




Minor hiccups the first week with scheduling and parking but overall a great experience. The students have been

ADVANCING MIDWIFERY ACCESS IN ALBERTA

Alberta News February 13, 2025

Alberta's government is advancing a midwifery strategy to attract more midwives and improve access to maternal health services across Alberta.

As of January 2025, 181 midwives were practising across the province, reflecting a 26 per cent increase from 2020. Midwives play a crucial role in improving health outcomes for women, newborns and families by bringing maternal care closer to home. They build strong relationships with families, provide emotional support, help manage pregnancy risks and make referrals when needed.

Alberta's government is committed to ensuring Albertans can access high-guality maternal health care anywhere in the province. To help achieve this goal, \$10 million is being invested over three years to implement the comprehensive new Alberta Midwifery Strategy.

"Midwives play an important role in delivering primary health care to Albertans. Our goal is to continue leading the way in women's and children's health programs, and implementing initiatives through our midwifery strategy is an important part of achieving this goal." Adriana LaGrange, Minister of Health

The midwifery strategy outlines short-, medium-, and long-term goals to strengthen care and support midwifery pathways to practice. In the short term, the focus is on enhancing care for Indigenous populations through provider and community engagement. Mediumterm efforts aim to address midwifery attrition and identify the supports needed to sustain the workforce. Long term, the strategy seeks to formalize guidelines and processes to integrate midwifery practice while monitoring supply and demand.

First Nations, Métis and Inuit families have emphasized that increased access to midwifery services is critical, especially in rural and remote areas of the province. They believe that improved midwifery access will help to address physical, emotional and cultural barriers that affect health outcomes for mothers, babies and communities.

"Implementing this strategy will support midwifery practice and improve rural Albertans' access to the maternity services they need." Martin Long, parliamentary secretary for rural health

Funding will support engagement with Indigenous communities and birth workers, pilot innovative projects within Indigenous populations, assess data gaps and develop resources to provide midwifery services effectively. Additionally, it will help attract and retain

internationally educated midwives and promote the integration of midwiferv practice in team-based primary care.

"The Alberta Association of Midwives values the government's commitment to supporting midwifery in Alberta through the provincial midwifery strategy. We look forward to collaborating on initiatives to grow and sustain midwifery in our province." Marita Obst, president. Alberta Association of Midwives

Midwifery services are in high demand across Alberta, and Alberta's government recognizes the need to expand options and improve access to maternal care. This strategy will help ensure families receive the care they need, when and where they need it.

Quick facts

- Alberta's government is investing \$2 million for midwifery projects in 2024-25, followed by \$3 million in 2025-26 and \$5 million in 2026-27.
- Alberta's government worked with the Alberta Association of Midwives, the College of Midwives of Alberta, Mount Royal University, Alberta Health Services and internal stakeholders to develop the midwifery strategy.
- Midwifery is a publicly funded service in Alberta.
- Midwives are regulated by the College of Midwives of Alberta under the Health Professions Act and must complete formal education in midwifery and pass written and practical examinations before practising in Alberta.
- Midwives provide comprehensive care to individuals with low-risk pregnancies through labour and birth,

continuing to support the health and safety of mothers n d а babies until six weeks after birth.

Village of Warburg residents should plan to vote on October 20th, 2025, in Warburg's upcoming municipal election.

As a resident, this upcoming municipal election is a chance for you to exercise your right to vote and directly shape the direction of the Village of Warburg for the next four years.

Four Councillors and a Mayor will be elected to serve a four-year term on the Village of Warburg Council.

Prospective candidates: Are you interested in running for Village of Warburg Council and shaping the direction of the Village for the next 4 years? If so, you are encouraged to become a candidate!

<u>Eligibility</u> - You are qualified to become a candidate if you are:

- at least 18 years of age on nomination day
- a Canadian citizen
- a resident in the Village for the six consecutive months preceding nomination day
- your current property taxes are no more than \$50 in arrears

You are Not Eligible to become a candidate if:

- You are the auditor of the municipality
- Your current property taxes are more than \$50 in arrears
- You are in default for any other debt to the municipality in excess of \$500 for more 90 days; or
- You have been convicted of any offense under the Local Authorities Election Act or the Canada Elections Act in the previous 10 years.

Involvement - Council members have the opportunity to significantly influence the future of the Village of Warburg; this is an important and demanding job. If you are elected, you will hold office for a four-year term and will be required to attend the following:

- · regular and special council meetings
- council committee meetings
- meetings of other boards and agencies to which you are appointed as a council representative
- conferences, conventions, seminars and workshops for training and discussion
- other events promoting our municipality

Time must also be spent reading agenda material and speaking with residents, the chief administrative officer

and other relevant stakeholders in order to make informed decisions at meetings.

Full information packages are available at the Village Office

Important dates to remember:

- All candidates are required to file nomination papers prior to <u>September 15th, 2025</u>, the nomination day deadline. Candidates are encouraged to deliver his/her papers in person; however, anyone may file nomination papers on the candidates' behalf. Nomination papers must be signed by at least five voters eligible to vote in the election and who reside in the same electoral division as the candidate.
- Nomination day deadline: <u>September 15th, 2025,</u> 12:00 pm noon
- Election day: <u>October 20th, 2025</u>, from 10 am to 8 pm

Leduc County issues free fire permits to rural residents conducting open burns between March 1 and Oct. 31. Beginning March 1, 2025, rural residents will be able to apply for open burn fire permits using a new online system, located at **Icfs.burnpermits.com**.

The online system will allow users to select the type of burn permit they are applying for, including:

- fires smaller than 100 square feet (automatic approval)
- fires larger than 100 square feet (site visit required)

Prior to applying for a burn permit online, residents will have to create a user account. Instructions on how to create your account, including a how-to guide, are available at **Ieduc-county.com/burn-permits.**

DISTRACTED DRIVING

Alberta News February 14, 2025

Be safe, focus on the road because distracted driving continues to be a significant cause of preventable motor vehicle collisions on all Alberta roads.

Research shows that up to 30 per cent of all motor vehicle collisions are caused by distracted drivers. Looking at the phone, emailing, texting and other distracted behaviors while driving can result in tragic consequences that are totally preventable.

Alberta's distracted driving law restricts drivers from doing any of the following, even while stopped at red lights:

- Using hand-held cell phones, including texting or emailing.
- Using electronic devices such as laptop computers, video games, cameras, video entertainment displays and programming portable audio players such as MP3 players.
- Entering information on GPS units.
- Reading printed materials.
- Writing, printing or sketching.
- Personal grooming such as brushing and flossing teeth, putting on makeup, curling hair, clipping nails or shaving.

Quick facts

- There were 11,314 convictions for distracted driving between April 1, 2023 and March 31, 2024.
- 93 per cent of distracted driving convictions were for using a hand-held electronic device while driving.
- Distracted driving related penalties include:
 - Distracted driving \$300 fine and three demerit points
 - Careless driving fine of up to \$1,200 and six demerit points




