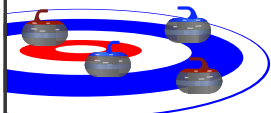

**Community Volunteer Income Tax Program – FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION** - For Low Income Persons, Families, seniors and students. Although this is something that most of us would like to avoid thinking about and doing, I am afraid that this is unavoidable. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. If you did not file a tax return in 2024 you may not be receiving benefits from the government that you are eligible for. The focus of the Community Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. This includes seniors, families, and students. If your income was approximately in one of the following categories, you may qualify for assistance.

*\*1 person - \$35,000 /\*Couple \$45,000 /\*Family - \$52,500*

We are not able to complete returns with income from the following sources: *Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding \$1, 000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons*

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information, and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between 8:30am-4pm.

Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run from March 3 – April 30, 2025.

We require the following information to complete your return:

- Personal Information (Social Insurance Number, Birth date, Marital Status, Address)
- Dependent's information – spouse/ children's names, birthdates.
- All "T" Slips (T4's, T4A, OAS etc.)
- All Forms, Schedules, and Labels you have received from Revenue Canada.
- Receipts for any expenses such as medical, moving, tuition, sporting activities. Printouts from your pharmacist are available for those with numerous prescriptions.

# MODERNIZING HUNTING AND TRAPPING LEGISLATION

Alberta News, March 12, 2025

## Proposed changes to the Wildlife Act support updated, fair and responsible stewardship of Alberta's wildlife and landscapes.

Alberta is home to the most stunning and diverse landscapes in the world, and hunting and trapping are integral to Alberta's cultural heritage. These activities provide thousands of Albertans with opportunities to put food on their table, spend time with friends and family, and in many cases, support their livelihoods in rural communities. That is why updates to the Wildlife Act need to reflect the importance of maintaining these incredible landscapes, while ensuring that these practices remain sustainable for generations to come.

Alberta's government is proposing amendments to the Wildlife Act to update regulations and modernize wildlife management practices. The proposed changes aim to improve the effectiveness of wildlife management, enhance hunting and trapping practices, support accessibility for hunters with disabilities, and streamline enforcement. They are also designed to ensure Alberta's regulations are aligned with other jurisdictions and reflect the latest technological advancements in wildlife management.

Key changes include clearer definitions, such as establishing a minimum six-month residency requirement for resident hunters and trappers. Amendments also recognize the growing role of technology in modern hunting and trapping practices by allowing the use of laser aiming devices that do not illuminate the whole target, as well as enabling the option to offer electronic tags and clarifying rules for the use of electronic licences or permits.

*"The Alberta Wildlife Federation welcomes the proposed updates to the Wildlife Act, recognizing their importance in supporting a sustainable future for Alberta's wildlife. The inclusion of digital licenses and electronic tags is just one example of the changes made that reflect the adoption of modern technology in hunting practices. Regulated hunting is an integral part of Alberta's heritage, with over 70 per cent of Albertans supporting it for both food and wildlife management purposes, reinforcing the need to maintain both the Act and Regulations in alignment with best practices."* Kelly Carter, CEO, Alberta Wildlife Federation

The amendments also focus on inclusivity and wildlife protection by ensuring that individuals with disabilities can hunt, by clarifying the definition of a vehicle for mobility-challenged hunters.

To support responsible wildlife management, the amendments also clarify rules on edible portions of harvested animals, including additional provisions supporting the harvest of black bear and mountain lion for food. They also simplify rules concerning the transportation of sick or injured wildlife.

*"SCI Northern Alberta fully supports the proposed amendments to the Wildlife Act. By embracing technological advancements and focusing on inclusivity and wildlife protection, we are ensuring Alberta remains at the forefront of wildlife stewardship, and we are confident these amendments will positively impact our communities across the province while contributing to the sustainability of our wildlife and landscapes for generations to come."* Tim McKinnon, president & CEO, Safari Club International

Additionally, the changes would protect wild sheep populations by prohibiting domestic sheep and goats in certain areas. Changes would also streamline and enhance enforcement measures by removing judicial order requirements to enable Fish and Wildlife officers to carry out their duties more efficiently.

New regulations on wildlife attractants, including the feeding of wildlife, would also help reduce conflicts between humans and wildlife, promoting safer coexistence across the province.

*"We are pleased to see the Government of Alberta taking steps to improve and modernize the Wildlife Act. It has been many years since comprehensive changes have been made, and the Ministry has worked hard over the last few years to engage with stakeholders and move this package through the necessary channels. The amendments propose common-sense updates to outdated rules, regulations, and definitions in wildlife management, while introducing new provisions that help reduce human-wildlife conflicts, improve safety, and maintain the health of wildlife populations. The updates are crafted to simplify the process for hunters, trappers, and wildlife officers, ensuring Alberta remains a global leader in wildlife management and conservation, while reducing unnecessary regulatory red tape.

These changes would ensure that Alberta's rules are aligned with modern practices, and reflect advancements made in technology and wildlife management, placing Alberta at the forefront of wildlife stewardship in Canada.

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# PREMIER DANIELLE SMITH CALLS FOR FEDERAL ELECTION

## Premier Danielle Smith issued the following statement on the swearing in of Canada's 24th Prime Minister and his new federal cabinet.

