commissioner performs the responsibilities set out in Alberta's three access to information and privacy laws, the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, the Health Information Act, and the Personal Information Protection Act. The Commissioner operates independently of government.
