CUPE LOCAL 3484 MEMBERS VOTE

On Tuesday, March 19, the CUPE Local 3484 representatives reached a tentative agreement with the Black Gold School Division subject to ratification from their members. There were no picket lines on Wednesday, March 19 but the member vote for the CUPE Local 3484's 570 members was scheduled for Wednesday evening. If approved, members would return to work Thursday.

Tentative deals have already been reached with Edmonton Public Schools, Parkland School Division, Calgary Board of Education and Calgary Catholic School District. Deals with Fort McMurray Catholic Schools and Fort McMurray Public Schools have been ratified. Foothills School Division remains the only striking local without a settlement - they bargained on Wednesday.

No other updates have been given since time of printing, more information will be printed next week.



STAY INFORMED ABOUT MEASLES IN ALBERTA

Alberta News, March 14, 2025

Alberta's government is asking Albertans to be aware of measles symptoms and to access resources to protect themselves and prevent further spread.

Measles cases are increasing globally, with numerous countries and travel destinations reporting outbreaks. Cases have been identified in several Canadian provinces, including an outbreak recently identified in northern Alberta.

As of March 13, health officials have confirmed six cases of measles in the province, and although these cases are all part of a single household, this does raise concerns about the potential for further spread of this highly contagious disease.

Measles is an extremely contagious disease and spreads easily through the air. People born in or since 1970 who have received fewer than two doses of measles-containing vaccine are susceptible to infection. Those who have received fewer than two doses of measles-containing vaccine and are pregnant, under one year of age, are adults and/or have a weakened immune system are at most risk of complications from measles.

"Measles is not just a mild childhood illness — it is a serious, highly infectious disease that can have devastating consequences. Thankfully, we have a highly effective vaccine with a long-proven track record of safety. Everyone should take the time to check their immunization record to ensure they are fully immunized. No one should have to endure the consequences of a disease we can prevent." Dr. Mark Joffe, chief medical officer of health

The measles vaccine is highly effective at preventing infection and complications. In Alberta, measles vaccine is offered free of charge to eligible Albertans through Alberta's publicly funded immunization program.

If symptoms of measles do develop, individuals are advised to stay home and call Health Link at 811 before visiting any health care facility or provider, including a family physician clinic or pharmacy.

Symptoms of measles include:

- fever of 38.3° C or higher
- · cough, runny nose and/or red eyes
- a red, blotchy rash that appears three to seven days after fever starts, typically beginning behind the ears and on the face and spreading down the body and then to the arms and legs

Albertans uncertain of their immunization history, or their child's immunization history, can text "vaccine record" to 88111, call Health Link at 811 or their local public health office. Albertans can also text "measles" to 88111 to get measles health information texted to their mobile device. Please contact your primary care provider for advice on what immunizations are best for you.

Quick Facts

- · Measles can be dangerous because:
 - One in 10 people with measles will get middle ear or lung infections.
 - One in 1,000 people with measles will get encephalitis (swelling of the brain), which can lead to seizures, deafness or brain damage.
 - One to three of every 1,000 people with measles will die.
- More than 90 per cent of people who are not immune to measles and who come into contact with the virus will become infected.
- Children in Alberta typically receive their first dose of measles-containing vaccine at 12 months of age, and their second dose at 18 months of age. Children who received two doses of vaccine are considered protected.
- Adults born in 1970 or later should have a documented history of two lifetime doses of measles-containing vaccine spaced at least four weeks apart if they do not have a history of labconfirmed disease or serological evidence of measles immunity.
- Adults born before 1970 are generally considered immune to measles, as measles circulated widely before 1970. One or two doses of the vaccine may be recommended if you are a health care worker, student at a post-secondary educational institution or are travelling outside of Canada.



Girls in STEM Day Inspires Students at Black Gold Schools

Nisku, Alberta (March 14, 2025) – The Black Gold School Division (BGSD) brought together about 140 girls and gender-diverse students from Grades 8–12 for its biennial Girls in STEM Day on March 10, 2025. The event, held this year at Ohpaho Secondary School, aimed to promote gender diversity in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) by exposing girls and gender-diverse students to the wide range of career opportunities in these fields.

"Today was our fifth Girls in STEM," said Tarynne Cable, Girls in STEM Day organizer and Assistant Principal at École Leduc Estates School. "The focus of the day was to expose these girls to all the different opportunities that are out there that they might not have known were even an opportunity for them."

The keynote presenter for this year's event was Jillian Kowalchuk, an AI researcher at the Alberta Machine Intelligence Institute (Amii). Kowalchuk is a strong advocate for increasing diversity in STEM fields and shared insights on how artificial intelligence is shaping the future. Students had the opportunity to engage with her when she hosted an AI challenge, where teams identified a real-world problem and had to create a hypothetical strategic plansthat using AI to help companies solve these problems.

Kowalchuk highlighted the ongoing need for more diversity in STEM fields. "It's so important to have events like this because we know that there aren't enough diverse voices in STEM still, even to this day," she said. "I shared a statistic with the girls and gender-diverse students that only 22% of the AI talent pool globally is comprised of women."

Students also participated in interactive, hands-on sessions designed to spark their interest in STEM fields, including creating solar-powered lanterns, building hydrogen fuel cell mini-cars, and other problem-solving exercises that highlighted real-world applications of

STEM knowledge.

The middle portion of the event featured a lunch and learn session. Here, the participants engaged in more hands-on activities with STEM leaders from different industries, including engineers from the University of Alberta, Innotech, ConocoPhilips, and others. Students had the opportunity to control robotic arms, fly drones, and analyze soil samples.

These sessions were led by industry professionals, postsecondary educators, and community partners, all committed to encouraging more young women to explore careers in STEM. The sponsors who made this year's event possible were Enbridge; the Rotary Club of Nisku and Leduc; The Lions Club of Leduc; the American Welding Society; Women in Scholarship, Engineering, Inside Education, Science & Technology (WISEST); and ConocoPhilips.

In addition to the keynote and hands-on activities, students had the chance to speak directly with women working in STEM industries, including engineers, scientists, and technology experts. These role models shared their personal career journeys, challenges they have faced, and the rewards of working in STEM.

"It has been great to see all the people who also like STEM," said Sahra, a Grade 11 student from École Secondaire Beaumont Composite High School. "I like that I got to see everybody's ideas and how they found a problem and created a solution during the first session."

Girls in STEM Day has continued to grow in both scope and impact over the years. By providing students with direct access to industry professionals and engaging STEM experiences, the event aims to challenge stereotypes and inspire young women to see themselves as future leaders in science and technology.

"We want to encourage you to continue to think about what you want [and] your opportunities," s a i d B G S D Superintendent Michael Borgfjord, speaking to attendees. "Nobody can stop any of you from doing what you want. We're very proud to have this [event] for all of you."