Now that Prime Minister Mark Carney has been officially sworn in, his first item of business should be to call a general election.

"I am extremely concerned that this cabinet includes most of same ministers responsible for the most damaging government policies levelled by Ottawa against Alberta in our over 100-year history. We are gravely concerned that plans to significantly increase the industrial carbon tax will be just as damaging to Alberta's economy as the consumer carbon tax has been.

"The Prime Minister also has not yet condemned harmful policies such as:

- The proposed emissions cap which continues to threaten our energy sector.
- Bill C-69 which still hampers critical infrastructure projects.
- Failed bail policies which continue to put our communities at risk, undermining the safety and security that Albertans deserve.
- Gun bans that target law-abiding hunters and sport shooters.
- Open border policies which are allowing over two million people per year to enter Canada.
- The plastics ban which puts billions of dollars of investment and thousands of jobs at risk.
- Bill C-59 which bans businesses from communicating about their environmental goals.
- The electric vehicle mandate which calls for 100 percent of new vehicles sold to be electric by 2035.
- The Sustainable Jobs Act, which aims to transition energy workers to a net zero economy as they work to shut down the energy sector.

"Our province has always been a leader in innovation, economic growth, and responsible resource development. We will continue to stand up for our industries, push back against policies that unfairly target Alberta, and fight for a fair deal within Confederation.

"The Prime Minister must put Canada first and call an election immediately to ensure that whoever is leading this country has a four year mandate from all Canadians, especially in light of the ongoing tariff conflict with the U.S."

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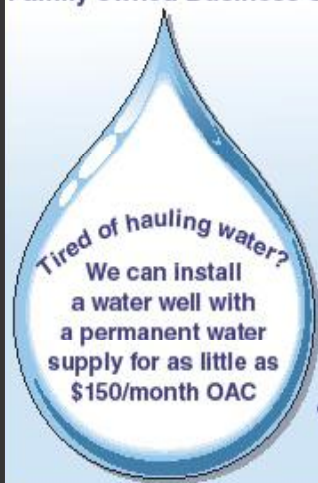

# NEW GAS RESERVES TAKE CANADA INTO GLOBAL TOP 10

Alberta News, March 12, 2025

## New Alberta reserves study finds Alberta's gas reserves have increased six-fold, moving Canada's gas reserves into the top 10 globally.

Alberta has always been a giant when it comes to natural gas, but after looking carefully at the Montney, Duvernay and the Deep Basin, new data has identified that the total gas resource in ground exceeds 1,360 trillion cubic feet (TCF). Of this, 130TCF is proved and recoverable gas reserves. For comparison, the latest U.S. government reserve number, using comparable methodologies, for Texas natural gas is 170TCF.

Adding these new gas reserves to other provinces' reserves sees Canada's overall gas number more than double and results in Canada's ranking moving from number 15 to number nine globally.

When it comes to oil reserves, Alberta remains a titan with a total resource in ground number of 1.8 trillion barrels. Oilsands proven reserves are more than 165 billion recoverable barrels and there is other growth. For example, new opportunities like the Clearwater basin which has almost two billion barrels of new reserves. For comparison, Texas' proved oil reserves sit at 20 billion barrels.

Alberta's global ranking for oil has not changed, however the increase of seven billion additional proved barrels does result in extending the province's total years of overall oil supply to 137 years.

While other jurisdictions could face inventory concerns in the future, Alberta's reserves will be essential for North America to continue accessing affordable energy."* Danielle Smith,

The study to review Alberta's natural gas and oil reserves was commissioned by the Alberta Energy Regulator and was conducted by McDaniel and Associates Consultants. McDaniel is still completing this work and a final number for all fields and growth areas will be completed in the coming weeks.

Alberta's government is working closely with industry to determine all options for egress to market in support of our aspiration to double Alberta's oil and gas production.

Faced with uncertainty around trade and security, Alberta's government remains focused on diplomacy and continuing to build a resilient and diversified economy that is better positioned to withstand external shocks and ensure long-term prosperity.

### Background

- Reserves are the most accurate measure of a jurisdiction's future oil and gas potential. McDaniel and the Alberta Energy Regulator use the Canadian Oil and Gas Evaluation Handbook methodology to perform reserve studies.
- Reserves are estimated volumes of hydrocarbon resources that analysis of geologic and engineering data demonstrates with reasonable certainty are recoverable under existing economic and operating conditions. Reserves estimates change from year to year because of:
  - price and cost changes
  - new discoveries
  - thorough appraisals of existing fields
  - existing reserves production
  - new and improved production techniques and technologies

### Quick facts

- In 2023, Alberta produced 10.9 billion cubic feet per day (bcf/d) of natural gas. This was 61 per cent of Canadian natural gas production in 2023.
- Alberta is also the largest supplier of natural gas to the U.S. In 2023, Alberta exported 4.54 bcf/d to the U.S.
- Alberta oil directly supports more than 50 U.S.-based refineries with direct investment in more than 20 U.S. states, and is essential to affordability, growth, economic prosperity and energy security in the U.S.
- The U.S. Midwest continues to be the largest market for Canadian crude oil, followed by the U.S. Gulf Coast.
- As 2025 began, U.S. imports of crude oil from Canada reached a weekly record 4.42 million barrels per day, with the majority supplied by Alberta.
